MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING APRIL 19, 1984 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members Were Present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 6-0: ##83-65, Bob Evans; 83-100, Cilco; 83-105, Ford Motor (Interim Order); 83-124, Citizens Utilities.

A Final Order was adopted in R80-16, Galesburg Sanitary District, by a vote of 6-0.

A Final Opinion and Final Order were adopted in R80-22, (B), Winnetka SO2, by a vote of 5-0, Mr. Forcade abstained.

A Final Order of Dismissal was adopted in R82-20, Grain Handling, by a vote of 6-0.

Motion for extension of time to file settlement was granted in #81-132, Borden, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Nega will prepare an Order.

Motions to dismiss in #83-163, Bittle, were denied by a vote of 6-0. Mrs Anderson will prepare an Order.

In ##83-228,-229, and 230, Kane County, the Board decided to defer action on a motion for fees by a vote of 5-1, Mrs. Anderson dissented.

These matters were discussed and held to May 3, 1984 for futher discussion or possible decision: ##83-116,-117, Meyer Steel Drum; 83-118, Acme Barrel; 83-113, Van Leer Containers; 84-10, Orchard; R82-1, Particulate Emissions; R82-2, Nuclear Air Emissions.

In amended petitions these actions were taken by a vote of 6-0: ##83-172, Sycamore, hearing authorized and additional information requested, Order by Mr. Forcade; 84-17, Wyoming, hearing authorized and additional information requested, Order by Mr. Forcade; 84-27, German Valley, held for an Agency recommendation; 84-28, Meyer Steel Drum, hearing authorized.

Minutes of these Board Meetings were approved as amended by a vote of 6-0: March 8 and 21, 1984 and April 2, 5, and 16, 1984.

The Board decided to reschedule the regular meeting set for May 17. to May 18, 1984.

In new cases ##84-35 and 84-36, Stauffer Chemical, hearings were authorized. Motion to dismiss in #84-35 was denied by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Forcade dissented. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

In other new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 6-0: ##84-38,- 39, Cabot Corp., hearings authorized; 84-44, U.S. Industrial Chemical, hearing authorized; 48-45, Waste Management, hearing authorized; 84-47, Mattoon, and 84-48, Oregon, provisional variances granted, Opinions and Orders will be prepared by Mr. Nega; 84-49, Atwood, additional information requested, Order by Mr. Forcade.

In #84-46, Illinois Department of Transportation, City of Evanston, Mr. Dumelle was authorized to sign the Permit by a vote of 5-0, Mr. Meyer abstained. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

R84-11, New Source Performance Standards, a Resolution and order was adopted by a vote of 6-0.
