**COMPLAINANT'S MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE A FOCUSED
SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDUM IN RESPONSE TO RESPONDENT'S
JUNE 1, 2026 ANSWER**

Complainant Vitautas Matulyauskas, *pro se*, respectfully moves the Board for leave to file the brief Supplemental Memorandum attached hereto. In support, Complainant states:

1. Respondent filed its Answer and Affirmative Defenses on June 1, 2026. The Answer presents the first opportunity for the Board to review Respondent's substantive position on the merits of the Complaint after the Board's April 2, 2026 Order narrowing the legal questions for decision.
2. The attached Supplemental Memorandum is narrowly focused. It is limited to (a) the central documentary admission that resolves the unreasonableness inquiry, (b) the deemed admissions on the face of the Answer that resolve the Section 25 exemption inquiry, and (c) a concise procedural note on the Tort Immunity Act defenses.
3. Granting leave promotes the orderly framing of issues for the June 25, 2026 status conference and conserves the Board's time. The memorandum is short, exhibits-grounded, and directed solely at the post-Answer record.
4. The Board has granted Complainant prior leave to file supplemental materials in this docket without objection. The attached memorandum is shorter than any prior supplemental filing and is tied directly to the June 1, 2026 Answer.

WHEREFORE, Complainant respectfully requests that the Board grant leave to file the attached Supplemental Memorandum and accept it as part of the record in this proceeding.

COMPLAINANT'S SUPPLEMENTAL MEMORANDUM ON THE JUNE 1, 2026 ANSWER

I. INTRODUCTION

This short memorandum addresses three points raised by Respondent's June 1, 2026 Answer. Each point is narrowly framed and grounded in the documentary record now before the Board.

First, the unreasonableness element of Section 24 and Section 900.102 is resolved on the face of the existing record by Director Garvy's January 4, 2023 written admission to his governing board that the noise's "impact on the park's neighbors is unreasonable."

Second, the Section 25 exemption defense fails on the pleadings because Respondent's Answer admits the operative facts that defeat it — facts that, under the Board's April 2, 2026 Order, the Section 25 inquiry now turns upon.

Third, the three Affirmative Defenses asserted under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act do not apply to a Section 24 regulatory enforcement proceeding before this Board. Complainant addresses this concisely here and reserves the right to file a separate motion to strike if the Board prefers that procedural vehicle.

II. THE UNREASONABLENESS ELEMENT IS ADMITTED ON THE FACE OF THE RECORD

5. Section 24 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act prohibits noise emissions that "unreasonably interfere" with the lives or activities of others. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102 prohibits the emission of "unreasonable noise." Both turn on a single statutory adjective: *unreasonable*.
6. On January 4, 2023 — more than twenty months before this proceeding was filed — the Lisle Park District Director of Parks and Recreation delivered to the Board of Park Commissioners a Memorandum captioned "ABBEYWOOD PARK PICKLEBALL COURTS — STAFF UPDATES TO THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS." Within that Memorandum, the Director wrote:

"Staff has come to the realization that the use the pickleball courts at Abbeywood Park are receiving exceeds what we anticipated and the resulting impact on the park's neighbors is unreasonable."

(Exhibit A.) Exhibit A was produced by the Lisle Park District itself in response to a Freedom of Information Act request, transmitted on April 24, 2025 under a cover letter signed by Director Dan Garvy in his capacity as FOIA Officer (Exhibit A-1). The embedded PDF metadata of Exhibit A confirms creation on January 4, 2023 on the Park District's own Microsoft 365 environment by a Park District staff account. Authenticity is uncontested.

7. This is not advocacy by Complainant. It is the Director of Parks and Recreation of the Respondent agency, writing as the head of the agency, to his governing board, describing the very pickleball noise that is the subject of this proceeding, using the exact statutory term that Section 24 and Section 900.102 supply as the operative legal standard.
8. The Park District's own institutional finding satisfies the unreasonableness element of the Complaint on the existing record. The Board need not credit Complainant's characterization of the noise. The Board need only credit the Director's own contemporaneous characterization. They are the same.

8-A. The January 4, 2023 admission is reinforced by the Park District's formally adopted *2023 Strategic Master Plan: Final Report* (Exhibit B) — authored by Director Garvy and adopted by the Lisle Park District Board of Park Commissioners on April 20, 2023. At page 167, in the Park's official evaluation, the Strategic Master Plan formally lists as a Park-level "CHALLENGE": "Addressing the two pickleball courts and the associated impacts they are having on adjacent neighbors." This is the Park District's own Board-adopted institutional finding — issued in a public planning document — that the Abbeywood pickleball impacts on adjacent neighbors are a District-recognized issue requiring resolution.

8-B. The institutional admission is further independently confirmed by the *FRS-1 Data Analysis Report* of acoustical consultant Robert M. Unetich, P.E. (PSM LLC), dated September 30, 2025 (Exhibit E-1). Mr. Unetich's professional measurements, taken at a location approximately 55 feet from the Abbeywood Park pickleball court fence between Complainant's home and the adjacent residence, document pickleball noise levels of 55.6 to 64.2 dBA (LAeq, 30-second average) during active play — exceeding the ANSI recommended residential standard of 55 dBA — against an ambient background level of 41-49 dBA. The Unetich report concludes that, based on his firm's analysis of over 200 pickleball locations in the United States, "the only reasonable solution in this instance is to close these courts." Significantly, Mr. Unetich's measurements were taken in August-September 2025 — **after** every operational change the Park District claims in its Answer (paragraph 5) to have implemented to mitigate the noise. The post-remediation acoustical measurements thus independently confirm that, regardless of the Park District's actions, the pickleball emissions at Abbeywood Park remain at unreasonable levels.

8-C. At the July 17, 2025 Park Board meeting (Exhibit M), after hearing public comments describing the noise as a health issue that disrupts sleep, **all of the commissioners agreed that further steps would not be considered** beyond non-enforceable recommendation signage. Director Garvy was present. The Park District thereby formally acknowledged the ongoing harm and formally declined further mitigation. That posture — known unreasonable harm coupled with formal refusal to mitigate — is the predicate for both the Section 24 violation and the regulatory relief Complainant seeks before this Board.

8-D. Respondent's Answer to Paragraph 9 of the Complaint "affirmatively states" that Respondent "has implemented several changes to the public pickleball play at Abbeywood Park ... many of which were in direct response to suggestions made by Complainant." The Park District's own contemporaneous records define what those "changes" actually

consisted of: (i) non-binding **recommendation** signage encouraging the use of “quiet” equipment, (ii) relocation of organized Park District programming (lessons and clinics) to Arbor View Park and Community Park, and (iii) the eventual opening of additional pickleball courts at Tate Woods Park. The Park District did not adopt — and at its July 17, 2025 meeting expressly declined to adopt — any binding requirement governing the type of equipment permitted at Abbeywood Park, the hours of play, the volume of play, or the continued public use of the courts. Commissioner Wessel’s own statement at that meeting captures the operative principle: “we cannot make a rule that we do not intend to enforce” (Exhibit M). The Park District’s documented operational changes thus consisted of non-mandatory recommendations and the relocation of certain organized activities — unaccompanied by enforceable regulation of the noise source itself. The Unetich measurements of August-September 2025 (Exhibit E-1), taken after all such measures, document that the pickleball noise emissions at Abbeywood Park nonetheless remained at levels exceeding ANSI residential standards. The “implemented changes” Respondent invokes therefore neither achieved nor were structured to achieve compliance with Section 24 of the Act or 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102 at the noise source.

9. The Park District’s Answer attempts to deny the unreasonableness allegation on the basis of “lack of sufficient knowledge” — supported by an “Affidavit of Insufficient Knowledge” sworn by the same Director who authored the January 2023 institutional memorandum. That contradiction is addressed in Complainant’s contemporaneous Motion to Strike the Affidavit of Insufficient Knowledge. The point relevant here is more fundamental: even setting the affidavit aside, the Director’s prior institutional acknowledgment is in the record. It cannot be retracted by a subsequent pleading.

III. THE SECTION 25 EXEMPTION FAILS ON THE PLEADINGS

10. The Board’s Order of April 2, 2026 reserved for decision on a developed record whether Respondent can establish the Section 25 “organized amateur or professional sporting activity” exemption. The Order made clear that the exemption requires a showing of *scheduled, discrete, and structured* sporting activity — not merely open-court availability.
11. After the April 2 Order, the legal sufficiency of the Section 25 defense depends on whether Respondent can plead and prove that the noise emissions at Abbeywood Park arise from scheduled, discrete, and structured sporting activity organized by the Park District. Respondent’s June 1, 2026 Answer fails this test on its face.
12. Respondent’s Answer **does not plead Section 25 as an affirmative defense at all**. Despite the Board’s specific invitation in the April 2 Order to develop the Section 25 record, Respondent omitted Section 25 from its Affirmative Defenses. The three Affirmative Defenses pleaded are grounded exclusively in the Tort Immunity Act, not Section 25. Under standard Illinois pleading practice, an affirmative defense not pleaded is waived.
13. Even setting waiver aside, the Park District has effectively admitted away its ability to establish Section 25 in two further ways:

- a. **Paragraph 5 of the Answer** addresses the absence of scheduled play. The Park District's response — to deny for “lack of sufficient knowledge” supported by the Garvy affidavit — is itself the institutional Director admitting that he cannot identify any scheduled play. The matter is squarely his to know. His inability to know is, functionally, his admission of the absence of scheduled play.
- b. **Exhibits I-1 and I-2** (the Park District's own FOIA responses, signed by Director Garvy as FOIA Officer) certify that **no records exist** of any scheduled pickleball events, leagues, tournaments, or instructional programs at Abbeywood Park for the period beginning on or about July 26, 2024 — the date on or after which the Park District itself elected to relocate all organized programming away from Abbeywood Park to other Park District facilities. Director Garvy confirmed that programming cessation in his own June 21, 2024 personal email to Complainant: “after July we will no longer be programming any activities at Abbeywood Park” (Exhibit N). The FOIA “no records exist” certifications are thus the Park District's own institutional admissions, contemporaneous with — and covering the entirety of — the period of ongoing violation at issue.
14. The factual predicate of any Section 25 defense is the existence of scheduled, discrete, and structured sporting activity. Respondent's own FOIA findings deny that predicate for the period of ongoing violation at issue — from on or about July 26, 2024 through the present — during which Respondent itself elected to operate the Abbeywood pickleball courts exclusively as an open public recreational facility, with no organized programming. The Section 25 exemption defense cannot be sustained on this record for the period at issue.
15. **Exhibit L** (the Park District's Facility Reservations Database, produced under FOIA) further confirms that no scheduled or reserved pickleball events have been entered for Abbeywood Park from on or about August 2024 forward — i.e., for the period following the Park District's relocation of organized programming. The Park District's affirmative scheduling records show what its FOIA responses certified: for the period of ongoing violation, nothing is scheduled at Abbeywood Park.
16. Under the framework of the April 2, 2026 Order (Exhibit Q), this record is dispositive against Section 25 on the pleadings. The Board may so find at the June 25, 2026 status conference and direct the parties' subsequent submissions accordingly.

IV. THE TORT IMMUNITY ACT DOES NOT APPLY TO THIS REGULATORY PROCEEDING

17. Respondent's three Affirmative Defenses are all grounded in the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, 745 ILCS 10/. That statute, by its terms, limits the *tort* liability of local public entities and their employees. Each provision of the Act invoked by Respondent uses the word “injury” — a term of art of tort law. The Act applies to civil tort actions in civil courts seeking damages for injury.
18. This is not a tort action. The Complaint pleads regulatory violations of Section 24 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102. The Board is a

regulatory agency administering its enabling statute. The relief sought is regulatory (cease-and-desist, operational restrictions, signage, compliance measures) and a civil penalty under Section 42(h) payable to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund — not tort damages payable to Complainant.

19. The Tort Immunity Act does not, and cannot, provide a local public entity with immunity from compliance with state environmental statutes administered by state regulatory agencies. If it did, every Illinois park district, school district, and unit of local government could exempt itself from compliance with state environmental, building, fire safety, and public health regulations by pleading “discretionary policy” immunity. That is not Illinois law.
20. Complainant notes for the Board’s convenience the disposition of each pleaded defense: Section 2-201 (discretionary policy) and Section 2-109 (derivative entity immunity) are tort immunities and do not reach regulatory compliance obligations under Section 24. Section 2-202 (execution or enforcement of law) is a tort immunity that on its face requires a tort “injury” — not present here. The provisions invoked in Affirmative Defense 3 (Sections 2-103, 2-201, 2-204, 2-205, 2-207, and 3-103) are likewise tort immunities; none reaches a regulatory compliance obligation under Section 24.
21. Complainant respectfully suggests that the Board treat the Tort Immunity Act defenses as inapplicable on the pleadings, and direct the parties’ subsequent submissions accordingly. Complainant reserves the right to move separately to strike those defenses should the Board prefer that procedural vehicle.

V. RELIEF REQUESTED

22. WHEREFORE, Complainant respectfully requests that the Board:
 - a. Accept this Supplemental Memorandum into the record;
 - b. Recognize for purposes of the June 25, 2026 status conference and for purposes of further proceedings that Director Garvy’s January 4, 2023 written acknowledgment of unreasonable impact is in the record;
 - c. Recognize that Respondent has not pleaded Section 25 as an affirmative defense in the Answer and that the Park District’s own FOIA admissions and Facility Reservations Database are in the record on the Section 25 question;
 - d. Recognize that the Tort Immunity Act defenses do not apply to this regulatory enforcement proceeding under Section 24 of the Act and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102; and
 - e. Grant such further relief as the Board deems just and appropriate.

ABBEYWOOD PARK PICKLEBALL COURTS
STAFF UPDATES TO THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS

December 21, 2022:

Abbeywood Park Pickleball Courts: As the board is aware, the pickleball courts that were installed at Abbeywood Park and opened for public use in May 2022 quickly became wildly popular. Staff had scheduled clinics on-site to meet the growing demand for pickleball programming, all of which were filled to capacity. For drop-in play, beginners, advanced players, and all abilities in between have literally flocked to these courts. And like Lisle Park District residents frequently visited neighboring communities' pickleball courts before these courts were constructed, residents from other communities are frequent users of these courts at Abbeywood Park. By *most* accounts, these new pickleball courts have been met with open arms and rave reviews.

However, this near-constant use was not expected and has resulted in impacts on the park's neighbors that staff did not anticipate. Specifically, we have heard from three of the neighbors of Abbeywood Park, some of whom live within 75 to 95 feet of the courts, that the sounds emanating from the courts throughout the daylight hours have surpassed those of being an annoyance and have become a nuisance and health threat. In addition to the sounds made as pickleball paddles strike the pickleballs, the number of people, vehicles, and resulting constant activity has changed the overall character of the park considerably. What was once a quiet neighborhood park has become a hub of activity. Staff met with three neighbors of the park in December, and this was all reaffirmed as we discussed possible solutions.

There were two tennis courts at Abbeywood Park before the 2021-22 renovations that converted one of the tennis courts into two dedicated pickleball courts. And while the tennis courts there experienced regular use, the sound made by a tennis racket striking a tennis ball is quite subdued compared to the sound made when a pickleball paddle strikes a pickleball. Many studies report pickleball sound is 20 – 25 decibels louder than tennis, and an increase of 10 decibels is perceived to be roughly twice as loud. Further, pickleball creates a much higher *pitched* sound to which the human ear is quite sensitive. As an example, a high-pitched beeping sound is more annoying than a low rumble sound, even if those two sounds are at the same decibel level. In fact, many reports state the high frequency sound made when a pickleball paddle strikes a pickleball has been repeatedly alleged to cause anxiety, hypertension, and emotional distress over prolonged exposure. Through staff's research, direct observation of the park's activity, and interaction with the park's neighbors, we have become sensitive to the concerns raised and recognize something needs to be done.

In considering the installation of a sound barrier, *AcoustiFence* has been a popular choice of other pickleball court owners and operators. Specifically, Western Springs Park District has installed AcousticFence at some of their courts and through direct observation, personal conversations with their staff, and an exchange with one of their courts' neighbors, it works in reducing the noise to a more tolerable level. However, we are not confident that application will solve our problem at the Abbeywood Park courts. If one can see the source of the sound, and in our case if one can see the pickleball paddle striking the pickleball, they will also hear it at the same level as if the sound

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abatement was not there. At Abbeywood Park, the homes across Timberview Drive are close enough to the courts that they can see over the fence and into the courts from their second story windows. And in the case of our neighbors, they all have offices and bedrooms on their second floors that face the courts and are inundated by pickleball noise when the courts are in use – even when the windows are closed. Priced at \$650 for each 10' tall by 6' wide panel, the cost of this material to cover 240 lineal feet of fence (a little over half of the courts' perimeter fencing) would be \$15,600, but that does not solve the problem of the noise reaching these bedrooms and home offices. Additionally, unlike windscreen where one can partially see through it, this material is a solid fabric, the installation of which would create a ten-foot-high green wall that would completely block the view of the rest of the park and in the opinions of the neighbors, would be an eyesore.

Another option could be to require the use of sound deadening paddles and balls, as they are available for retail purchase. But that would require site supervision and equipment inspections to ensure that is the only equipment being used, and in staff's opinion that is not practical for this situation.

Another alternative would be to limit the courts' use to only certain times of the day. Similar to above, this would require site supervision to assure posted hours of operation are being honored because remember, there is also a tennis court within the same fenced-in area and tennis is not the problem. Further, even a couple of hours of the incessant high-pitched sounds emanating from the courts would leave the nearby park neighbors ill at ease to say the least.

Staff has come to the realization that the use the pickleball courts at Abbeywood Park are receiving exceeds what we anticipated and the resulting impact on the park's neighbors is unreasonable. This is an example of trying to balance what is reasonable for a neighborhood park's neighbors to tolerate with the needs of the community. The neighbors with whom staff met earlier this month are indeed frustrated, but they also recognize the popularity of the sport and the growing demand for courts within the Lisle Park District. In fact, some of them have used the courts and even participated in our clinics. Regardless, as a result of the impact the courts have had on our neighbors, staff recommends this matter be discussed at the regular meeting of January 19, 2023, to consider next steps.

PARK BOARD UPDATE
JANUARY 4, 2023

Abbeywood Park Pickleball Courts and Noise Study: I meant to include the attached noise study that one of the Abbeywood Park neighbors paid to have conducted in my update last month. It helped me better understand the situation and I thought all of you could benefit from seeing it.

I spoke with a few of our pickleball enthusiasts this week about the situation and suffice it to say this is a frustrating position all around, although with varying degrees of disappointment. They are disappointed that the neighbors are suggesting the courts be removed from service altogether and that I am considering recommending reducing court availability due to the neighbors' complaints, but they all agree the courts are receiving a level of use that was not anticipated. Some understand and appreciate the impact the incredible usage has had on the neighbors, and they are all of course supportive of building multi-court complex at a more suitable location. However knowing a new complex would take at least 18 months to complete, and that is an aggressive timeline if we were to pursue grant funding, one feels that we're back to square one and again playing the waiting game to get dedicated pickleball courts in Lisle. A couple others realize the value in establishing dedicated courts at a location away from immediate neighbors, and that it may just take a little more time to get it right. This is surely a small sampling of those who have enjoyed the courts at Abbeywood Park, but it gives us a taste of what to expect moving forward should we decide to make any alterations to the availability of the courts there.

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The idea of a compromise has been broached by these pickleball players, whereby the park district reduces the hours of operation of the courts and consider installing sound abatement, as that is an effort by the park district to reduce the impact while pursuing the construction of a more suitable facility elsewhere. Staff is not confident in the ability to effectively police limited hours of operation without dedicated staff, nor are we confident in the effectiveness of sound abatement panels to reduce the sound to a more tolerable level, especially at the second story level of the nearby homes. However, these are efforts to demonstrate we recognize the problem and are taking active measures to mitigate it, although it will not eliminate it altogether, while we pursue the construction of more courts to meet some of the incredible demand for pickleball facilities.

I continue to recommend the Park Board discuss this matter at your meeting of January 19 to offer some feedback and possible direction and will include it on the agenda under staff reports.

Background on Pickleball Sound & Human Hearing:

Description of Pickleball Sound

Pickleball is a game played with paddles, a ball, and a net on a court that is approximately one half the size of a tennis court. The paddles are made of wood, plastic, or composite materials, and the ball is made of plastic. The sound generated by pickleball is about 14 decibels louder than the sound generated by tennis, and it has a higher, more annoying pitch, usually around 1,000 Hz as opposed to 250 Hz. Homeowners in proximity to pickleball courts hear a louder sound than from tennis play. At some elevated sound level, pickleball sounds are considered as noise and become bothersome and intrusive. The background noise level varies but average noise levels can be used.

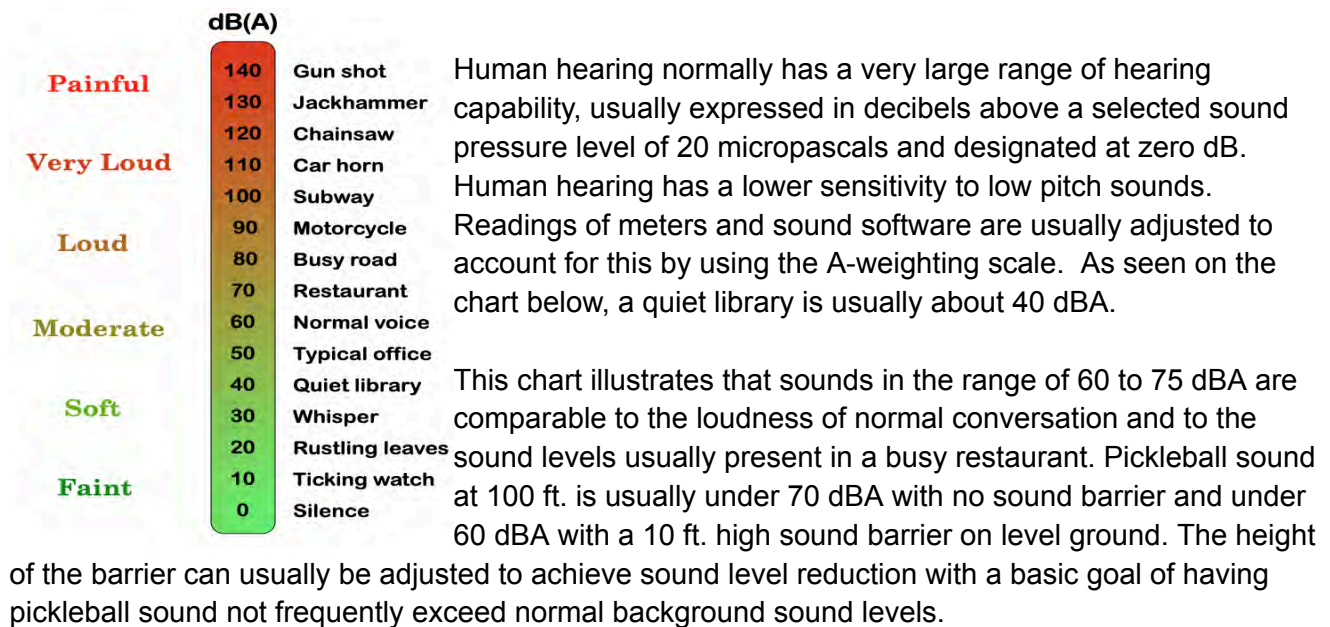
This report will provide measurement data for a home close to courts at this location.

Human Hearing and Annoyance

The human ear is sensitive to a sound's level, its frequency content, and its duration. The higher the sound level, the greater the annoyance becomes. Each 10 dB increase in sound level is perceived as a doubling in the sound level, which is a 100% increase. Each 6 dB increase is perceived as a 50% increase and each 3 dB increase is perceived as a 23% increase.

The human ear is more sensitive to high frequency sounds than to low frequency sounds. It is also sensitive to the duration of noise. This characteristic is taken into account in the selection of back-up beepers for trucks. That pitch is about 1,200 Hz, close to the common pitch of pickleball hits.

Typical Sound Levels



The American National Standards Institute (ANSI) for noise recommendation is 55 dBA. Based upon our experience PSM LLC recommends that pickleball sound levels be below 50 dBA at residential properties, whenever possible.

FRS-1 Sound Recording and Output:

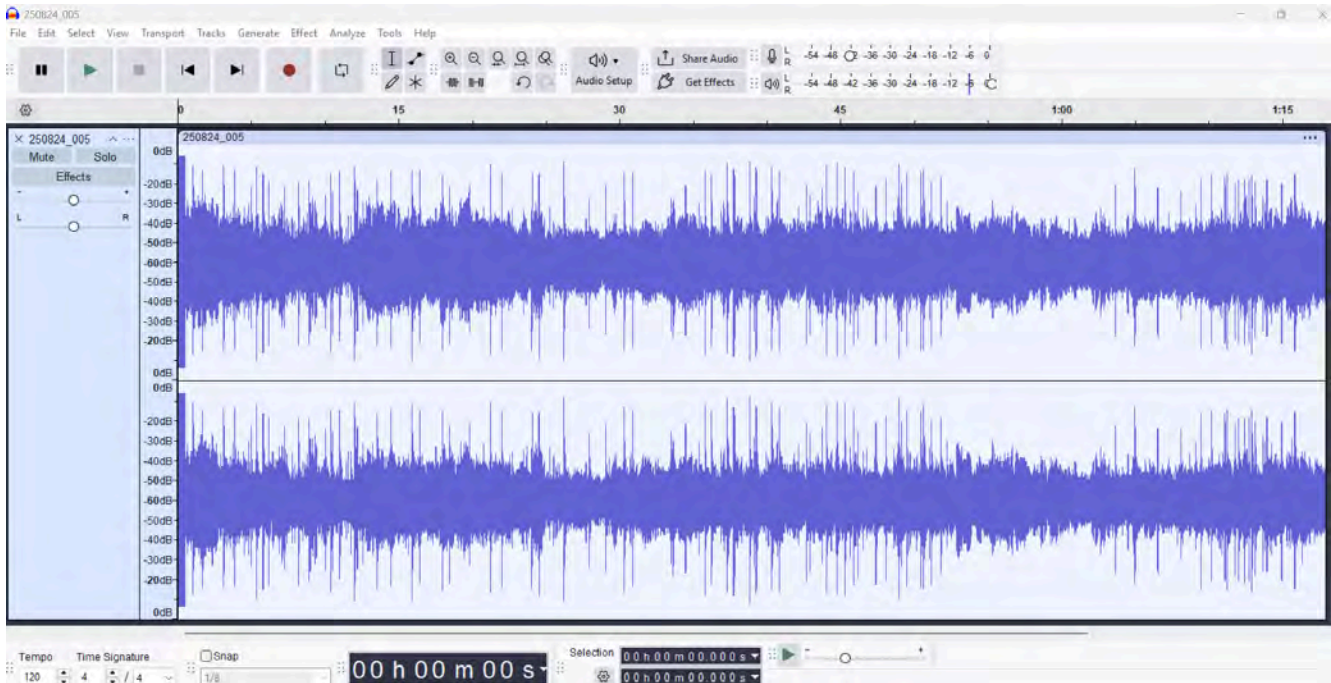
The following analysis will analyze the output recorded by the FRS-1 audio recording system near the Lisle, IL courts. The FRS-1 output is programmed to deliver two recordings from four microphones. The FRS-1 Recorder has been calibrated with actual pickleball sound levels by PSM LLC prior to delivery to this location.

The audio output is in a Wav file format. The waveform below represents the magnitude of 2 channels of sound recorded. The top trace is channel 1 and the lower trace is channel 2. These displays have logarithmic vertical scales, which enable us to see and measure the background noise floor clearly.

The vertical display is in decibels relative to the maximum value or a “Full Scale Reading”

The vertical display center is at -60 dB relative to the full value. The horizontal scale is time in seconds and minutes. The graph below is an example of recorded audio levels of both channels over the time of a typical recording from this site. The narrow vertical lines represent the levels of pickleball hit sounds. In this example, the pickleball sound levels are over 20 decibels higher than the sound level present between pickleball hits.

The following waveform represents an entire one minute 20 second recording, # 250824_005, with Channel 1 data at the top and Channel 2 data at the bottom. It includes a ½ second long test tone and about 60 significant pickleball impulsive sounds:



Defining The Sound Level Metrics

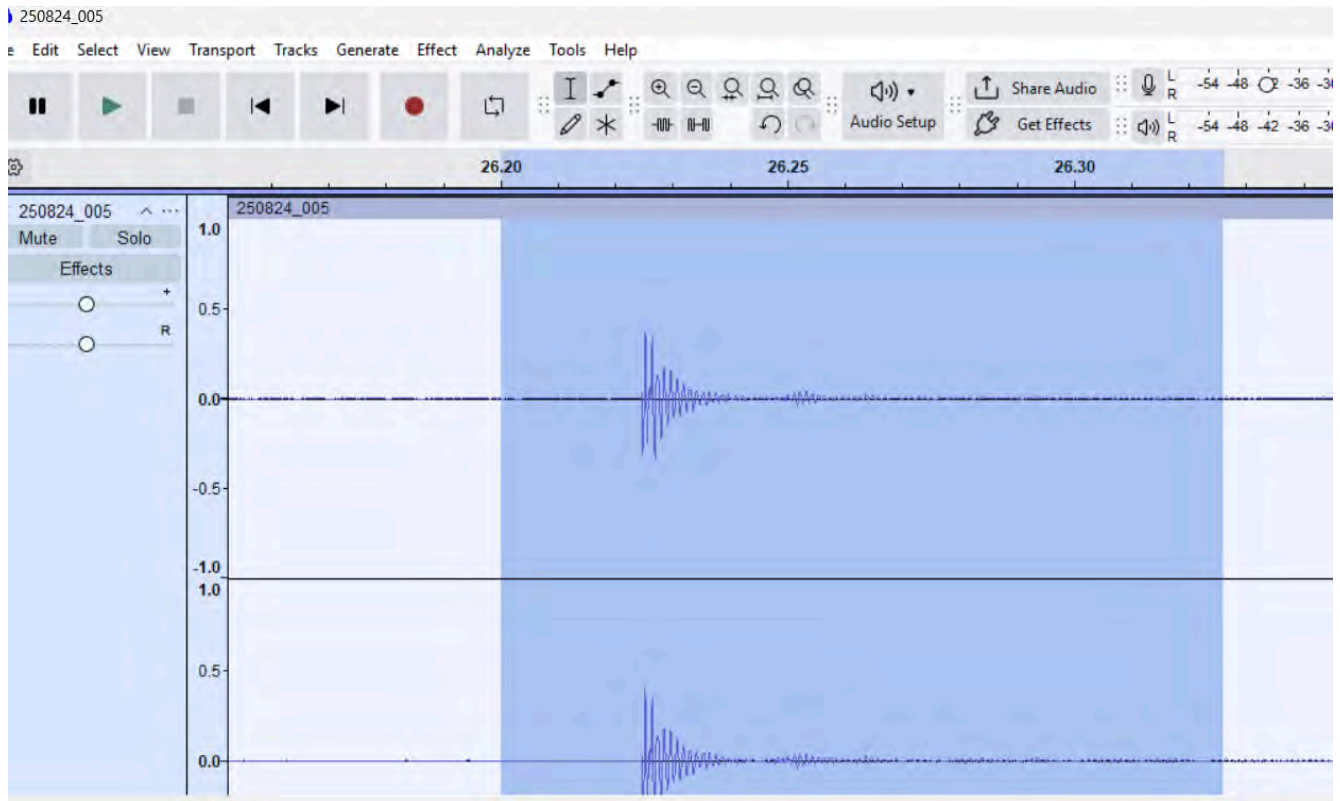
LCpeak, LAFmin, Leq(30Seconds) (no pickleball), LAFmax and Leq(30s) (with [pickleball])

There is an audio tone at the beginning of each recording that is used to check the calibration. Its level is at 99 dBC and it is used as a comparison level for the LCpeak sound readings and all other measurements.

In the listed metrics, “L” means level, “C” stands for wideband C weighting, “A” stands for A-weighted, which adjusts for normal human hearing, “F” stands for “Fast Mode”, an ANSI defined sampling period for impulsive sounds like pickleball. Min and Max are abbreviations for minimum and maximum values. We generally want to know how quiet does a site occasionally get, or **LAFmin**, and how loud does it get when the loudest pickleball sounds are measured, **LCpeak** and **LAFmax**.

The first measurement sequence involved measuring the Minimum Noise Level metric, called **LAFmin**, and the average noise levels over longer periods of time, called **Leq**, or equivalent noise level over a 30 second time period, with no pickleball sound present.

Analyzing one hit we get this waveform from File 250824_005:

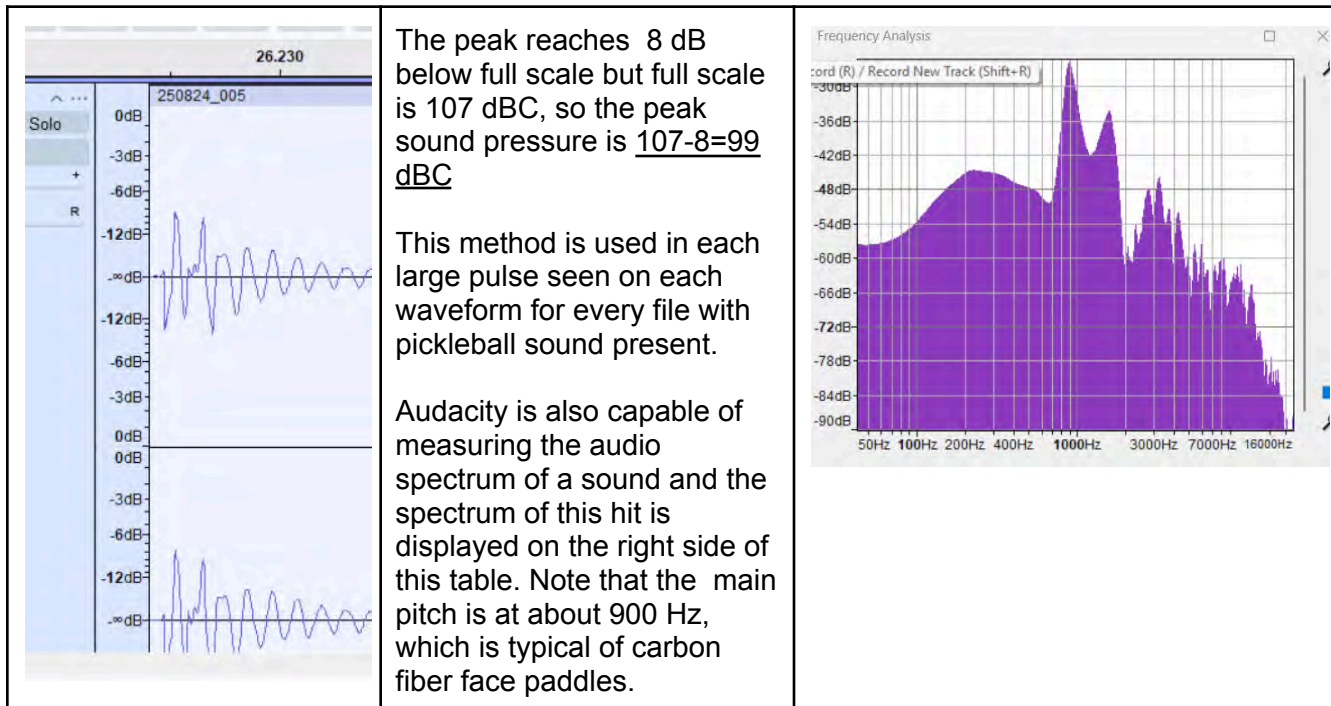


The blue area is 125 ms long or Fast Mode and the level reported by Audacity is **78.5 dBA LAFmax**.

Looking closer at this waveform we see in the following page a view of the waveform decaying and its associated audio spectrum.

The spectrum graph on the right shows sound level vs. audio frequency from 20 Hz to 20,000 Hz with a peak near 9,000 Hz and another peak at a harmonic frequency of 1,800 Hz. This is a common spectrum for a pickleball strike sound.

Next we measure the sound level of the pickleball hits, which we term **LCpeak** and **LAFmax** along with **LASmin**, the quietest sound level measured and **LAeq**, the “Equivalent” sound level, which is an excellent metric to measure background noise levels. Those measured values are shown in the table



The Location

The measurement location is about 55 feet from the court fence and sits between two lots, separating the properties at 6282 Timberview and 6286 Timberview as shown in red in this satellite photo:

The above figures were calculated by both listening to and analyzing the waveforms of all of the recordings using Audacity software.

During that analysis, time windows of 0.125 seconds, 1.0 and approximately 30 seconds were used to determine the sound power level present to provide readings for the table above. These are the time periods defined by the ANSI standard for Fast Mode and Slow Mode sound measurements and **LAeq** in 30 second selections. **LCpeak** was the observed maximum pressure level shown on the waveform for each pickleball strike. **LCpeak** was not measured during ambient tests since incidental background sounds are all factored into the average equivalent level, **LAeq**,

The data above therefore represents the sound levels present during the quietest periods of noise and the loudest periods of pickleball sound detected at this measurement location.

Summarizing the Results:

The measured levels with pickleball sound present exceed American National Standards of 55 dBA for **Leq** and they will exceed our company recommendation of 50 dBA using the **LAFmax** metric.

The measured levels are louder than that of ordinary conversation and they could be expected to be objectionable in any community. Considering that these levels were measured close to a two story home, installing barriers under 15 feet high would do very little. It would require the installation of a well designed building covering the courts to reach the above goals. Based on our firm's own experience analyzing the sound of pickleball in over 200 locations in the US, the only reasonable solution in this instance is to close these courts.

Pickleball to Noise Ratio and Recommendations:

The background noise level in this neighborhood is frequently below 43 dBA, which is typical of quiet residential communities. Sound levels at this location are about eight times as loud as the ordinary background noise level. There is no practical way s to bring the levels down close to the ambient noise level short of covering these courts in a building

The Use of Quieter Gear

In public court locations, it has been proven to not be practical to enforce the use of quieter gear. Using quieter paddles at this location would not be a sufficient solution. Mandating the use of foam balls instead of pickleballs would be of great benefit but it is not likely that this could be done at this location and enforcement would be impractical if it was attempted.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Altpeter led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. PRESENTATIONS

IV. PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Mr. Vitas Matulyauskas referenced last month's meeting and said the park board does not believe there is a problem at the park and said there is a complete misunderstanding of the pickleball noise. He said the only common solution is quiet balls. He said for three years there have been suggestions to play with quiet balls, but there has been zero compliance. He explained that a quiet ball does not change the game except for pickleball players saying it makes the game less enjoyable. He said the park district should do whatever it takes to make a quiet ball policy and not make light suggestions.

B. Mr. John Gerding stated that the neighbor's objection to the courts' noise has escalated to obstinance, annoyance, and verbally aggressive and bullying behavior to some female players. He said this has consumed enormous amounts of time, energy and resources of the park district and village via relentless calls, emails, and repetitive demands at monthly meetings. He said it has been determined that there are no Lisle rules or laws being broken and specifically referenced the noise ordinance. Yet, he said the park district has gone out of its way to try to appease the neighbor with one concession after another, and he gave multiple examples. He said he lives only a few blocks away from the Abbeywood Park courts and drives by them almost daily and said he is amazed at the decrease in cars and players at the park. He said that was the intent and it has been achieved beyond expectations, yet the neighbors continue to want more. He referenced a

specific time when Mr. Matulyauskas was seen playing on the courts with others using the same “noisy” equipment others use and asked if that was hypocritical. He said the neighbors are intent on turning the courts back to tennis and continue to make repeated demands over and over with the same complaints. He said the park and village board have done everything to appease the concerns of the neighbors. He said it is time to back away and turn your attention to the community as a whole.

C. Mr. Saket Bhatnagar spoke in support of Mr. Matulyauskas, stating that he lives near Abbeywood Park and is affected by the noise from the courts as well. He said he wants to make it clear that he shares Vitas’ frustrations. He said he does not take an activist approach, but that he is equally impacted by the noise from the park. Mr. Bhatnagar shared his belief that the needs of the few cannot be ignored simply because there is a larger group standing in opposition. He also stated that the consistency of their complaints is due to feeling a lack of any progress being made to solve the issue. Mr. Bhatnagar said the number of players has gone down, and he thanked the board for that. He said however, it only takes one pop of the sound to awaken after a long night of work. He said he wants everyone to know this is a health issue and it only affects people who live closest to the park. He referenced Valley Forge Park and the park district’s posting of a “no pickleball” sign. He asked if we could create an ordinance that says you have to use a quiet pickleball, and that would be a positive step. He said he is not against pickleball and acknowledged he has played, but he loves pickleball like he loves other racquet sports.

D. Ms. Margarita Matulyauskas turned and questioned Mr. John Gerding’s opinions as a doctor, at which time President Altpeter stated public comment is to address the board, not the public. Ms. Matulyauskas explained how the noise affects the human body, that it doesn’t affect the body right away, that it happens over time. She explained specific health issues she has suffered, saying the main reason is stress from the pickleball noise. She said Vitas can demonstrate what the noise is in reality, at which time Mr. Matulyauskas stepped forward and placed an instrument on the table in front of President Altpeter. President Altpeter objected, and Mr. Matulyauskas removed it and tried setting the device in front of Director Garvy, at which time Director Garvy said Mr. Matulyauskas is out of line with this conduct and he removed the device and returned to his seat in the audience. Mrs. Matulyauskas said playing with a foam ball does not result in players being less active, moving less or learning less but it will have a positive impact on the neighbors. She said the device Vitas had would have shown the noise exceeds 100 decibels. She referenced articles that report the harm noise has on neighbors, and said their house is the closest.

VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Abbeywood Park Pickleball Courts – discussion and consensus

President Altpeter provided a summary of previous discussions regarding signage recommending but not requiring the use of “quiet” paddles and balls at the Abbeywood Park court, as well as staff efforts to create the signs and supplemental online material. Commissioner Nadeau commented that she was pleased with both the design of the signs and the informational website. Commissioner Wessel briefly discussed his thoughts on why the verbiage cannot be stronger than it currently is and said we cannot make a rule that we do not intend to enforce.

President Altpeter expressed concern that this is yet another thing the park district has researched and the board has discussed, and already they received emails that it will not be acceptable. She also reported an email from someone who was unable to attend the meeting, stating that they have been harassed on the pickleball courts. She said she fears new signage might encourage more bullying at the courts.

Vice President Tapella shared that she had met with three residents local to Abbeywood Park at the courts and that the meeting was both cordial and constructive. She said her opinion has not changed since last month which is to come up with signage that doesn't allude to policy that doesn't exist or contain any threats or negative language. She said they discussed the size of signage, placement and visibility of any signs that would be posted and said putting signage where the pickleball courts and players are as opposed to by the gate, where everyone just walks right by without reading it. Vice President Tapella mentioned that she thought the proposed signage was a good first draft, but she has some ideas to improve the verbiage that she will share with staff at another time. She said the last point that she and the neighbors discussed was permitting residents, at their own expense but with staff approval, to place quiet equipment in the court for public use.

President Altpeter asked the Board to confirm that updated signage would be the final effort by the Park Board to address the situation as this issue has taken considerable resources and staff time. All of the commissioners agreed that further steps would not be considered. Director Garvy briefly outlined what the next steps for creating and finalizing the new signs would be.

The Board briefly discussed and agreed that the sale of “quiet” pickleballs at the Recreation Center was not something that would be done going forward. The Park Board agreed to consider allowing residents to leave a container of “quiet” balls on the court for public use, but any signage that they may wish to put up for the purpose of explaining the use of the equipment must be approved by the Park District.

ORDER OF THE BOARD (by B.F. Currie):

On January 5, 2026, Vitautas Matulyauskas filed a *pro se* complaint (Comp.) against Lisle Park District (Lisle). The complaint concerns noise from pickleball courts in Abbeywood Park at 2211 Abbeywood Drive, Lisle, DuPage County.

Under the Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5 (2024)), any person may bring an action before the Board to enforce Illinois' environmental requirements. *See* 415 ILCS 5/3.315, 31(d)(1) (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103. In this case, Mr. Matulyauskas alleges that Lisle violated Section 900.102 of the Board's noise regulations (35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102) and Section 24 of the Act (415 ILCS 5/24 (2024)) by causing or allowing noise emissions from the Abbeywood Park pickleball courts so as to unreasonably interfere with his enjoyment of life. Mr. Matulyauskas asks that the Board order Lisle to, among other things, (1) cease and desist from causing or allowing noise pollution originating from the pickleball courts; (2) adopt and enforce reasonable operational controls governing the type of pickleballs permitted for use on the courts, including requiring the use of quiet-performance pickleballs; and (3) pay a civil penalty.

On February 3, 2026, Lisle timely filed a motion to dismiss the complaint (Mot.). *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.212(b). Lisle argues the complaint is frivolous for failing to state a cause of action upon which the Board can grant relief. Specifically, Lisle argues that the pickleball play is an "organized amateur or professional sporting activity" under the Act and therefore exempt from Board noise regulation. On February 11, 2026, Mr. Matulyauskas filed a response to the motion to dismiss (Resp.) and on February 13, 2026, he filed a motion for leave to file a supplemental memorandum.

For the reasons below, the Board denies Lisle's motion to dismiss the complaint, finds the complaint is neither duplicative nor frivolous, accepts the complaint for hearing, and grants Lisle leave until June 1, 2026, to file an answer to the complaint. First, the Board addresses a procedural motion and summarizes the filings.

PROCEDURAL MOTION

Within the 14-day timeframe for filing a response to Lisle's motion to dismiss (35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.500(d)), and after filing his response, Mr. Matulyauskas' filed a motion for leave to file a supplemental memorandum, attaching the supplemental memorandum. Lisle did not file an objection to his motion for leave. The Board grants the motion for leave and accepts Mr. Matulyauskas' supplemental memorandum.

FILINGS

Mr. Matulyauskas' Complaint

The complaint alleges that Lisle has violated Section 24 of the Act and Section 900.102 of the Board's regulations. Comp. at 4. Section 24 of the Act provides: "No person shall emit beyond the boundaries of his property any noise that unreasonably interferes with the enjoyment of life or with any lawful business or activity, so as to violate any regulation or standard adopted by the Board under this Act." 415 ILCS 5/24 (2024). Section 900.102 of the Board's noise regulations states in relevant part: "A person must not cause or allow the emission of sound beyond the boundaries of that person's property . . . that causes noise pollution in Illinois" 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102. And the regulations define "noise pollution" as "the emission of sound that unreasonably interferes with the enjoyment of life or with any lawful business or activity." 35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.101.

Mr. Matulyauskas alleges noise pollution from "unstructured public pickleball play on outdoor courts" at Abbeywood Park in Lisle. Comp. at 3. The pickleball courts were "converted from tennis courts." *Id.* Mr. Matulyauskas lives across the street from the pickleball courts; his residential property boundary is allegedly 45 feet from the courts. *Id.* The alleged noise consists of "high-frequency, impulsive sound emissions. . . generated by pickleball play," primarily from "paddle-to-ball impacts." *Id.* at 3, 4. Mr. Matulyauskas alleges that the noise began in approximately May 2022 when the court conversion occurred. *Id.* at 4. The noise "occurs repeatedly and frequently during park hours, often daily, from early morning through evening, particularly during spring, summer, and fall." *Id.* at 4-5.

Mr. Matulyauskas compiled a usage log of when he observed the courts to be in use and attached the log to the complaint as Exhibit C. The log recorded 39 days of play, spanning from August to October, and shows that the courts were used every day and play began some days at 8 a.m. and some days ended as late as 7:30 p.m. Comp., Exh. C. Mr. Matulyauskas also included, as Exhibit A to his complaint, a Data Analysis Report from Pickleball Sound Labs. According to the report, sound measurements were taken approximately 55 feet from the court fence and on the property line of Mr. Matulyauskas' residence. Comp., Exh. A at 5. The report shows that the sound measurements recorded the average ambient sound (without pickleball noise) and 20 minutes of sound recording while pickleball play was occurring. *Id.* at 6. Mr. Matulyauskas alleges the "measured levels documented by a licensed professional engineer include peak levels exceeding 100dBC (LCpeak), LAFmax values approaching 80 dBA, and sustained LAeq levels materially above residential background conditions." Comp. at 4.

The complaint alleges that the “repetitive, impulsive pickleball noise unreasonably interferes with the Complainants’ enjoyment of life and use of their residential property, including outdoor activities, rest, relaxation, job duties, and concentration,” in violation of Section 24 of the Act and Section 900.102 of the Board’s regulations. Comp. at 4, 5.¹ Mr. Matulyauskas further alleges that since the courts were converted, he and his spouse have experienced cardiac issues, stress, and psychological distress. *Id.* at 5. Mr. Matulyauskas alleges that he works a night shift and daytime pickleball noise has interfered with his ability to sleep. *Id.*

According to the complaint, because the pickleball play consists of “informal, unscheduled, open public recreational use without leagues, officials, permits, or organized events,” it “does not constitute an organized amateur or professional sporting activity” under the Act’s Section 25 exemption. Comp. at 4.

Lisle’s Motion to Dismiss

Lisle asks the Board to dismiss the complaint as frivolous for failing to state a cause of action upon which the Board can grant relief. Mot. at 1. Specifically, Lisle claims that pickleball play on the courts at Abbeywood Park constitutes an “organized amateur or professional sporting activity”, which Section 25 of the Act exempts from the Board’s noise regulations. *Id.* at 4. Therefore, Lisle argues that the Board does not have jurisdiction to hear this complaint. *Id.* at 3, 8.

Section 25 of the Act provides the exemption:

No Board standards for monitoring noise or regulations prescribing limitations on noise emissions shall apply to any *organized amateur or professional sporting activity* except as otherwise provided in this Section. 415 ILCS 5/25 (2024) (emphasis added).

And Section 3.310 of the Act defines “organized amateur or professional sporting activity” as follows:

an activity or event carried out at a facility by persons who engaged in that activity as a business or for education, charity or entertainment for the general public, including all necessary actions and activities associated with such an activity. This definition includes, but is not limited to, (i) rifle and pistol ranges, licensed shooting preserves, and skeet, trap or shooting sports clubs in existence prior to January 1, 1994, (ii) public hunting areas operated by a governmental entity, (iii) organized motor sports, and (iv) sporting events organized or controlled by school districts, units of local government, state agencies, colleges, universities, or professional sports clubs offering exhibitions to the public. 415 ILCS 5/3.310 (2024).

¹ The complaint occasionally uses the plural “Complainants,” but the complaint names only Mr. Matulyauskas as complainant and the Board considers him this proceeding’s only complainant.

Lisle points to Williams v. Schaumburg Park District, PCB 96-186 (May 16, 1996), in which the Board dismissed a citizen noise complaint after finding that basketball activities occurring at a park owned and operated by Schaumburg Park District fell within the Section 25 exemption.

Lisle argues that the facts in Williams are “nearly identical” to those in this case, “with the only difference being the organized amateur sporting activity in question.” Mot. at 6. As in Williams, Lisle continues, the sporting activity is controlled by the Park District, a unit of local government. *Id.* at 8. Lisle has a conduct ordinance, which controls use of all its parks and facilities, as well as specific rules that control pickleball courts and pickleball play. *Id.* Lisle alleges that these rules are enforced by Park District staff and the Village of Lisle Police Department. *Id.* at 2. Pickleball at Abbeywood Park is available to Park District residents and members of the general public. *Id.* The pickleball play is “carried out for the entertainment of those participating in the activity, whether as active participants or as spectators.” *Id.* at 8.

Mr. Matulyauskas’ Response to Lisle’s Motion to Dismiss

In his response, Mr. Matulyauskas asserts factual differences between Williams and this case. Mr. Matulyauskas claims that Williams emphasized facts demonstrating “active control and management, including” “ranger enforcement, structured restrictions, and the Park District’s active oversight of the basketball court.” Resp. at 6. In contrast, Mr. Matulyauskas alleges that Lisle Park District’s rules involving pickleball play at Abbeywood Park are “voluntary, unenforced, and acknowledged by Respondent’s own staff to be ineffective.” *Id.*

BOARD DISCUSSION

Motion to Dismiss

When deciding a motion to dismiss, the Board takes all well-pleaded factual allegations as true and draws all reasonable inferences from them in favor of the non-movant. *See, e.g., Beers v. Calhoun*, PCB 04-204, slip op. at 2 (July 22, 2004). A complaint is frivolous if it requests “relief that the Board does not have the authority to grant” or “fails to state a cause of action upon which the Board can grant relief.” 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.202 (definition of “frivolous”).

The exemption in Section 25 of the Act for an “organized amateur or professional sporting activity” applies not only to the Board’s prohibition against noise that exceeds numeric standards, but also to the Board’s prohibition against noise that “unreasonably interferes” with the enjoyment of life or with any lawful business or activity. *See Shepard v. Pollution Control Board*, 272 Ill. App. 3d 764, 768-9 (2d Dist. 1995).

Lisle’s motion to dismiss asserts that Section 25 exempts the Abbeywood Park pickleball noise from Mr. Matulyauskas’ claim of unreasonable interference. Central to the Section 25 exemption is the definition of “organized amateur or professional sporting activity.” As relevant here, the Act defines the term as, “an activity or event carried out at a facility by persons who engaged in that activity . . . for . . . entertainment for the general public, including all necessary actions and activities associated with such an activity. This definition includes, but is not limited

to . . . (iv) sporting events organized or controlled by . . . units of local government . . . offering exhibitions to the public.” 415 ILCS 5/3.310 (2024).

A quasi-judicial agency may depart from its own precedent so long as it articulates its reasons for doing so. See Chemetco, Inc. v. Illinois Pollution Control Board, 140 Ill. App. 3d 283, 289 (5th Dist. 1986). The Board today finds that Williams expanded the exemption for an “organized amateur or professional sporting activity” beyond what the statutory language supports, contrary to the protective purposes of the Act.

In Williams, the Board found, at the pleading stage, that the pickup basketball games at Schaumburg Park District’s basketball court qualified for the Section 25 exemption on two grounds: the basketball games constituted (1) sporting events controlled by a unit of local government and (2) an activity carried out at a facility by persons who engaged in that activity for entertainment for the general public. Williams, PCB 96-186, slip op. at 2-3. The Board therefore dismissed the residents’ noise complaint for lack of jurisdiction. *Id.* at 3.

First, Williams found that the basketball games satisfied the following clause in the definition’s second sentence: “sporting events . . . controlled by . . . units of local government.” Williams, PCB 96-186, slip op. at 2-3. According to Williams, the existence of local rules applicable to all activities at Park District facilities, including the basketball court, was sufficient to establish that Schaumburg controlled the basketball games: “*the rules . . . provide the Park District with control over the activities at its facilities including the basketball court.*” *Id.* (emphasis added). The “controlled by” analysis articulated in Williams did not rely on either the specific content of the park district’s rules or the effectiveness of their enforcement.

Williams did not address whether the basketball games were “events,” as used in the definition’s second sentence. An “event” denotes something scheduled, discrete, and structured, like a tournament, not a pickup basketball game. The definition’s first sentence, on the other hand, uses the phrase “activity or event.” As the General Assembly used both words in the same definition, the words must have been intended to have different meanings or else “or activity” would be rendered surplusage. See People v. Jackson, 2011 IL 110615, ¶ 12 (“Each word, clause, and sentence of a statute must be given a reasonable meaning, if possible, and should not be rendered superfluous.”). Tellingly, Williams did not use the word “events” when analyzing the second sentence. Instead, it used the broader term “activities,” which does not appear in the second sentence. To qualify under the second sentence’s plain language, Lisle’s pickleball games would have to constitute sporting “events.”

Williams also did not consider the phrase at the end of the definition’s second sentence: “offering exhibitions to the public.” See Hinsdale Golf Club v. Kochanski, 197 Ill. App. 3d 634, 639 (2d Dist. 1990) (the phrase qualifies all the entities listed in what is now Section 3.310(iv), whether “school districts, units of local government, state agencies, colleges, universities or professional sports clubs”). An “exhibition” implies a performance, demonstration, or competition put on for the benefit of an audience. Offering exhibitions to the public is consistent with an event. The question remains at this point in the case whether the pickleball games at Abbeywood Park are events being offered by Lisle as exhibitions to the public. The Board expects this issue will be developed in the record as the case proceeds.

Additionally, the question remains whether the pickleball games are “organized or controlled by” Lisle. The Board expects this issue will also be developed in the record as the case proceeds. Relatedly, the parties should address whether either the contents or enforcement of Lisle’s rules is relevant to this issue.²

Second, Williams found that the basketball games also satisfied the following clause in the definition’s first sentence: “an activity . . . carried out at a facility by persons who engaged in that activity . . . for . . . entertainment for the general public.” Williams, PCB 96-186, slip op. at 3. Williams found that the relevant fact for satisfying the definition’s first sentence was that “members of the general public be allowed to participate in the activity either as a participant or spectator.” *Id.* The Board did not respond to complainants’ claims that “the facility has never hosted any organized activity nor has any organized team play or practice taken place on the court.” *Id.* at 1. Nor did the Board address complainants’ allegations that they observed “no coaches at the facility and no supervision by the Park District.” *Id.*

The question remains at this point in the case whether the pickleball games complained of constitute an “organized” activity being “carried out.” The Board expects this issue will be developed in the record as the case proceeds.

Taking all well-pled factual allegations of Mr. Matulyauskas’ complaint as true and drawing all reasonable inferences from them in his favor, the Board cannot conclude that Lisle has established the Section 25 exemption as a matter of law. Therefore, the Board denies Lisle’s motion to dismiss Mr. Matulyauskas’ complaint as frivolous.

Duplicative or Frivolous

Section 31(d)(1) of the Act provides that “[u]nless the Board determines that [the] complaint is duplicative or frivolous, it shall schedule a hearing.” 415 ILCS 5/31(d)(1) (2024); *see also* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.212(a). A complaint is duplicative if it is “identical or substantially similar to one brought before the Board or another forum.” 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.202. A complaint is frivolous if it requests “relief that the Board does not have the authority to grant” or “fails to state a cause of action upon which the Board can grant relief.” *Id.*

Based on the information in this record, the Board finds that Mr. Matulyauskas’ complaint is not duplicative. Above, in denying Lisle’s motion to dismiss, the Board found that the Act’s Section 25 exemption does not render Mr. Matulyauskas’ complaint frivolous. The Board now further finds that the complaint is not otherwise frivolous based on the record information.

² Lisle’s motion to dismiss asserts facts regarding its pickleball-specific rules, its general rules, and the enforcement of both, but lacks any supporting oath, affidavit, or certification. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.504 (facts asserted that are not of record must be supported by oath, affidavit, or certification).

Hearing and Answer

The Board finds that the complaint meets the content requirements of the Board's procedural rules and accepts the complaint for hearing. *See* 415 ILCS 5/31(d)(1) (2024); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204(c), (f), 103.212(a). Generally, if a respondent fails within that timeframe to file an answer specifically denying, or asserting insufficient knowledge to form a belief of, a material allegation in the complaint, the Board will consider the respondent to have admitted the allegation. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204(d). Lisle's timely filing of its motion to dismiss stayed the 60-day period for filing an answer to the complaint, which stay ends today with the Board's ruling on the motion. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204(e). Lisle therefore has until June 1, 2026, to file an answer to Mr. Matulyauskas' complaint. *See* United City of Yorkville v. Hamman Farms, PCB 08-96, slip op. at 26 (Oct. 16, 2008) (setting 60-day deadline after ruling on motion to dismiss).

The Board directs the hearing officer to proceed expeditiously to hearing. Among the hearing officer's responsibilities is the "duty . . . to ensure development of a clear, complete, and concise record for timely transmission to the Board." 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.610. A complete record in an enforcement case thoroughly addresses, among other things, the appropriate remedy, if any, for the alleged violations, including any civil penalty.

If a complainant proves an alleged violation, the Board considers the factors set forth in Sections 33(c) and 42(h) of the Act to fashion an appropriate remedy for the violation. *See* 415 ILCS 5/33(c), 42(h) (2024). Specifically, the Board considers the Section 33(c) factors in determining, first, what to order the respondent to do to correct an on-going violation, if any, and, second, whether to order the respondent to pay a civil penalty. The factors provided in Section 33(c) bear on the reasonableness of the circumstances surrounding the violation, such as the character and degree of any resulting interference with protecting public health, the technical practicability and economic reasonableness of compliance, and whether the respondent has subsequently eliminated the violation.

If, after considering the Section 33(c) factors, the Board decides to impose a civil penalty on the respondent, only then does the Board consider the Act's Section 42(h) factors in determining the appropriate amount of the civil penalty. Section 42(h) sets forth factors that may mitigate or aggravate the civil penalty amount. These factors include the following: the duration and gravity of the violation; whether the respondent showed due diligence in attempting to comply; any economic benefits that the respondent accrued from delaying compliance based upon the "lowest cost alternative for achieving compliance"; the need to deter further violations by the respondent and others similarly situated; and whether the respondent "voluntarily self-disclosed" the violation. 415 ILCS 5/42(h) (2024). Section 42(h) requires the Board to ensure that the penalty is "at least as great as the economic benefits, if any, accrued by the respondent as a result of the violation, unless the Board finds that imposition of such penalty would result in an arbitrary or unreasonable financial hardship." *Id.* Such penalty, however, "may be off-set in whole or in part pursuant to a supplemental environmental project agreed to by the complainant and the respondent." *Id.*

Accordingly, the Board further directs the hearing officer to advise the parties that in summary judgment motions and responses, at hearing, and in briefs, each party should consider: (1) proposing a remedy for a violation, if any (including whether to impose a civil penalty), and supporting its position with facts and arguments that address any or all of the Section 33(c) factors; and (2) proposing a civil penalty, if any (including a specific total dollar amount and the portion of that amount attributable to the respondent's economic benefit, if any, from delayed compliance), and supporting its position with facts and arguments that address any or all of the Section 42(h) factors. The Board also directs the hearing officer to advise the parties to address these issues in any stipulation and proposed settlement that may be filed with the Board.

CONCLUSION

First, the Board denies Lisle's motion to dismiss, which was based solely on the Act's Section 25 exemption for an "organized amateur or professional sporting activity." This denial does not preclude Lisle from attempting to establish the exemption on a developed record. Second, the Board finds that Mr. Matulyauskas' complaint is neither duplicative nor otherwise frivolous. Third, the Board accepts the complaint for hearing. And fourth, the Board gives Lisle 60 days to file an answer to the complaint.

ORDER

1. The Board denies Lisle Park District's motion to dismiss and accepts Mr. Matulyauskas' complaint for hearing.
2. Lisle Park District may file an answer to the complaint by June 1, 2026.

ANSWER: Respondent admits the allegations contained in this paragraph are accurate.

4. Description of the Activity Causing Pollution

The Respondent owns, operates, controls, and permits unstructured public pickle ball play on outdoor courts located at Abbeywood Park, 2211 Abbeywood Drive, Lisle, Illinois. The courts are made available for continuous open public use without restrictions on frequency, duration, or hours of play. Courts were converted from tennis courts and are way too close to the properties. (45' from my property line) Pickleball play at this location generates repetitive, impulsive, high-frequency noise emissions primarily from paddle-to-ball impacts. These impulsive sound events occur in rapid succession and at irregular intervals, producing a distinct and intrusive noise character that propagates beyond the park property boundaries and into nearby residential areas. The resulting sound emissions are readily perceptible at neighboring homes and interfere with the normal use and enjoyment of adjacent residential property.

ANSWER: Respondent admits the allegations contained in this paragraph to the extent that Respondent owns, operates, and controls Abbeywood Park, and it permits public pickle ball play on outdoor courts located at Abbeywood Park. Respondent denies the remainder of the allegations contained in this paragraph.

5. Provisions Alleged to Be Violated

The Respondent has violated **Section 24 of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/24)**, which prohibits any person from causing or allowing the emission of contaminants, including noise, so as to cause or tend to cause air pollution, endanger human health or welfare, or unreasonably interfere with the enjoyment of life or lawful business or activity beyond the boundaries of the property on which the emissions originate.

The Respondent has also violated **35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102**, which provides that no person shall cause or allow the emission of sound beyond the boundaries of the property on which the sound originates where such emission causes noise pollution in Illinois or otherwise violates any provision of the Board's noise regulations. The sound emissions at issue constitute noise pollution as defined in **415 ILCS 5/3.315**, in that they unreasonably interfere with the enjoyment of life or lawful activity. A violation of these provisions may be established through qualitative evidence and is not dependent upon the applicability of numeric sound level standards.

Although **35 Ill. Adm. Code 901.107** exempts sound emissions from certain recreational park activities classified under **LBCS Code 5500** from the numeric sound level limits set forth in **35 Ill. Adm. Code 901.102 through 901.106**, that exemption is limited in scope and does not preclude application of the Act's general prohibitions under **415 ILCS 5/24** or the qualitative noise prohibition contained in **35 Ill. Adm. Code 900.102**.

In addition, **415 ILCS 5/25(f)** limits the Board's authority to adopt numeric sound level standards applicable to organized amateur or professional sporting activities. The pickleball activity at issue here consists of informal, unscheduled, open public recreational use without leagues, officials, permits, or organized events, and therefore does not constitute an organized amateur or

professional sporting activity within the meaning of Section 25(f). Accordingly, sound emissions resulting from such activity remain subject to regulation under the Act and the Board's general noise prohibitions where they cause or tend to cause noise pollution.

ANSWER: Respondent denies any violations of any standards set by the Pollution Control Board, the Illinois Administrative Code, or any other Illinois or Federal law or regulation.

6. Type and Location of Pollution

The pollution is **noise**, consisting of high-frequency, impulsive sound emissions (approximately 900-1,800 Hz) generated by pickleball play. The source is Abbeywood Park pickleball courts at 2211 Abbeywood Dr, Lisle, Illinois. The noise crosses the property boundary and impacts nearby residences, including the Complainant's home at 6282 Timberview Dr.

Measured levels documented by a licensed professional engineer include peak levels exceeding 100 dBC (LCpeak), LAFmax values approaching 80 dBA, and sustained LAeq levels materially above residential background conditions. Exhibit A

ANSWER: Respondent admits the allegations contained in this paragraph to the extent that Respondent permits public pickleball play on outdoor courts located in Abbeywood Park and that the public pickleball play generates noise. Respondent denies the remainder of the allegations contained in this paragraph.

7. Duration and Frequency

The noise has occurred since the conversion of the courts to pickle ball use in approximately May 2022. It occurs repeatedly and frequently during park hours, often daily, from early morning through evening, particularly during spring, summer, and fall. Individual impacts occur dozens of times per minute and persist for hours when courts are occupied.

The condition is ongoing. Observed Usage log is attached. Exhibit C

ANSWER: Respondent admits the allegations contained in this paragraph to the extent that the pickleball courts in Abbeywood Park opened in or around May of 2022, that public pickleball activity occurs at various times throughout the day during hours established by Respondent, and that public pickleball activity occurs in the spring, summer, and fall months. Respondent denies the remainder of the allegations contained in this paragraph.

8. Adverse Effects

The repetitive, impulsive pickleball noise unreasonably interferes with the Complainants' enjoyment of life and use of their residential property, including outdoor activities, rest, relaxation, job duties, and concentration. The noise's impulsive and high-frequency characteristics-rapid onset of approximately **1-2 milliseconds**, followed by high-density repetition over roughly **20**

milliseconds-make it particularly intrusive, penetrating, and stressful compared to typical ambient residential sounds, akin to living adjacent to a pistol firing range.

These impacts are documented in the attached peer-reviewed study, *"Pickleball Noise: The Physiological and Psychological Effects on Nearby Residents"* by **Kathleen M. Romito and Daniel Fink** (*Proceedings of Meetings on Acoustics*, Vol. 56, 050001 (2025)). The study analyzes **246 self-reported mentions of adverse health effects** from similar exposures, of which **45.9% were physical** (including **46.0% nervous system effects, 25. 7% cardiovascular effects, and 25. 7% sleep disruption**) and **54.1 % psychological** (including **51.3% severe distress or use of the term "torture," with two respondents reporting suicidal thoughts; 23.9% trauma or PTSD-like symptoms; and the remainder reporting anxiety, stress, and depression**).

The study further explains how sustained exposure to impulsive noise activates a harmful physiological stress response, resulting in elevated heart rate, increased blood pressure, adrenaline and cortisol release, and vascular inflammation. Documented long-term risks include cardiovascular disease, stroke, dementia, and cognitive decline. (*Exhibit B*)

Personally, within the past decade, during an insurance health screening, the male Complainant was informed that he ranked in the **top 5% of healthiest individuals** in his age group. However, after approximately **two years of exposure** to the pickle ball noise, he was diagnosed with cardiovascular disease and underwent a **heart procedure (stent placement)** in **June 2024**. Since that time, he has required frequent physician visits, multiple MRI scans of the head, and ongoing cardiac medications.

The spouse of a Complainant has likewise suffered unexplained health deterioration, including high blood pressure and persistent stress, necessitating multiple surgeries related to **endocrine system dysfunction caused by chronic stress**. The noise exposure has induced severe psychological distress described as "torture," exacerbating anxiety, hypervigilance, and PTSD-like symptoms, including nightmares and heightened sound sensitivity.

The male Complainant's employment requires night shifts, rendering him unable to sleep during daytime pickleball play hours and resulting in chronic sleep deprivation. As seniors who spend the majority of their time homebound, the Complainants are disproportionately affected compared to surrounding neighbors, leading to a significantly reduced quality of life, potential diminution of property value, and ongoing mental anguish.

ANSWER: Respondent denies the allegations contained in this paragraph.

9. Relief Requested

Through numerous statements and actions, the Park District has demonstrated that it is fully aware of the noise problems but refuses to implement readily available commonsense measures. Complainant is a member of USA pickle ball association and strongly believes relief measures requested are doable and reasonable.

The Complainants respectfully request that the Board enter an order finding that the Respondent has violated the Environmental Protection Act and the Board's noise regulations as alleged herein, and requiring the Respondent to take such actions as are necessary to abate the noise pollution and prevent its recurrence. Without limiting the Board's discretion, Complainants request that such relief include the following:

- a. An order requiring the Respondent to cease and desist from causing or allowing noise pollution originating from the pickleball courts at Abbeywood Park and to implement effective noise-abatement measures sufficient to prevent unreasonable interference with the enjoyment of life or lawful activity beyond the property boundary;
- b. An order requiring the Respondent to adopt and enforce reasonable operational controls governing the type of pickleballs permitted for use on the courts, including requiring the use of pickleballs meeting recognized quiet-performance criteria designed to substantially reduce impulsive, high-frequency noise emissions, such as foam or other low-noise pickleballs designated under the **USA Pickleball Quiet Category** or other objectively verifiable quiet-ball standards;
- c. An order requiring the Respondent to post clear and conspicuous signage at the pickle ball courts informing users of any ball-use restrictions adopted to comply with the Board's order;
- d. An order requiring the Respondent to implement reasonable compliance measures sufficient to ensure adherence to any ball-use restrictions imposed pursuant to the Board's order, which may include monitoring, on-site provision of compliant balls, or other measures appropriate in light of the enforcement challenges identified in the attached expert **Sound Data Analysis Report** prepared by Robert M. Unetich, P.E. (Sept. 2025); Exhibit A
- e. An order requiring such additional or alternative measures as the Board determines are necessary and appropriate to abate the noise pollution and prevent future violations, including operational limitations or cessation of use, should the Board determine that equipment-based controls alone are insufficient to achieve compliance, as discussed in the attached expert report.

Complainants further request that the Board assess a civil penalty against the Respondent as authorized under the Environmental Protection Act and grant such other and further relief as the Board deems just and appropriate.

ANSWER: Respondent affirmatively states that it has been in contact with Complainant numerous times since May of 2022 regarding these allegations and Respondent has implemented several changes to the public pickleball play at Abbeywood Park during that time, many of which were in direct response to suggestions made by Complainant. The Respondent denies any violations of any standards set by the Pollution Control Board, the Illinois Administrative Code, or any other Illinois or Federal law or regulation. The Respondent further denies the remainder of the allegations contained in this Paragraph.

10. Duplicative or Similar Actions

The Complainant is not aware of any identical or substantially similar enforcement action brought before the Board or another forum against the Respondent for the same alleged noise pollution.

ANSWER: Respondent lacks the knowledge or information sufficient to form a belief as to the truth of the allegations contained in this paragraph.

11 . Representation

The Complainant represents himself as an individual and is not an attorney licensed to practice law in Illinois.

ANSWER: Upon information and belief, Respondent admits the allegations contained in this Paragraph.

ANSWER: Respondent admits that certain exhibits are attached to the Complaint. Respondent lacks the knowledge or information sufficient to form a belief as to the truth of the allegations contained in the exhibits or the truth or veracity of the exhibits themselves.

WHEREFORE, the Respondent, Lisle Park District, respectfully requests this Board enter judgment in its favor and against Complainant and for any and all other relief as this Board deems appropriate and just.

AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSES

Affirmative Defense No. 1

1. The Respondent is a “local public entity” as defined by the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (“Act”). 745 ILCS 10/1-206.

2. “Except as otherwise provided by Statute, a public employee serving in a position involving the determination of policy or the exercise of discretion is not liable for an injury

resulting from his act or omission in determining policy when acting in the exercise of such discretion even though abused.” 745 ILCS 10/2-201.

3. “A local public entity is not liable for an injury resulting from an act or omission of its employee where the employee is not liable.” 745 ILCS 10/2-109.

4. To the extent the vague allegations of Complainant’s Complaint allege that any particular condition of the property resulted in an alleged injury, then pleading in the affirmative, and subject to the responsive pleadings contained in the Answer, such condition resulted from a discretionary decision by a Respondent employee, and thus the Respondent has absolute immunity pursuant to 745 ILCS 10/2-109 and 10/2-201.

Affirmative Defense No. 2

1. The Respondent is a “local public entity” as defined by the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (“Act”). 745 ILCS 10/1-206.

2. The Act protects local public employees from liability for actions committed “in the execution or enforcement of any law unless such act or omission constitutes willful and wanton conduct.” 745 ILCS 10/2-202.

3. Willful and wanton conduct is “a course of action which shows an actual or deliberate intention to cause harm or which, if not intentional, shows an utter indifference to or conscious disregard for the safety of others or their property.”

4. The Respondent’s acts or omissions did not constitute willful or wanton conduct.

Affirmative Defense No. 3

1. There was in full force and effect, in the State of Illinois, at the time of the occurrence in question the following additional sections of the Tort Immunity Act, which provide as follows:

(a) Section 2-103. Failing to adopt or enforce. A local public entity is not liable for an injury caused by adopting or failing to adopt an enactment or by failing to enforce any law.

(b) Section 2-201. Determination of policy or exercise of discretion. Except as otherwise provided by Statute, a public employee serving in a position involving the determination of policy or the exercise of discretion is not liable for an injury resulting from his act or omission in determining policy when acting in the exercise of such discretion even though abused.

(c) Section 2-204. Acts or omissions of another person. Except as otherwise provided by statute, a public employee, as such and acting within the scope of his employment, is not liable for an injury caused by the act or omission of another person.

(d) Section 2-205. Adoption of enactment. A public employee is not liable for an injury caused by his adoption of, or failure to adopt, an enactment, or by his failure to enforce any law.

(e) Section 2-207. Failure to inspect. A public employee is not liable for an injury caused by his issuance, denial, suspension or revocation of or by his failure or refusal to issue, deny, suspend or revoke, any permit, license, certificate, approval, order or similar authorization where he is authorized by enactment to determine whether or not such authorization should be issued, denied, suspended or revoked.

(f) Section 3-103. Adoption of a plan or design.

(a) A local public entity is not liable under this Article for an injury caused by the adoption of a plan or design of a construction of, or an improvement to public property where the plan or design has been approved in advance of the construction or improvement by the legislative body of such entity or by some other body or employee exercising discretionary authority to give such approval or where such plan or design is prepared in conformity with standards previously so approved. The local public entity is liable,

however, if after the execution of such plan or design it appears from its use that it has created a condition that it is not reasonably safe.

(b) A public employee is not liable under this Article for an injury caused by the adoption of a plan or design of a construction of, or an improvement to public property.

2. The aforementioned sections of the Tort Immunity Act immunize the Respondent and bar Complainant from recovery.

WHEREFORE, the Respondent, Lisle Park District, respectfully requests this Board enter judgment in its favor and against Complainant and for any and all other relief as this Board deems appropriate and just.

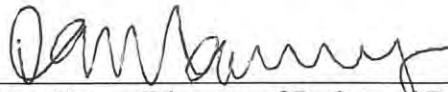
