CONCURRING OPINION (by Mr. Dumelle):

My reason for concurring in this case is that the record does not explain why alternative techniques such as electroshocking or seining are not viable. All that is present is a conclusion that they are not.

Wherever possible, the introduction of chemicals to a body of water which connects to a public water supply ought to be avoided. Research may not have been done on all possible synergistic effects and at some future date we may wish that non-chemical means of counting fish had been used.
