- MS. CROWLEY: Good morning. As you
- 2 know, my name is Kathleen Crowley and I'm the
- 3 assigned Hearing Officer in this proceeding. This
- 4 is the second of two presently scheduled hearings
- being conducted by the Illinois Pollution Control
- 6 Board In The Matter of: Amendments to 35 Illinois
- 7 Administrative Code Part 229:
- 8 Hospital/Medical/Infectious Waste Incinerators.
- 9 Docket R11-20. At today's hearing, the Board will
- conclude its receipt of testimony on the merits
- and economic effect of the Illinois Environmental
- Protection Agency's December 23rd regulatory
- 13 proposal.
- The proposed rules basically
- tighten up Illinois' rules to be consistent with
- US EPA rules. Seated to my immediate left is
- 17 Carrie Zalewski, who is the Board Member
- coordinating this proceeding. Seated to my
- immediate right is Alisa Liu, an environmental
- scientist with the Board. Looking at the room in
- 21 addition to the three of us from the Board there
- 22 are four persons that I know who are associated
- with the parties. So we'll just eliminate some of
- the usual opening statements and I'll ask everyone

- here to introduce themselves for the record
- starting with Mr. Matoesian.
- MR. MATOESIAN: Thank you. I'm
- 4 Charles Matoesian and I'm appearing for the
- 5 Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and with
- 6 me I have Mr. Dixon Nwaji, who is the
- 7 environmental protection engineer and can answer
- 8 any questions the Board has.
- 9 MS. CROWLEY: And we'll remind you
- you were placed under oath.
- MR. GABEY: Rick Gabey, regional
- operation's director for Stericycle.
- MS. HOBOY: Selin Hoboy, vice
- 14 president legislative and regulatory affairs
- 15 Stericycle.
- MS. CROWLEY: Great. As always,
- there are a couple of things we need to get put on
- the record. We conducted the first hearing on
- June 8th. To streamline hearings, I issued
- Hearing Officer orders on February 1st, May 23rd
- 21 and June 3rd. The orders asked persons to
- pre-file testimony and to answer questions
- developed by the Board's staff. The only two
- entities who provided testimony have been the

- 1 Agency and Stericycle. The Agency and Stericycle
- 2 presented testimony and addressed questions at the
- ³ first hearing. The transcript of that hearing was
- filed on June 9th, 2011, and entered into the
- 5 Board's electronic docketing system.
- Additionally, the Agency agreed
- ⁷ to answer some questions in writing. On June
- 8 13th, the Agency electronically filed a document
- 9 entitled Illinois EPA Answers and Second Errata to
- Questions Regarding Hospital/Medical/Infectious
- Waste Incinerators. Consistent with what we did
- at the first hearing, I'm going to mark and enter
- a copy of that document as Exhibit 7.
- 14 Also, I would like to note for
- the record that we very much appreciated the fact
- that the folks from the Agency made this filing
- early in the day so that we had additional time to
- work with it and to put together a quality
- document for review by the Board before its June
- 20 16th Board meeting.
- On June 16th, the Board adopted
- its first notice opinion and order. The order
- included the text of the Agency's proposal as
- amended by the Agency and its May 25th and June

- 1 13th, 2011, errata sheets and contains the
- 2 compliance dates agreed to by Stericycle at its
- ³ first hearing. Publication of the first notice
- 4 proposal should occur soon. We're currently
- 5 expecting that will happen July 1st unless we get
- 6 pushed back in the publishing queue for whatever
- 7 reason. We haven't received any pre-filed
- 8 testimony for today's hearing so we'll allow first
- 9 the Agency and then Stericycle to say anything
- else you may wish the Board to take into
- consideration on the merits of the proposal, the
- economic effects or anything else. Mr. Matoesian?
- MR. MATOESIAN: The only -- I have
- 14 nothing except we were going to go when we get
- back to the office check out a cross site on one
- of the pages where there might be an error. We're
- not sure and they pointed it out, but it's so long
- that we're going to have to look at it in depth at
- home or the office. So we'll submit a written
- errata three if it's necessary.
- MS. HOBOY: This is Selin Hoboy for
- the record. The reference that he is talking
- about is on page 42 of the opinion by the Board
- and the exception leads us to have to test by

- January 1st, 2014, as opposed to the way the
- section reads. So that we would be testing and
- everything would be complete by October 4th of
- 4 2014. So it's just -- I think it's just a
- 5 typographical error quite honestly.
- 6 MR. MATOESIAN: You're referring to
- 7 115(a)2(b)5?
- MS. HOBOY: Yeah.
- 9 MS. CROWLEY: We can go off the
- 10 record for a minute if you guys want to look at
- ¹¹ it.
- 12 (Whereupon, a discussion was had
- off the record.)
- MS. CROWLEY: Back on the record.
- There is no one else here and so if no one else
- has any comments they want to make we'll go to the
- ever poplar what happens next part of this.
- MS. HOBOY: I just have one
- additional comment for the record. Exhibit 7 that
- was submitted on June 13th from the Illinois EPA
- on page 10 where they have the draft schedule for
- review and recurrence I just want to make sure
- that we're on the record to state that Illinois
- 24 Code 229.115(b)2(A) submit CAAPP application to

- the Agency on or before January 1, 2013, that was
- just a typo I think and it is correct in the
- Board's opinion. It should read 2012 and it does
- 4 read 2012 in the opinion and then under the same
- 5 section.
- 6 MS. CROWLEY: Just before we --
- MS. HOBOY: Sorry.
- 8 MS. CROWLEY: Go ahead.
- 9 MS. HOBOY: And just before --
- MS. CROWLEY: Sorry. Would you mind
- making that change on the exhibit and initialing
- it, Mr. Matoesian?
- MR. NWAJI: I'd like to look at this
- again because if somebody is not around I didn't
- know what happened to this.
- MS. LIU: I believe on page 10 it
- was the draft schedule prepared by the Board
- 18 staff. It wasn't the one that you had
- 19 collaborated on. So this was correct. The Board
- had prepared this for your consideration and then
- you guys collaborated on a different schedule and
- presented it at the hearing. So that was when the
- date had changed was during your negotiations.
- MS. HOBOY: So it was my

- misunderstanding in reading this that this wasn't
- what they proposed and submitted.
- MS. LIU: No. They just cut and
- 4 paste from the Board's Hearing Officer order into
- 5 here and then they provided their response so
- 6 that's what that is.
- MS. HOBOY: And same with the
- 8 perform the initial --
- 9 MS. CROWLEY: We have too many
- people talking at the same time.
- THE COURT REPORTER: Can you start
- from the beginning?
- MS. HOBOY: This was cut and pasted
- you're saying?
- MS. LIU: From the Board's June 3rd
- 16 Hearing Officer order proposing the schedule for
- you guys to discuss so that's simply what that is.
- MR. MATOESIAN: I think you're right
- if I remember right now.
- MS. LIU: The schedule you actually
- 21 agreed upon was Exhibit 2 from the last hearing.
- MS. HOBOY: Okay.
- MS. LIU: And that's the one you
- want to make sure is correct and the date on

- that -- that one actually didn't include --
- MS. HOBOY: The CAAPP.
- MS. LIU: 229.115(b)2(A), but I
- 4 believe I asked you that at the hearing.
- MS. HOBOY: Yes, and we confirmed
- 6 that January 1, 2012, would be acceptable.
- 7 MS. CROWLEY: Let's go off the
- 8 record.
- 9 (Whereupon, a discussion was had
- off the record.)
- MS. CROWLEY: Let's go back on the
- record. So is it correct, Mr. Matoesian, that 35
- 13 Ill. Adm. Code 229.115(b)2(A) submit CAAPP to the
- 14 Agency on or before January 2012 is what was
- 15 intended?
- MR. MATOESIAN: Yes, that's what was
- intended.
- MS. CROWLEY: And I will ask you to
- make that change on my exhibit and initial it.
- MR. MATOESIAN: Yes. Thank you.
- MS. CROWLEY: Did you have anything
- else, Ms. Hoboy?
- MS. HOBOY: If the assumption is
- this is what was prepared by the Board staff, then

- the corrected information is in the Board's
- opinion as far as the dates are concerned because
- 3 the only other one was under that same section
- 4 little four and it said June 21st, 2014, and it
- 5 should be June 1st, 2014 which is already in the
- 6 Board's opinion.
- 7 MS. CROWLEY: But I will ask if you
- 8 make those corrections, Mr. Matoesian, it just
- 9 keeps things cleaner.
- MS. LIU: Can we go off the record?
- MS. CROWLEY: Yes.
- 12 (Whereupon, a discussion was had
- off the record.)
- MS. CROWLEY: If we go back on the
- record. Again, try to go at it another way. Do
- the Agency and Stericycle agree that the dates as
- contained in the Board's June 16th opinion and
- order are the way you would like to have the rule
- 19 read?
- MR. MATOESIAN: Yes.
- MS. HOBOY: Yes.
- MS. CROWLEY: That's a yes from
- both. Anything else? Then the last thing we have
- to do today is set a date for the closing post

- hearing comments.
- 2 As we explained last time we got
- 3 together, the Board must follow the rulemaking
- steps under the Environmental Protection Act and
- 5 under the Illinois Administrative Procedures Act
- or APA. The APA requires that the Board publish
- 7 proposed rules in the Illinois Register and
- 8 receive written public comments for at least 45
- 9 days after publication. Assuming a July 1st
- publication, the period begins on July 2nd and
- ends August 16th. Section 102.108(b) of the
- Board's procedural rules also provides that the
- Board will accept comments for 14 days after the
- 14 receipt of the hearing transcript or any other
- date set by the Hearing Officer.
- Transcripts are due under a
- standard reporting contract by the eighth business
- day after a hearing. Here, that would be July 1st
- and so the 14 day due date under 102.108 would be
- July 15th, but the APA public comment period runs
- through and includes Tuesday, August 16th. So
- we'll set the date for the end of the comment
- period as Tuesday, August 16th.
- I'd ask that comments be in the

- Board's office by that date either electronically
- or by mail and that the mailbox rule will not
- apply. If possible, we'd appreciate the filing of
- 4 closing comments by the Agency and Stericycle in
- 5 advance of that date if you can. We know it's
- summer, though. The Board's next scheduled
- 7 meeting dates after the close of the public
- 8 comment period on August 16th are; August 18th,
- 9 September 1st and September 15th.
- We would like to have the option
- of adopting a second notice of opinion and order
- on the earliest date if we can. And as I
- explained before, the Board is required by the APA
- to submit rules to the Joint Committee on
- Administrative Rules or JCAR. Once JCAR has
- received the rules, the Board can only make
- changes in response to JCAR comments. JCAR has 45
- days to review the rules. If JCAR approves the
- 19 rules, only then can the Board adopt the final
- ²⁰ rules and file them.
- 21 As we noted when the -- when we
- spoke previously, the Agency would like to have a
- rulemaking complete so that it can have an
- 24 application for revision of the State

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- 1 Implementation Plan including these rules to US
- 2 EPA no later than October 6th. We believe it may
- 3 still be possible to achieve the goal. We will be
- 4 working towards it and so I'll ask if there are
- 5 any other questions? No questions.
- MS. ZALEWSKI: We appreciate
- 7 everyone's participation and cooperation. Thank
- 8 you.
- 9 MS. CROWLEY: Thank you, all, very
- much and I'm sorry for your long drive, but I
- believe we finished this up for today.
