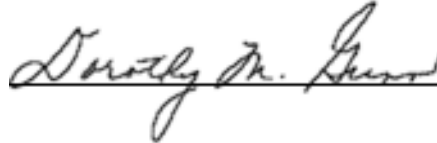
ORDER OF THE BOARD (by C.A. Manning):

On August 12, 2002, the Office of the Attorney General, on behalf of the People of the State of Illinois (People), filed a complaint against Riba-Fairfield, Inc. (Riba-Fairfield). *See* 415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2000); 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204. The People allege that Riba-Fairfield violated Section 21(p) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p) (2000), *as amended by* P.A. 92-0574, eff. June 26, 2002) and numerous provisions of the Board's hazardous waste regulations by storing hazardous waste without a permit granted by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The People further allege that Riba-Fairfield stored hazardous waste without a written waste analysis plan, and that Riba-Fairfield failed to conduct inspections, keep a written operating record, submit an annual report, have a written closure plan, and establish financial assurance for closure of the facility. The complaint concerns Riba-Fairfield's facility at 3210 Parkway Drive, Decatur, Macon County.

The Board accepts the complaint for hearing. *See* 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.212(c). A respondent's failure to file an answer to a complaint within 60 days after receiving the complaint may have severe consequences. Generally, if Riba-Fairfield fails within that timeframe to file an answer specifically denying, or asserting insufficient knowledge to form a belief of, a material allegation in the complaint, the Board will consider Riba-Fairfield to have admitted the allegation. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 103.204(d). The Board directs the hearing officer to proceed expeditiously to hearing.
