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**AS 04-3**      In the Matter of: Petition by Hayden Wrecking Corporation for an Adjusted Standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 620.410(a) – The Board granted this St. Clair County petitioner an adjusted standard, with conditions, from Class I groundwater quality standards for arsenic, iron, lead, and manganese.      5-0

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**AS 05-1**      In the Matter of: Petition of SCA Tissue North America, L.L.C. for an Adjusted Standard from 35 Ill. Adm. Code 218.301 and 218.302(c) – The Board dismissed this petition for an adjusted standard for petitioner’s failure to timely publish notice of the filing of the petition by advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in the area likely to be affected, as required by Section 28.1 of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/28.1(d)(1) (2002)).      5-0

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## ADMINISTRATIVE CITATIONS

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**AC 04-84**      IEPA v. City of Salem, Roger Kinney, Dick Brown and Jason Bruce – In response to a joint stipulation and settlement agreement in this administrative citation action involving a Marion County facility, the Board found respondents violated Section 21(o)(5) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(o)(5) (2002)) and ordered respondent to pay a civil penalty of \$500. The Board also granted the parties’ joint motion to dismiss respondents’ petition for review and the alleged violation of 415 ILCS 21(o)(12) (2002).      5-0

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**AC 05-31**      IEPA v. Guiffre II, L.L.C. – The Board found that this Winnebago County respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2002)), and ordered respondent to pay a civil penalty of \$6,000, as these offense were subsequent to a previous finding of violation.      5-0

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**AC 05-35**      IEPA v. Knox County Landfill Committee and Greg Ingle – The Board found that these Knox County respondents violated Section 21(o)(5) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(o)(5) (2002)), and ordered respondents to pay a civil penalty of \$500.      5-0

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**AC 05-36**      County of Sangamon v. Leland Cole – The Board found that this Sangamon County respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(3) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(3) (2002)), and ordered respondent to pay a civil penalty of \$3,000.      5-0

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**AC 05-37**      City of Chicago Department of Environment v. AAA Dollar Disposal, Inc. – The Board found that this Cook County respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2002)), and ordered respondent to pay a civil penalty of \$3,000.      5-0

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**AC 05-39**      County of Macon, Illinois v. Richard Webb and Theresa Webb – The Board found that these Macon County respondents violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2002)), and ordered respondents to pay a civil penalty of \$3,000.      5-0

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**AC 05-40**      IEPA v. Northern Illinois Service Company – The Board directed respondent to file an amended petition for review accompanied by an attorney’s appearance and specifying the grounds for appeal within 30 days from the date of this order, or the Board will dismiss this matter.      5-0

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**AC 05-44**      IEPA v. Donald Eichen – The Board accepted an administrative citation against this Winnebago County respondent.
