OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD:

This matter comes before the Board upon a one-count complaint filed March 29, 1995, by the Attorney General of the State of Illinois, on behalf of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the People of the State of Illinois, against C. P. Inorganics, Inc., n/k/a Phibro-Tech, Inc. (Phibro-Tech), a Delaware corporation located at Joliet Industrial Park, Building 15, 10 Industry Avenue, Joliet, Will County, Illinois. The complaint alleges that Phibro-Tech has violated Section 9(a) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act), 415 ILCS 5/9(a) and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 201.141 by causing or allowing the discharge or emission of fugitive ammonia vapors and odors into the environment.

Pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/31(a)(2), the parties filed a joint motion requesting relief from the Act's hearing requirement on March 24, 1995. The Board published a notice of the waiver on April 1, 1995; no objection to the granting of the waiver was received. Waiver of hearing is hereby granted.

The parties filed a Stipulation and Settlement Agreement on March 24, 1995. The Stipulation sets forth facts relating to the nature, operations and circumstances surrounding the claimed violations. Phibro-Tech denies the alleged violations and agrees to pay a civil penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00).

The Board finds the settlement agreement acceptable under 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.180. This settlement agreement in no way affects respondent's responsibility to comply with any federal, state or local regulations, including but not limited to the Act and the Board's pollution control regulations.

This opinion constitutes the Board's findings of fact and

conclusions of law in this matter.

ORDER

- 1) The Board hereby accepts the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement executed by the People of the State of Illinois and C. P. Inorganics, Inc., n/k/a Phibro-Tech, Inc., a Delaware corporation located at Joliet Industrial Park, Building 15, 10 Industry Avenue, Joliet, Will County, Illinois. The Stipulation and Settlement Agreement are incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 2) Phibro-Tech shall pay a civil penalty of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) within 30 days of the date of this Order. Such payment shall be made by certified check or money order payable to the Treasurer of the State of Illinois, designated to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund, and shall be sent by First Class mail to:

The certified check or money order shall clearly indicate on its face, Phibro-Tech's Federal Employer Identification Number 223060339 and that payment is directed to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund.


Any such penalty not paid within the time prescribed shall incur interest at the rate set forth in subsection (a) of Section 1003 of the Illinois Income Tax Act, (35 ILCS 5/1003), as now or hereafter amended, from the date payment is due until the date payment is received. Interest shall not accrue during the pendency of an appeal during which payment of the penalty has been stayed.

- 3) Phibro-Tech shall cease and desist from the alleged violations.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

Section 41 of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/41) provides for the appeal of final Board orders within 35 days of the date of service of this order. (See also 35 Ill. Adm. Code 101.246, Motion for Reconsideration.)
