MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING
August 22, 1984 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

Opinions and Orders were adopted in these cases by a vote of 6-0: ##81-18, Caterpillar; 81-151, Dean Foods, Mr. Dumelle concurred; 83-56, Alco Gravure, Mr. Forcade concurred; 83-166, Mobil Chemical; 83-227, Bliss; 84-17, City of Wyoming; 84-35, Stauffer Chemical; 84-36, Stauffer Chemical; 84-50, Engineered Coated Products.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #84-52, City of Herrin, by a vote of 5-1. Mr. Meyer dissented.

An Order was adopted in #84-35, Stauffer Chemical, by a vote of 6-0.

A Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Third Proposed Opinion, and a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Third Proposed Order was adopted in R81-25, Chlorinated Solvents, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Forcade abstained.

A Proposed Rule, Proposed Opinion was adopted in R82-14, RACT III, by a vote of 4-2. Mr. Nega and Mr. Dumelle dissented.

Joint motion for modification was granted and the motion to require parties to file status reports in lieu of hearing was denied in #79-145, Celotex, by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for extension of time in #81-138, Hereley Grain, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for extension of time in #83-104, Cupp, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Dumelle concurred. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for reconsideration and modification in #83-164, Village of West Dundee, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for leave to file addendum to the record was denied and the hearing officer's ruling of August 20 was overruled by the Board in #84-45, -61, -68, Waste Management, by a vote of 6-0. Mrs. Anderson will prepare an Order.

Motion to defer decision in #84-66, Union Oil Company of California, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion for extension of time in #84-82, Reilly Tar and Chemical Corporation, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.

Motion to extend time to respond to motion to dismiss in #84-93, People v. J. William Carlson, was granted by a vote of 6-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.
