Dear Ms. Tipsord:

It has come to my attention that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) has proposed substantive changes to the Illinois Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) regulations. It is apparent, however, that significant concerns are present within the IEPA's alternative proposal. As a Senator, I understand the need for conserving tax payer funds. However, I'm also concerned about the environment and the overall economic status of our state. As proposed, these regulations are not justifiable and will impact citizens in the following primary areas:

- Improperly Calculated Maximum Payment Amounts—It is unjust to enforce rate restrictions on the regulated community when the economic impact of said rate restrictions has not been properly evaluated. Additionally, it is not feasible to restrict owner or operator reimbursement based on improperly calculated rates.
- Property Value Reduction and Environmental Impact—By eliminating the reimbursement of costs associated with groundwater remediation for sites located within the influence of a groundwater ordinance, owners and operators will be forced to accommodate drastic reductions in property value or expend thousands of dollars in remediation costs above their state determined deductible. Furthermore, this reliance on groundwater use restrictions will only serve to degrade our groundwater quality and does not protect human health or the environment.

Therefore, I request that ruling on the proposed revisions to 734 and 732 LUST regulations be delayed until a more suitable solution can be developed.
