ORDER OF THE BOARD (by D. Anderson):

In response to comments, the proposal is hereby modified to read as appears below. Striking and underlining refer to the existing, codified versions of the Board's Water Pollution rules (R81-3, May 13, 1982; 6 Ill. Reg. 7818, July 2, 1982) and not to the first notice Order of October 8, 1981 (43 PCB 479; 5 Ill. Reg. 11,679, November 6, 1981). The Clerk is directed to prepare a second notice for the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules.

~~Section-302-209--Fecal-Coliform  
Based-on-a-minimum-of-five-samples-taken-over-not-more  
than-a-30-day-period, fecal coliforms (STORET number 31616)  
shall not exceed a geometric mean of 200 per 100 ml, nor  
shall more than 10% of the samples during any 30-day period  
exceed 400 per 100 ml.~~

~~Section-302-406--Fecal-Coliform  
Based-on-a-minimum-of-five-samples-taken-over-not-more  
than-a-30-day-period, fecal coliforms (STORET number 31616)  
shall not exceed a geometric mean of 1,000 per 100 ml, nor  
shall more than 10% of the samples during any 30-day period  
exceed 2,000 per 100 ml.~~

Section 304.121 Bacteria  
~~No effluent governed by this Part shall exceed 400 fecal  
coliform per 100 ml.~~  
No person shall cause or allow fecal coliform (STORET number  
31616) to exceed 400 per 100 ml in any effluent which discharges  
to the following locations:

- a) During the months of May through September,  
within 20 stream miles (statute miles) upstream  
of a public bathing beach licensed under the  
"Illinois Swimming Pool and Bathing Beach Act"  
(Ill. Rev. Stat. 1979, ch. 111 1/2, pars. 1201-  
1227).

- b) Within 20 stream miles (statute miles) upstream of a water intake used for public or food processing water supply;
- c) Any location where it may cause or contribute to violation of another state's water quality standards in interstate waters.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
