## MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 29, 1988 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Pursuant to notice given the meeting was held on this date instead of December 1, 1988.

All Board Members were present.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #85-213, Village of Western Springs CSO, by a vote of 6-0. J. Anderson abstained. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #87-208, Federal Paper Board, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #88-113, City of Springfield, by a vote of 7-0. Messrs. J. Dumelle and M. Nardulli concurred. (RF)

In R87-18, Midwest Grain Site-Specific, an Adopted Rule, Final Order, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Orders were adopted in these Administrative Citations by a vote of 7-0: ##88-88, Steve Zimmerman and Waste Limited; 88-89, Kinetic Energy Development Corporation.

By a vote of 7-0, the parties in ##84-45, -61, -68, Waste Management, were ordered to submit informational filings by December 12, 1988. (JA)

In #85-203, City of Farmington, Respondent's motion for leave to file Brief Instanter was granted and the Petitioner was ordered to submit its brief no later than December 9, 1988 or the Board will review and consider appropriate sanctions, including dismissal of the proceeding with prejudice. The vote was 7-0. (JD)

Motion to voluntarily dismiss with prejudice was granted in #86-44, Continental Grain, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Respondent's motion for extension of time to file its report in #86-161, Elizabeth Street Foundry, was granted until November 30, 1988 by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Petitioner's motion for an extension of its variance was granted through June 30, 1989 in #86-174, IBP, by a vote of 6-1. B. Forcade dissented. (JM)

An agreed motion to dismiss was granted in #86-188, City of Springfield, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Motion to modify an April 1, 1987 Board Order was granted in

#86-207, Village of Lemont, by a vote of 6-1. B. Forcade dissented. (JTM)

By a vote of 7-0, Petitioner's motions to supplement the record and to correct its response to the Agency Recommendation were granted and Petitioner's Brief and attachment was construed by the Board as an amendment to the petition in #88-84, The NutraSweet Company. (JM)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw its appeal in #88-92, Waste Management, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

Motion to consolidate was denied in #88-136, Trojan Corporation, by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, Petitioner's motion to extend the deadline for filing its brief in #88-139, John Sexton Contractors, was denied and the Hearing Officer was given leave to extend the briefing schedule requested by the Petitioner and the Agency if the Petitioner files a waiver of the Board's decision due date at least to and including January 19, 1989. (JA)

In #88-156, Trojan Corporation, the Board vacated its Order of October 20, 1988 and requested additional information by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

By a vote of 7-0, a hearing was authorized and the Petitioner was ordered to address at hearing enumerated deficiencies noted by the Board in Petitioner's petition for variance in #88-168, The Ensign-Bickford Company. (MN)

An Order was adopted pursuant to an emergency motion to cancel hearing in #88-102, Morton Thiokol, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)
