## ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

## MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING June 14, 1972 - Suite 300, 309 West Washington Street, Chicago, Ill.

All Board Members except Mr. Aldrich were present.

The Board voted 4-0 granting the <u>City of Silvis</u>, PCB 72-141, a variance to permit the connection of 23 existing homes to sewers tributary to its sewage treatment plant and denying as to unoccupied lots. Decision in <u>Terminal Railroad Association of St. Louis</u>, PCB 72-169, was postponed until the next meeting.

In those cases for discussion, action was postponed in <u>City</u> of Rockford, PCB 72-115, since the City Council meeting report had not been received yet. After a presentation by the parties, the sewer ban imposed by the Board in its Order of May 26, 1971 (PCB 71-28) on the <u>Danville Sanitary District</u>, PCB 72-161, was lifted by a vote of 4-0, because the District has demonstrated "continued satisfactory operation" and compliance with the Board order.

A hearing was authorized in <u>Illinois Railroad Association</u> – Diesel Locomotive Exhaust, R 72-3, by a vote of 4-0.

Mr. Cosby of the Attorney General's office reported on the Appellate Court's action partially reversing the North Shore Sanitary District case, PCB 70-7, with respect to bonds. The Board postponed any action pending resolution of the Attorney General's motion for rehearing before that court and possible further appeal.

In <u>Will County Landfill</u>, PCB 72-13, the Board decided to take the Motion to Dismiss Third-Party Complaint with the case. No action was taken on the Motion for Modification in <u>City of Canton</u>, PCB 72-36, pending EPA recommendation. The Board voted 4-0 to consolidate the Motion for Reconsideration in <u>Richardson Company</u>, PCB 72-41, with the enforcement case, PCB 72-144, for hearing. The Motion to Dismiss in <u>Columbia Tool Steel Company</u>, PCB 72-142, will be taken with the case. <u>Processing and Books</u>, Inc., PCB 72-148, requested until June 26, 1972 to file their Reply to the Objections of Complainant to the Respondents' Motion to Dismiss, which extension of time the Board granted by a vote of 4-0, specifying that the hearing not be postponed in the interim. Minutes for May 23, 1972, were adopted by a vote of 4-0.

Hearings were authorized in the following new cases: Lockport <u>Trucking & Jack Carlstrom</u>, PCB 72-229; Mrs. Paul Harper v. Peter <u>Baker & Sons Company</u>, PCB 72-231; <u>Sanitary District of Beardstown</u>, PCB 72-232; and <u>M & S Wood Paper Company</u>, PCB 72-236. A hearing is mandatory in EPA v. C.M. Ford, PCB 72-230.

No action was taken pending EPA recommendation in <u>Chicago</u> <u>Regional Port District</u>, PCB 72-234, and <u>Imperial Smelting Corporation</u>, PCB 72-235. <u>Theodore Harris</u>, PCB 72-233, was dismissed as moot by a vote of 4-0.

The Board voted 4-0 to suspend meetings for an official vacation from July 3 to July 17.
