OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (BY MR. CURRIE):

Mrs. Snetsinger seeks to burn diseased elm trees. As in many similar cases (e.g., City of Winchester v. EPA, #70-37, February 8, 1971), we find that the need to halt the spread of disease warrants burning, subject to appropriate conditions.

Mrs. Helen N. Snetsinger is hereby granted permission to burn diseased trees or any elm wood on her property in Lake Zurich within 90 days of this Order, subject to the following conditions:

1. Burning shall be done between the hours of 11:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. on a day when the wind is between 5 and 20 miles per hour and from the northeast, and the sky is not overcast. The burning shall be accomplished in as short a time as possible.
2. The burning shall be supervised by the local fire department.
3. No fuel of lesser quality than No. 2 fuel oil shall be used to promote combustion.
