In support of this filing, Petitioner states the following:

1. Goodall filed the Petition with the Illinois Pollution Control Board on December 31, 2025.
2. Pursuant to the Petition, Goodall seeks an adjusted standard pursuant to the boundary and setback requirements found under 35 Ill. Adm. Code §§ 848.202(a)(1)(B), 848.202(a)(1)(C), and 848.202(c)(2). Additionally, Goodall is seeking an exemption from the Daily Tire Record and Annual Tire Summary Regulations found under 35 Ill. Adm. Code §§ 848.303 and 848.304.
3. On January 11, 2026, Goodall published a notice of the filing of the Petition by legal notice in the Belleville News-Democrat, which is a newspaper of general circulation in the area in and around Belleville, Illinois.
4. As required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code § 104.408(a), Goodall published the notice of the Petition within 14 days after it filed the Petition.

5. The notice includes the specific language required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code § 104.408(b).

6. As required by 35 Ill. Adm. Code § 104.410, a certificate of publication issued by the publisher certifying publication of the notice on January 11, 2026, is attached as Exhibit A. ("Goodall"), 905 West Blvd., Belleville, Illinois 62221, of a Petition for an Adjusted Standard with the Illinois Pollution Control Board pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.402 on December 22, 2025. Goodall's petition, which has been assigned the docket number AS 2026-003 requests an adjusted standard from certain Sections of 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 848 for its used tire facility located at 905 West Blvd., Belleville, St. Clair County, Illinois 62221 ("Goodall Facility"). Because the Goodall Facility deals in used tires, it must adhere to the regulations governing used tire management standards found in 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 848. In its petition, Goodall seeks an adjusted standard pursuant to the boundary and setback requirements found under 35 Ill. Adm. Code §§ 848.202(a)(1)(B), 848.202(a)(1)(C), and 848.202(c)(2). Additionally, Goodall is seeking an exemption from the Daily Tire Record and Annual Tire Summary Regulations found under

35 Ill. Adm. Code §§ 848.303 and 848.304. At its Goodall Facility, Goodall deals in used Off-the-Road (OTR) tires and rims. The proposed adjusted standard would reflect and be based on the inherent physical differences between OTR tires and passenger tires, with requirements consistent with OTR tire characteristics. Goodall currently employs six (6) full-time employees and three (3) part-time employees. The Goodall Facility supplies quality OTR heavy equipment wheels, tires, and rims for many types of equipment such as scrapers, loaders, graders, trucks, tractors, and backhoes, along with mining, construction, and agricultural equipment. Any person may cause a public hearing to be held in the above-described adjusted standard proceeding by filing a hearing request with the Illinois Pollution Control Board within 21 days after the date of the publication of this notice. The hearing request should indicate the docket number for the adjusted standard proceeding, as found in this notice. Harbaugh's firing casts a light on his chief rival - Tomlin

Amazing what one kick can do, isn't it?

John Harbaugh would still be coaching the Baltimore Ravens if Tyler Loop had made that 44-yard field-goal attempt Sunday.

Instead, Loop's miss kicked Harbaugh clear out of Baltimore - although it seems obvious that anything short of a lengthy playoff run would have ended Harbaugh's 18-year run.

The Ravens clearly feel like they have plateaued under Harbaugh, which is interesting when compared to the Steelers and Mike Tomlin because Harbaugh has actually won playoff games lately.

In fact, Harbaugh has won a playoff game in each of the past two seasons - advancing to the AFC championship game in 2023 - and three of the past five. Tomlin hasn't come close to winning one since the 2016 season. Harbaugh also has won two of the past three AFC North titles and four of the past eight.

It wasn't enough. The Ravens have chosen risk over stability. They want something better for themselves. Owner Steve Bisciotti felt like more was required with a two-time MVP at quarterback. He believes Harbaugh had simply run his course in Baltimore. And I don't think he's wrong. Eighteen years is an eternity.

The Philadelphia Eagles moved on from Andy Reid after 14 years. The Seattle Seahawks moved on from Pete Carroll after 14 years. The Green Bay Packers broke up with Mike McCarthy after nearly 13 years. The New England Patriots parted ways with Bill Belichick after 24 years. In all cases, both

parties survived. Many thrived (not Belichick).

NFL Network's Kyle Brandt perfectly summed up the Harbaugh situation, comparing it to an amicable divorce.

"Sometimes it's just time to go," Brandt said. "That person is a wonderful person and they'll go on to be a great [person] for someone else. That doesn't mean they're right for you anymore."

All of which raises an obvious question regarding Tomlin: If the Ravens plateaued in never making it back to a Super Bowl after all these years, have the Steelers plateaued in never winning playoff games anymore?

That will become a non-issue if they dispatch the Houston Texans on Monday night. Maybe the Steelers are the smart ones here. But another loss will make for seven straight playoff losses under Tomlin, extend his playoff drought to a whopping nine years and drop his career playoff record to 8-12.

That seems like a pattern. But we all know that unless Tomlin makes the call, he isn't going anywhere no matter the result Monday - and the same would have been true if Loop's kick had split the uprights.

Harbaugh's departure - here's betting he winds up with the New York Giants - leaves Tomlin as the NFL's longest-tenured coach. And maybe, just maybe, he has recaptured his mojo. It feels like the Steelers have something brewing and could make a run.

But what if they don't? What if their season ends at 10-8 for the third straight year with another playoff thud? That would make their past five years look like this:

- 10-8
- 10-8
- 10-8

- 9-8

- 9-7-1

Is that good enough?

That's an honest question, and maybe for the New York Jets it would be. It shouldn't be here. Harbaugh went 33-18 over the past three years with two playoff wins, but it felt like the Ravens underachieved. Having said that, Harbaugh deserves a tip of the cap on his way out. What a great rivalry it has been over the 40 games between him and Tomlin.

Tomlin has mostly owned it lately, even if the Ravens have had better seasons. The only two coaches who faced each other more often than these two were Curly Lambeau and George Halas.

Like Tomlin, Harbaugh is one of the good guys. I remember interviewing him at Ravens training camp in 2008, shortly after he was hired, and asking about his one-year tenure as a graduate assistant coach at Pitt in 1987 under Mike Gottfried.

Besides coaching the tight ends with the help of Pro Football Hall of Famer Sid Gillman, Harbaugh was asked to deliver Pitt's media guide to every high school in Western Pennsylvania.

"I had a Datsun 210, I think it was, persimmon orange, all rusted out, about 15 years old with a clutch, going up and down those hills in Western Pa. in my coat and tie," Harbaugh recalled. "You just can't find your way around. I mean, I can see it - I can see the school right there on that hill, and I have no idea how to get to it."

Nearly 40 years later, Harbaugh has fashioned a Hall of Fame career of his own - and it will have to continue elsewhere.

His time in Baltimore has run its course, and that's OK.

tender, Hall was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1975 and the St. Louis Blues Hall of Fame in 2023. As a goaltending consultant for the Calgary Flames, Hall won the Cup again in 1988-89.

Hall's No. 1 is retired by the Blackhawks. The team and chairman-CEO Danny Wirtz called Hall one of the most influential goaltenders in the history of hockey and a franchise cornerstone.

"On behalf of the Wirtz family and the entire Chicago Blackhawks organization, we extend our deepest condolences to Glenn's family, friends, and the countless teammates and supporters who loved him," Wirtz's statement said. "We are grateful for his extraordinary contributions to hockey and to our club, and we will honor his memory today and always."

crease, Hall excelled. He won the Calder Trophy with the Red Wings, earned every win for the Blackhawks in their run to the 1961 Stanley Cup, and captured a Conn Smythe Trophy despite losing in the final with the St. Louis Blues."

The NHL mourns the passing of Glenn Hall, the very definition of what all hockey goaltenders aspire to be. Aptly nicknamed "Mr. Goalie," Glenn was sturdy, dependable, and a spectacular talent in net. Hall also won the Vezi-na Trophy three times,

first all-star team honors seven times and second all-star team honors four times. The NHL named Hall as one of its 100 greatest players in 2017, and The Hockey News had Hall ranked 16th among the top 50 NHL players of all-time in 1997.

While Hall won the Cup with Chicago in 1961, he also won it with the Red Wings in 1952 despite not playing a game. The Humboldt, Sask., native was called up during the 1952 playoffs, and his name was engraved on the Stanley Cup as "Glin Hall."

The NHL credited Hall as the "pioneering grandfather of the butterfly style of goaltending," dropping to his knees to stop low shots instead of standing up.
