There has been no independent testing of the new treatment process PDC claims is safe. Their own testing occurred only in December 2007 and February 2008, yet this waste could be in our local landfills, including ones over the Mahomet Aquifer, forever. I am concerned about dioxins, furans, mercury, and other heavy metals leaching from this waste.
