Marlin was withdrawn, the Agency's motion to file a motion to dismiss instanter was granted, and a hearing was authorized. The vote was 7-0. (JA)

Petitioner's motion for leave to identify additional materials to be incorporated from PCB 91-7 and Will County's petition for leave to intervene, were granted in #92-25, Land and Lakes Company, by a vote of 5-2. J. Anderson and J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (BF)

In amended Adjusted Standard Petition #91-3, Petition of Peoria Disposal Company, these actions were taken by a vote of 7-0: Petitioner's March 2, 1992 letter accompanying the claimed trade secret materials construed as a waiver of the deadline for a Board determination on the claimed trade secrets, Envirite Corporation's request for public hearing and Petitioner's waiver of hearing were rendered moot pursuant to Section 106.415 of the Board's adjusted standard procedures which state that "the Board will hold at least one public hearing prior to granting an adjusted standard" from a state RCRA rule, and the hearing officer was directed to proceed to confer with the parties and arrange a date for public hearing consistent with the Board's resource constraints, Order by M. Nardulli.

Minutes of the February 27, 1992 Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 7-0.
