ORDER OF THE BOARD (by R. Flemal):

By Order of March 5, 1987, the Board affirmed the Agency's February 28, 1986 denial of Well's December 5, 1985 application for renewal of its air operating permit. Wells sought review of the Board's Order in the First District Appellate Court. On March 9, 1990 the Court issued its ruling which reversed the Board's decision and remanded the case for further proceedings. Wells Manufacturing Company v. IEPA, 522 N.E.2d 1074 (1990).

Among other things, the Court found that:


 a standard procedure for processing
 operating permit renewal applications,
 such as that used by the Agency in
 issuing or denying an initial operating
 permit, is lacking. 522 N.E. at 1078.

The Court's mandate issued June 7, 1990.

Consistent with the Court's remand, the parties are directed to file a statement, to be received in the Board's Offices on or before August 3, 1990, indicating their views as to how this matter should best proceed, including addressing whether they believe additional briefing or hearing is required in this matter.
