An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-66, Village of North Aurora, by a vote of 4-3. Messrs. J. Dumelle, B. Forcade and M. Nardulli dissented. (RF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-130, Village of Malta, by a vote of 4-3. Messrs. J. Dumelle, B. Forcade and M. Nardulli dissented. (RF)

In R86-14, Borden Chemicals, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

In R88-5(B), Procedural Rules, Parts 102 and 106, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

In R90-8, Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.102: Repeal of De Novo Hearings for Appeals of NPDES Permits, a Proposed Rule, First Notice Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 6-1. Board Member J. Anderson dissented. (BF)

(JM)

An Order directing the Agency to file before February 20, 1990, an appropriate affidavit in support of its motion to withdraw the complaint and dismiss the action in #AC 89-198, General Iron Industries, or the motion will be subject to automatic denial, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Petitioner's motion to modify a May 9, 1986 Board Order in #85-212, Village of Morton, was granted until September 30, 1992 by a vote of 7-0. Board Member J. Dumelle concurred. (RF)

The parties stipulation to dismiss the complaint in #88-173, Village of Kildeer, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JTM)

Complainant's motion for judgment by default in #89-61, Thomas J. Fredette, was denied by a vote of 6-1. Board Member J. Anderson dissented. (JM)

Petitioner's motion to appear before the Board pro hac vice for Michael E. Born in #89-89, Motor Wheel Corporation, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's agreed motion to dismiss in #89-96, Cerro Copper Products, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss in #89-133, Union Oil Company of California, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Agency motion for dismissal of the permit appeal in #89-189, The Jennison-Wright Corporation, was denied by a vote of 7-0. (BF)
