

Public Hearing - Tuesday, November 6th, 9:00 a.m.

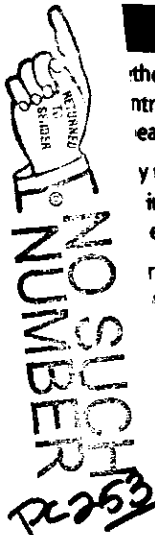

- The appeal by the Illinois Pollution Control Board is not a new expansion of the existing facility.
- PDC's claim that the expansion is necessary for the health and safety of the community is not supported by the facts.
- PDC's attempt to regulate the facility has already failed.



Talking Points

Whether or not the PDC proposal to the Illinois EPA is approved, the expansion of the hazardous waste facility. Public comments need to address health and safety concerns.

The same expansion proposal voted down in May 2006 — a vertical expansion over the existing facility.

The PDC's proposal for waste flies in the face of common sense. It is a waste of money and resources to build a waste transfer station when a garbage truck that compacts waste is available.

The PDC's attempt to circumvent local authority to regulate hazardous waste landfills. The Peoria County Board has already rejected the PDC's original design and the Illinois Pollution Control Board's denial of that vote in June 2007.

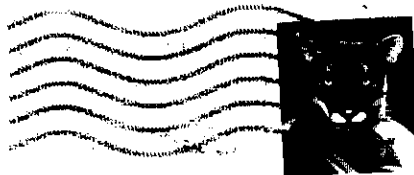
