

ORDINANCE 24-003 ANNUAL BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING THE FIRST DAY OF JULY, 2024 AND ENDING THE 30TH DAY OF JUNE, 2025

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees of the Centralia Regional Library District, of the Counties of Marion, Clinton Washington, and Jefferson, State of Illinois, has prepared or caused to be prepared a tentative form of the Annual Budget and Appropriation for said Public Library District for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025 and the same has been conveniently available for public inspection for at least thirty (30) days prior to final action thereon; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held as to such Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance on August 21, 2024 notice of which was given at least thirty (30) days prior thereto by publishing notice thereof in the Centralia Sentinel, a newspaper of general circulation in the Centralia Regional Library District.

WHEREAS, all other legal requirements have been duly complied with by the Board of Trustees of the Centralia Regional Library District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CENTRALIA REGIONAL LIBRARY DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTIES OF MARION, CLINTON, WASHINGTON, AND JEFFERSON AND STATE OF ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:
