Good Morning: Due to technical difficulties with cell phone capturing videos, Microsoft Windows 11 viewing photos and videos with most recent upgrade, I will not be submitting any additional information for discovery, at this time.

However, I do have to mention on two occasions, most recently, December 18, 2025 shortly before 6:03 pm (911 call), Mr. Egan's dog has been acting erratically, barking at what I suspect is the dog attacking the tarp causing violent shaking of my wooden fence.

This day, I came out of my house to check on my cats, one running terrified inside, the other was missing. What I thought may have been someone between my shed and Mr. Egan's garage easement partitioned off to keep the dog from gaining near my garden located toward the alley, which I frequent constantly, there was violent shaking as if someone or something was trapped. It was late, dark, and concerned for my missing cat and the thrashing of something in the area, I was going to attempt to go toward the area, while Mr. Egan stood on his deck watching at his dog barking. He went back inside. I was not recording, I had my hand on the 911 button in case there was an intruder, police chases have caused criminals to run and hide in my yard in the past. When I came closer to the fence near the shed, the noise was heading toward me or closer to the house, I screamed in terror and ran into the house to call 911. Mr. Egan emerged from his house a second time when I screamed. The missing cat was terrorized, and was at the door and safe. The police came and could not find anything and there was no police chase incident in the area, nothing was out of place on my property.

The tarp pooling on the ground may have rats using as a shield to hide. There were burrowing from his property under the tarp and could not get through to my yard, but the holes and dirt were evident. I suspect and hope this is the reason for the dog acting erratically (my cats or the rats) with so much thrashing along the fence. I suggest that adjustments be made to not allow the tarp to pool on the ground. If the dog is escalating into anger being kept in the house then acting out on my cats (and/or rats), this is something that Mr. Egan will need to monitor and address.
