Letter from the Chairman

During May, there was significant activity in several Board rulemaking dockets, which I've summarized below. As always, information about these proceedings is available through the Clerk's Office Online (COOL) at our Web site at www.ipcb.state.il.us.

On May 3, 2011, the hearing officer scheduled two hearings in R11-18, <u>Triennial</u> <u>Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron, Fluoride and Manganese:</u> <u>Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312</u>. The first will take place on June 21, 2011, in Springfield, and the second will take place on July 26, 2011, in Chicago.

On May 5, 2011, the Board accepted for hearing R11-25, <u>Setback Zone for Fayette</u> <u>Water Company Community Water Supply: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 618.</u> The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) proposed to create maximum setback zones for six wells owned by Fayette Water Company serving about 6500



customers in three counties in central Illinois. A hearing on the proposal will take place July 27, 2011, in Vandalia.

On May 10, 2011, the Board held the first hearing in R11-22, <u>Amendments Under P.A. 96-908 to Regulations of</u> <u>Underground Storage Tanks (UST) and Petroleum Leaking UST: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 731, 732, and 734</u>. The second hearing will take place on June 16, 2011, in Chicago.

On May 16-18, 2011, the Board held three days of hearings in R08-9(C), <u>Water Quality Standards and Effluent</u> <u>Limitations for the Chicago Area Waterway System (CAWS) and the Lower Des Plaines River: Proposed</u> <u>Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 301, 302, 303 and 304</u>.

On May 18, 2011, the Board held the second hearing in the "fast-track" rulemaking R11-23, <u>Reasonably Available</u> <u>Control Technology (RACT) for Volatile Organic Material Emissions From Group II and Group IV Consumer &</u> <u>Commercial Products: Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 211, 218, and 219</u>. In response to an IEPA request, the Board on May 20, 2011, cancelled the third hearing in this proceeding.

On May 19, 2011, the Board adopted a first-notice opinion and order in R11-8, <u>Regulatory Proposal for NOx</u> <u>Trading Program Sunset Provisions for Non-Electric Generation Units ("Non-EGU."): Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm.</u> <u>Code Part 217. Subpart U</u>. This IEPA proposal was filed to "sunset" the trading provisions of the Nitrogen Oxide Trading Program for non-electric generating units.

On May 19, 2011, the Board denied a motion for adoption of emergency rules in R11-26 <u>Illinois Environmental</u> <u>Regulatory Group's Emergency Rulemaking, Nitrogen Oxides Emissions: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part</u> <u>217.</u> On its own motion, however, the Board consolidated this rulemaking with an open docket involving the same subject matter, R11-24 <u>Nitrogen Oxides Emissions, Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 217</u>. Hearings in the consolidated docket will take place on June 2 and 28, 2011.

On May 24, 2011, the Board held the second hearing in R11-9, <u>Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives</u> (TACO) (Indoor Inhalation): Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 742.

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Rulemaking Update

Board to Hold Hearing on IEPA Proposal to Establish a Setback Zone for Several Community Water Supply Wells Owned by Fayette Water Company, R11-25

On May 5, 2011, the Board accepted for hearing a rulemaking proposal to establish a maximum setback zone for six community water supply (CWS) wells owned by Fayette Water Company in Fayette County. The wells are situated in the Kaskaskia River flood plain and serve portions of Fayette, Shelby, and Kaskaskia Counties. The proposal was filed by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) on April 21, 2011, and is docketed as <u>In the Matter</u> of: Setback Zone for Fayette Water Company Community Water Supply: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 618, R11-25.

The IEPA is proposing a maximum circular setback zone of 1,000 feet. The IEPA states that it "considers these wells to be geologically sensitive and concluded that all the water system's wells are highly vulnerable to contamination." The IEPA states the regulation is intended to prevent contamination of the groundwater.

Hearing will be held at 9:00 am on July 27, 2011, at Fayette County Courthouse, Conference Room 212, 221 S. 7th Street, Vandalia, IL. Interested persons should review the hearing officer order of May 5, 2011 establishing schedules for the prefiling of testimony and discussion other procedural details.

Board Adopts First-Notice Opinion and Order for IEPA Rulemaking Proposal that Would Amend Provisions of the NOx SIP Call Trading Program, R 11-08

On May 19, 2011, the Board adopted for first-notice publication in the *Illinois Register* a proposal amending the Board's air rules. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA), on August 19, 2010, filed the proposal that was docketed as <u>In the Matter of: NOx Trading Program Sunset Provisions for Non-Electric Generating Units:</u> <u>Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Party 217.Subpart U,R11-08</u>.

The IEPA's proposal would sunset the trading provisions of the Nitrogen Oxide SIP Call Trading Program (NOx Trading Program) for non-electric generating units (non-EGUs). The provisions to be amended involve the holding and trading provisions for NOx allowances in Part 217.Subpart U. Due to a federal court ruling concerning the federal Clean Air Act Interstate Rules (CAIR) rules in *North Carolina* v. *USEPA*, 550 F.3d 1176 (C.A.D.C. Cir. 2008), CAIR implementation begins with the original 2009 control period. As a result of the court action, IEPA explains that Non-Electric Generating Units (EGUs) in Illinois no longer need to comply with the NOx Trading Program requirements for holding and trading NOx allowances for any control period after 2008 because UEPA no

longer allocates allowances for the NOx Trading Program. Therefore, Subpart U is now moot where it requires that Non-EGUs hold their allowances for the 2010 season.

Fifty-two existing non-EGU units (four of which are no longer operating), and two new non-EGU units are currently subject to the NOx Trading Program. The affected units will not be subject to the holding and trading provisions of the NOx Trading Program if the Board sunsets these provisions of Subpart U as proposed. However, to ensure that Illinois continues to satisfy its NOx budget, Non-EGUs must continue monitoring, reporting, and recordkeeping under Subpart U.

The Board has already conducted two hearings in this matter: one in Springfield (February 17, 2011) (December 9, 2010) and one in Chicago (December 9, 2010). Consequently, the Board does not presently intend to hold additional hearings.

Publication of these proposed amendments in the *Illinois Register* will begin a 45-day public comment period, during which anyone may file a public comment with the Board. The Board encourages persons to file public comments on these proposed amendments. The docket number for this rulemaking, R11-8, should be indicated on the public comment.

Board Denies IERG Request for Emergency Rulemaking in <u>Nitrogen Oxides Emissions Amendments to 35</u> Ill. Adm. Code Part 217, and Consolidates IERG Proposal with Pending IEPA Proposal, R11-26

On May 19, 2011, the Illinois Pollution Control Board denied the April 21, 2011 request by the Illinois Environmental Regulatory Group (IERG) for emergency rule, docketed as Illinois Environmental Regulatory Group's Emergency Rulemaking, Nitrogen Oxides Emissions: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 217, R11-26. IERG requested a3 year extension of compliance dates of nitrogen oxide (NOx) emissions rules adopted in R08-19 and codified at 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 217.

The Board on its own motion consolidated the R11-26 request with <u>In the Matter of: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm.</u> <u>Code 217, Nitrogen Oxides Emissions</u>, R11-24. This proposal involves the exact same subject matter, proposed by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). First notice of the R11-24 proposal has already been published in the *Illinois Register. See* 35 Ill. Reg. 6770 (Apr. 22, 2011). Hearings have been set for : June 2, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. at the James R. Thompson Center, Room 9-040, 100 West Randolph St, Chicago and June 28, 2011 at 1:00 pm at the Madison County Administration Building, County Board Room # 203, 157 N. Main Street, Edwardsville, IL. At the conclusion of those hearings and a short post-hearing comment period, the Board will continue to proceed with both rulemakings as swiftly as possible. Persons interested in participating at the hearings should review the hearing officer order of April 18, 2011 establishing schedules for the prefiling of testimony and discussion other procedural details.


