MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING
March 8, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board members were present save Mr. Marlin who was ill.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 6-0: #79-210, Sours Grain; 83-167, Watts Trucking.

#83-147, Lombard was held for decision at a special meeting set for March 14, 1984.

A second notice, Proposed Order was adopted in R80-22(B), Winnetka SO₂, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Forcade abstained.

A final Opinion and Order was adopted in R81-12, Sauget/E. St. Louis. by a vote of 6-0.

A final Opinion and Order was adopted in R81-20(B) Alternative Control Strategies, by a vote of 6-0.

A second Proposal Order, First Notice and Second Proposal Opinion were adopted in R81-25, Chlorinated Solvents, by a vote of 4-1. Mr. Forcade abstained and Mr. Meyer dissented.

A final Opinion and Order was adopted in R82-3, Alton Water, by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Forcade dissented.

Motion to set a briefing schedule in #82-101, Browning-Ferris was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

A motion to set briefing schedule in #83-28, Top Chop was referred to the Hearing Officer.

Motion to modify in #83-103, Centralia was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

In #83-105 and R83-36, Ford Motor, a motion to dismiss was denied by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an order.

A motion to correct an Order in #83-157, Lamplighter was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

In amended petitions, these actions were taken by a vote of 6-0: #83-161 and 83-169, Herrin held for Agency recommendations; 83-239, Ill. Steel, 83-240, Hansen and 84-12, DuPage Publishing, hearings were authorized and an Order adopted requesting submission of information. Mr. Forcade will prepare the Orders.

An Interim Order was adopted in #83-126, DuPage v. Mt. Calvary, ordering the matter to hearing. The vote was 6-0, Mr. Nega will prepare the Order.

The Board decided to hold a special meeting on March 14, 1984 to consider: #83-147, Lombard, Opinion and Order; 84-6, Monmouth, amended petition; 84-26, Outboard Marine, new case; and R84-5, Illinois Contingency Plan.
