MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING
June 14, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these matters by a vote of 6-0: ##83-2, Chemetco, Mr. Dumelle concurred; 84-19, Midwest Solvents.

By a vote of 5-1, the Board repealed the emergency rule in R84-1, Permit and Inspection Fees. Mr. Forcade dissented, Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

A Proposed Rule, First Notice, Proposed Opinion and Order was adopted in R84-10, RCRA Procedural Rules, was adopted by a vote of 6-0.

Motion to dismiss was granted in #81-147, Sauget, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Request for oral argument in #83-22, Standard Scrap, was denied by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Meyer will prepare an Order.

Motion for rehearing and for oral argument was denied, and motion to file Response Instanter in #83-124, Citizens Utilities, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Marlin will prepare an Order.

Motion to extend time in #83-166, Mobil Chemical, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

No action will be taken by the Board on a petition to require filing of Record in #83-173, Industrial Salvage.

Joint motion to dismiss was granted in 84-34, Illinois Power, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for leave to file Agency Instanter and Record was granted in #84-55, Illinois Power, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.

Motion to dismiss was denied in #84-56, Taracorp, by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

An Adopted Rule, Final Order, was adopted in R82-14, RACT III, Agricultural Products, by a vote of 6-0.

A docket was opened for filing purposes only in R84-23, Insta-Foam, Petition to delist. The vote was 6-0, Mr. Dumelle will prepare an Order.
