PROPOSED RULE.                      SECOND NOTICE.

ORDER OF THE BOARD (by R.C. Flemal):

This matter comes before the Board upon the mandate of Section 9.4(d) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and an attendant regulatory proposal filed by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Agency") on August 7, 1986. Merit hearings on the Agency's proposal were held in Springfield on December 8, 1986, and in Chicago on December 15, 1986. No members of the public attended either hearing.

First notice was proposed on January 22, 1987, and published at 11 Ill. Reg. 3434, February 20, 1987. No comments were received by the Board during the first notice comment period.

The details of this proposal were treated in the Board's first notice Opinion and Order, and accordingly will not be repeated here.

ORDER

The Board directs that second notice of the following proposed amendments be submitted to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules:

SUBPART B: DEFINITIONS

Section 211.122      Definitions

"Acid Gases": for the purposes of Ill. Rev. Stat. 1985, ch. 111 1/2, par. 1009.4, hydrogen chloride, hydrogen fluoride and hydrogen bromide, which exist as gases, liquid mist, or any combination thereof.

"Heavy Metals": for the purposes of Ill. Rev. Stat. 1985, ch. 111 1/2, par. 1009.4, elemental, ionic, or combined forms of arsenic, cadmium, mercury, chromium, nickel and lead.

"Organic Materials": for the purposes of Ill. Rev. Stat. 1985, ch. 111 1/2, par. 1009.4, any chemical compound of carbon including diluents and thinners which are liquids at standard conditions and which are used as solvers, viscosity reducers or cleaning agents, and polychlorinated dibenzo-p-dioxins, polychlorinated dibenzofurans and polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons shall be considered to be organic materials. Methane, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, carbonic acid, metallic carbonic acid, metallic carbide, metallic carbonates and ammonium carbonate shall not be considered to be organic materials for the purposes of Ill. Rev. Stat. 1985, ch. 111 1/2, par. 1009.4.
