OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by Mr. Dumelle):

On November 8, 1973, Petitioner filed a Variance
Petition from Rule 3-3.111 of the Rules and Regulations
Governing the Control of Air Pollution and Rule 203(a) of
the Air Pollution Regulations. Petitioner seeks these
variances until February 28, 1974. The Agency filed a
recommendation to grant the variance on January 29, 1974.

Petitioner has installed an emission control system
to eliminate particulate matter, which was designed by
Combustion Engineering Associates, Inc. (CEA). A design
error by CEA, necessitates the replacement of a large motor
and modification of a portion of the baghouse filter system.
The Board finds that this delay was not caused by Petitioner
and will result in limited particulate emissions. The
control system is currently operable and will achieve a
99.9% reduction in particulate emissions once the corrections
are made.

The above consists of the Board's findings of fact and
conclusions of law.

The Board hereby grants Petitioner a variance from
Rules 3-3.111 and 203(a) until February 28, 1974.
