<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-7</u></a>	<u>People of the State of Illinois v. Westmont Citgo, Inc.</u> (Air – Enforcement) – In this enforcement action concerning a DuPage County gas station, the Board granted the People’s motion to deem facts admitted and for summary judgment against Westmont Citgo. The Board found that Westmont Citgo violated the statutory and regulatory provisions as alleged by the People. The Board also ordered Westmont Citgo to pay a \$10,000 civil penalty; decommission its vapor collection and control system; and submit a decommissioning checklist, a certification, and test results to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.	5-0 roll call vote
<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-38</u></a>	<u>People of the State of Illinois v. 159th and Crawford Business Inc. and 159th and Crawford Real Estate Inc.</u> (Air – Enforcement) – Upon receiving a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a Cook County gas station, the Board directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice.	5-0 roll call vote

<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-49</u></a>	<p><u>People of the State of Illinois v. Reid’s Service Center, Inc., Reid M. Larson Trust, Barbara S. Larson Trust, and Reid M. Larson, as Trustee of Reid M. Larson Trust (Land, Water – Enforcement)</u> – In this enforcement action concerning a Peoria County site, the Board granted relief from the hearing requirement of Section 31(c)(1) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/31(c)(1) (2020)), accepted a stipulation and proposed settlement, and ordered respondents to pay a \$12,000 civil penalty and to cease and desist from further violations.</p>	5-0 roll call vote
<a href="#"><u>PCB 22-60</u></a>	<p><u>People of the State of Illinois v. Caterpillar Inc. (Land, Water – Enforcement)</u> – Upon receiving a complaint, a stipulation, a proposed settlement, and an agreed motion for relief from the hearing requirement in this enforcement action involving a Livingston County manufacturing facility, the Board accepted the complaint and directed the Clerk to provide the required newspaper notice of the settlement-related filings.</p>	5-0 roll call vote


**OTHER ITEMS**
