MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING MARCH 20, 1997 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS - 10:30 A.M.

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed members of the public and staff to the meeting. Thereafter, the Clerk was asked for a roll call, and all Board Members answered present.

In R97-15(A&B), Livestock Waste Regulations, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 506, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 4-3. Board Members R.C. Flemal, G. Tanner Girard, and J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (CAM)

In R97-14, Emergency Rulemaking: Livestock Waste Regulations 35 Ill. Adm. Code 505, an Adopted Emergency Rule Extension, Supplemental Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (GTG)(CAM)(RCF)

Minutes of the March 6, 1997 Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 7-0.

An Order granting the petitioner's motion to dismiss, was adopted in R95-15, Petition of Marathon Oil Company Site Specific Regulation: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 216, Subpart N, by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

An Opinion and Order accepting the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement in the amount of \$16,000.00, was adopted in #96-131, People of the State of Illinois v. Fenton Press, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #96-194, The D.B. Hess Company, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (McF)




