ORDER OF THE BOARD (by J.A. Van Wie):

On December 31, 2025, C.J. Goodall Tire Co., Inc. (Goodall) filed a petition (Pet.) pursuant to Section 28.1 of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) and Part 104 Subpart D of the Board’s procedural rules. *See* 415 ILCS 5/28.1 (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104 Subpart D. Goodall petitions the Board for an adjusted standard from Part 848 Standards for the Management of Used and Waste Tires. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 848. Specifically, Goodall seeks an adjusted standard from the storage requirements for used and waste tires at its Belleville, St. Clair County facility where it stores and sells used off-the-road heavy equipment tires and rims.

Section 28.1 of the Act and Section 104.408 of the Board’s procedural rules require publication of notice of an adjusted standard proceeding in a newspaper of general circulation in the area affected by the petitioner’s activity. 415 ILCS 5/28.1(d)(1) (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.408(a). Notice must be published within 14 days of filing a petition for an adjusted standard with the Board. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.408(a). As required by Section 104.410, Goodall timely filed a certificate of publication of notice of the petition on January 30, 2026 (Pub.). *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.410. Notice of filing was published on January 11, 2026, in the *Belleville News-Democrat*.

The Board finds that the notice and petition meet the requirements of Section 28.1 of the Act and Section 104.408 of the Board’s procedural rules and accepts the petition for adjusted standard. *See* 415 ILCS 5/28.1 (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.408. The Board notes that Goodall expressly requests an adjusted standard from Section 848.202(a)(1)(B), (a)(1)(C), and (c)(2). Pet. at 7. However, within that request, Goodall lists additional Sections 848.303 and 848.304. *Id.* at 8. Subsequently in the petition, Goodall describes in detail the reasons why complying with Sections 848.303 and 304 would be challenging to its operations. *Id.* at 16-19. Goodall also lists Sections 848.303 and 304 in its notice publication. Pub. at 5-6. While Goodall characterizes its request for an adjusted standard from Sections 848.303 and 304 as an “exemption” in its notice publication, for purposes of the petition before the Board, the Board interprets all of Goodall’s requests referenced in the petition and notice publication, including Sections 848.303 and 304, as requests for an adjusted standard. Therefore, the Board accepts Goodall’s petition for an adjusted standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 848.202(a)(1)(B), 848.202(a)(1)(C), 848.202(c)(2), 848.303, and 848.304.

Section 104.416(a) of the Board’s rules require that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) file a response including its recommendation concerning the Board’s proposed action on this petition within 45 days after the service of the petition. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code

104.416(a). In this case, IEPA has not yet filed a response. The Board directs IEPA to file its recommendation by Monday, February 16, 2026, the first business day after the 45-day deadline. *See id.* Goodall may respond to IEPA's recommendation within 14 days after the date of service of the recommendation. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.416(d).

Goodall states that it "does not request a hearing on this petition." Pet. at 19; *see* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.406(j), 104.422(a)(1). However, the Board is required to hold a hearing when any person timely requests a hearing. *See* 415 ILCS 5/28.1(d)(2) (2024). Because Goodall published notice of filing on January 11, 2026, any request for a hearing must have been made by Monday, February 2, 2026. *See id.* However, "if the Board in its discretion determines that a hearing would be advisable," the Board will provide timely notice of the hearing. 415 ILCS 5/28.1(d)(2) (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 104.422(a)(3), 104.424.

This order makes no determination on the informational sufficiency or the merits of Goodall's petition. The Board through its own orders or its hearing officer's orders may direct Goodall to provide additional information.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
