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RULEMAKING UPDATE

BOARD PROPOSES UST UPDATE, R91-14

On January 9 and 23, 1992, in R91-14, the Board proposed amendments to the UST underground storage tank rules. The UST program regulates petroleum and hazardous substances in underground storage tanks. It is mandated by Section 7.2 and 22.4(d) of the Act. It is contained in 35 III. Adm. Code 731, which reflects USEPA regulations in 40 CFR 280. The Board adopted a Proposed Opinion and Order on January 9, 1992, and modified that proposed Opinion and Order on January 23, 1992.

This Update covers USEPA regulations appearing in the Federal Register between January 1 and June 30, 1991. However, there were no USEPA actions which required amendment of Board rules during that period. Instead, this Docket focuses on changes to the Board's statutory authority due to P.A. 87-323.

The Proposed Opinion and Order of January 9, 1992, focuses on the reduction in the scope of the Board's UST rules, which are now to govern only corrective action. The Order of January 23, 1992, focuses on certain heating oil tanks, which are now to be included in the Board's remaining UST rules. The two Orders will be combined for publication in the Illinois Register in the near future.

BOARD PROPOSES RCRA UPDATE, R91-13

On December 19, 1991, the Board proposed to Update the RCRA hazardous waste rules in R91-13. The RCRA hazardous waste program regulates the generation, transportation, treatment, storage and disposal of hazardous waste. Sections 7.2 and 22.4(a) of the Act requires the Board to adopt regulations which are "identical in substance" to USEPA regulations. The Board's RCRA regulations are in 35 III. Adm. Code 702 through 705, and 720 through 728. These are derived from USEPA regulations at 40 CFR 260 through 270.

R91-13 updates the Board's RCRA rules to include USEPA actions during the period January 1 through June 30, 1991. These actions include: the USEPA corrections to the "third third" land disposal bans adopted in R90-11 and the boiler and industrial furnace ("BIF") rules.

The Proposal appeared in the Illinois Register on January 17, 1992. The Board will receive public comment through March 2, 1992.

BOARD EXTENDS RCRA WOOD PRESERVING COMPLIANCE DATES, R91-26

On January 9, 1992, the Board adopted a final Opinion and Order in R91-26, extending certain compliance dates for wood preservers under the RCRA rules.

On August 8, 1991, in R91-1, the Board adopted USEPA RCRA rules applicable to wood preservers.

Encompassed within R91-1 was a USEPA "administrative stay" of certain requirements. To qualify for the stay, wood preservers had to make certain filings, and complete surface coating of drip pads by February 6, 1992. However, since the coating required temperatures in excess of 70 degrees Fahrenheit, the compliance schedule was impossible to meet in Illinois. The Board therefore opened this Docket to extend the schedule out to July 1, 1992.

BOARD ADOPTS NEW UST APPEAL PROCEDURE

On January 23, 1992, in Ideal Heating Co. v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, PCB 91-253, the Board adopted a new procedure for appeals from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's (IEPA) decisions regarding access to the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Fund. (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 111 1/2, Under the Board's holding, UST par. 1022.18b.) determinations are appealable to the Board only after the IEPA has made a complete determination of eligibility, the deductible amount and reimbursement of costs. However, the Agency need not reach the remaining issues where it denies eligibility and an applicant may still appeal the denial of eligibility to the Board. The Board's holding does not apply to those appeals which have already proceeded to hearing. Beer Motors Co. v. Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, PCB 91-120 (January 23, 1992).

PCB 85-212 Joint Petition of the Village of Morton and the IEPA for Exception to Combined Sewer Overflow Regulations - The Board granted a motion to modify a Board Order for Morton's Tazewell County facility.

PCB 86-4 <u>City of Morris v. IEPA</u> - The Board granted a motion to modify an April 17, 1988 Board Order for Morris' Grundy County facility.

PCB 90-136 Walter J. Maquet and Marlene J. Maquet, d/b/a Maquet's 66 v. IEPA - The Board granted a motion for reconsideration filed by IEPA and affirmed its December 6, 1991 decision for Maquet's Tazewell County facility.

PCB 91-120 <u>Beer Motors, Inc. v. IEPA</u> - The Board reversed and remanded an Agency decision imposing a \$50,000 deductible for Beer's Cook County facility.

PCB 91-121 <u>Village of Channahon v. IEPA</u> - The Board granted a variance with conditions from its water regulations, for Channahon's Will County facility.

PCB 91-215 <u>Land and Lakes Co. v. IEPA</u> - The Board granted the Agency's motion to dismiss Land and Lakes petition for variance from the landfill regulations for its Will County facility.

PCB 91-216 Land and Lakes Co. v. IEPA - The Board granted the Agency's motion to dismiss Land and Lakes petition for variance from the landfill regulations for its Cook County facility.

PCB 91-217 <u>Land and Lakes Co. v. IEPA</u> - The Board granted the Agency's motion to dismiss Land and Lakes petition for variance from the landfill regulations for its Cook County facility.

PCB 91-218 Land and Lakes Co. v. IEPA - The Board granted the Agency's motion to dismiss Land and Lakes petition for variance from the landfill regulations for its Cook County facility.

PCB 91-242 <u>Arthur J. Ferrari v. IEPA</u> - The Board granted the Agency's motion to dismiss this appeal as untimely filed.

PCB 91-253 Ideal Heating Company v. IEPA - The Board held that the Agency UST decisions on eligibility

and deductibility without a determination on the reimbursibility of costs from the Underground Storage Tank Fund, for Ideal's DuPage County facility is not an appealable order.

AC 89-215 <u>IEPA v. Omer Thomas</u> - The Board found Omer Thomas violated Section 21(q)(1) of the act at his Shelby County facility. Penalty of \$500 is payable to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund.

AC 91-50 Logan County Health Dept. v. Lincoln/Logan Landfill, Inc. - The Board found Lincoln/Logan Landfill violated Sections 21(p)(5), 21(p)(11), 21(p)(12) and 21(p)(9) of the Act in its Logan County Facility. Penalty of \$2,000 is payable to the Logan County Health Department.

AC 91-51 <u>St. Clair County v. Ronald Lane,</u> Registered Agent, Illinois Central Railroad - The Board found Ronald Lane violated Section 21(q)(1) of the Act in his St. Clair County facility. Penalty of \$500 is payable to the Landfill Citation Fund.

AC 91-52 St. Clair County v. Robert Cradock, Mid-America Marble and Granite Natural Stone Corp. -The Board found Robert Cradock violated Section 21(q)(1) of the Act in his St. Clair County facility. Penalty of \$500 is payable to the Landfill Citation Fund.

AC 91-53 IEPA v. Clara L. Franklin - The Board found Clara Franklin violated Section 21(q)(1), 21(q)(3) and 21(q)(4) of the Act in her Jersey County facility. Penalty of \$1,500 is payable to the Environmental Protection Trust Fund.

R91-5 In the Matter of: Pretreatment Update (6/29/90-12/31/90) - This matter was adopted as a final rule pursuant to Section 13.3 of the Environmental Protection Act.

R91-19 In the Matter of: Potentially Infectious Medical Wastes: Etiologic Agents - This matter was adopted as a final rule pursuant to P.A. 87-752.
