## REQUEST FOR NINETY DAY EXTENSION OF APPEAL PERIOD

NOW COMES the Respondent, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA"), by one of its attorneys, John J. Kim, Assistant Counsel and Special Assistant Attorney General, and, pursuant to Section 40(a)(1) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1)) and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.208, hereby requests that the Illinois Pollution Control Board ("Board") grant an extension of the thirty-five (35) day period for petitioning for a hearing to November 3, 2004, or any other date not more than a total of one hundred twenty-five (125) days from the date of service of the Illinois EPA's final decision. In support thereof, the Illinois EPA respectfully states as follows:

- 1. On June 30, 2004, the Illinois EPA issued a final decision to the Petitioner. (Exhibit A)
- 2. On August 4, 2004, the Petitioner made a written request to the Illinois EPA for an extension of time by which to file a petition for review, asking the Illinois EPA join in requesting that the Board extend the thirty-five day period for filing a petition to ninety days. The Petitioner represented that the final decision was received no earlier than July 1, 2004. (Exhibit B)

3. The additional time requested by the parties may eliminate the need for a hearing in this matter or, in the alternative, allow the parties to identify issues and limit the scope of any hearing that may be necessary to resolve this matter.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated above, the parties request that the Board, in the interest of administrative and judicial economy, grant this request for a ninety-day extension of the thirty-five day period for petitioning for a hearing.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois PPA) has reviewed the High Priority Corrective Action Plan (plan) submitted for the above-referenced incident. This information, dated June 4, 2004, was received by the Illinois EPA on June 9, 2004. Citations in this letter are from the Environmental Protection Act (Act) and 35 Illinois Administrative Code (35 Ill. Adm. Code).

Pursuant to Section 57.7(c)(4)(D) of the Act and 35 III. Adm. Code 732.405(c), the plan is rejected for the following reason: It does not appear as though the proposed corrective action would sufficiently reduce the levels of contaminants in the groundwater to prevent further off-site migration.

Specifically, the proposed MPX system was operated onsite from August 30, 2000 to August 5, 2002 with the removal of 42,800 gallons of water and free product. However, the levels of benzene remaining in the groundwater appear to be unchanged from before implementation of the MPX system. In addition, with regard to the proposed Tier 2 TACO objectives, the offsite point of compliance should be the storm sewer which is within the calculated 44' distance to Tier 1 Class II groundwater cleanup objectives (35 IAC Part 620 Class II groundwater standards).

Illinois EPA believes that the most efficient method of remediation would be the excavation and disposal of the silty-sand layer at a depth of approximately 9' to 11', as well as any contaminated overburden and the removal of any groundwater encountered during this excavation effort. Map 3 of the subject submittal contains a diagram depicting the extent of soil contamination. Contaminated soils underlying this area, in particular the soils in the northern half and, to the extent practicable, the soils around the UST pit (the source of the contamination) should be removed.

Pursuant to Section 57.7(c)(4)(D) of the Act and 35 III. Adm. Code 732.405(c), the plan is rejected since the associated Corrective Action Plan was not approved. Please note that costs that have already been incurred may be resubmitted at this time.

Pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 732.401, the Illinois EPA requires submittal of a revised plan, and budget if applicable, within 90 days of the date of this letter to:

### Appeal Rights

An underground storage tank owner or operator may appeal this final decision to the Illinois Pollution Control Board pursuant to Sections 40 and 57.7(c)(4)(D) of the Act by filing a petition for a hearing within 35 days after the date of issuance of the final decision. However, the 35-day period may be extended for a period of time not to exceed % days by written notice from the owner or operator and the Illinois EPA within the initial 35-day appeal period. If the owner or operator wishes to receive a 90-day extension, a written request that includes a statement of the date the final decision was received, along with a copy of this decision, must be sent to the Illinois EPA as soon as possible.

Dear Mr. Kim:

On behalf of our client, The Premcor Refining Group Inc. ("Premcor"), pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1), we are requesting that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Agency") join Premcor in Premcor's request to extend the 35-day period for petitioning for an appeal of the Agency's final decision rejecting Premcor's High Priority Corrective Action Plan dated June 4, 2004. Premcor received the denial letter via certified mail no earlier than July 9, 2004. Thus, the deadline for filing an extension request with the Illinois Pollution Control Board is August 13, 2004.


