MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING December 15, 1983 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these matters by a vote of 7-0: ## 80-175, Unity Ventures; 82-122, Bi-Petro Chemical; 83-78, Illinois Central Gulf R.R.; 83-85 and 83-88-96, Browning-Ferris, Mr. Dumelle and Mr. Meyer concurred; 83-99, American Legion, Mr. Dumelle concurred; 83-146, Sauget; R83-39, UIC Amendments.

Motions for reconsideration in these cases were denied by a vote of 6-0, Mr. Marlin abstained: ## 79-26, Continental Grain; 79-167, Continental Grain. Mr. Dumelle will prepare the Orders.

An Order requesting more information was adopted in #82-100, Conoco, pursuant to a motion for substitution of Petitioner. The vote was 7-0, Mr. Dumelle will prepare the Order.

An Order dismissing all parties except the named complainant was adopted in the matter of #83-132, Carter v. Dunn. The vote was 7-0, Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Since an objection was filed, a hearing was aurhorized in #83-164, West Dundee.

Motion for extension of time in #83-157, Lamplighter, was ordered taken with the case.

The amended petition in #83-105, Ford Motor, was authorized for hearing.

A second amended petition was requested in #83-152, Mendota by a vote of 7-0, Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

A Final Opinion and Order was adopted in R83-24, Technical Amendments to RCRA, by a vote of 7-0. A Resolution and Order was adopted in R83-38, New Source Performance Standards, by a vote of 7-0.

In new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 7-0: ## 83-181, General Motors, held for an Agency recommendation; 83-182 - 224, Tax Certifications, acted on December 6, 1983; 83-225, Beardstown, held for an Agency recommendation; 83-226, People v. Archer -Daniels - Mildland, hearing mandatory; 83-227, EPA v. Russell Bliss et al; 83-228 - 229 and 230, St. Charles, Aurora and Kane County, consolidated for hearing, Order by Mrs. Anderson; 83-231, City of Pontiac v. EPA, hearing authorized; 83-232, Wood River v. EPA, Provisional variance, granted, Mr. Dumelle concurred, Mr. Nega will prepare an Opinion and Order.

These regulatory proposals were accepted for hearing and publication: R83-36, Ford Motor, petition to amend the Air Regulations and R83-37, Contingent Penalty, Procedural Rules Revisions.

A request, from Applied Biochemists, to amend the water regulations pertaining to Algicide was held until December 29, 1983 for possible consideration.

Minutes of the regular Board meeting held December 1, 1983 were approved as corrected by a vote of 7-0.

Bill Forcade announced that the Board will hold an open house on January 26, 1984.

All matters not disposed of as listed were ordered held for possible consideration on December 29, 1983.
