<u>JURISDICTION</u>

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 iLCS 5/31.1 (2010).

FACTS

- 1. That Purcell Tire & Rubber Company is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 1212 Broadway Street, Mt. Vernon, Jefferson County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Purcell Tire & Rubber Company.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0810300009.
 - 3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on April 18, 2012, Garrison Gross of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of

his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 5-15-13, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7009 2820 0001 7496 1008

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Garrison Gross during the course of his April 18, 2012 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

(1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in used tires, at this site, not altered, covered or otherwise prevented from accumulating water, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>July 2, 2012</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois

Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

General Remarks: A Tire Storage Site Inspection was conducted on Wednesday, April 18, 2012 at Purcell Tire & Rubber Company. The inspection was conducted by Garrison Gross representing the Illinois EPA Bureau of Land. The site is located at 1212 Broadway Street in Mt. Vernon, Illinois 62864. The inspection was a routine inspection. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were clear skies, 61° F, with a light breeze. Surface conditions were dry.

Inspection Findings: The inspection began at approximately 9:50 a.m. I entered the business and asked to speak to the manager. I identified myself and explained the reason for the inspection. Terry Riley identified himself as the store manager. I inquired about tire disposal. Mr. Riley stated that Tire Recycling removed waste tires from the site. He said they came almost every week to pick up waste tires. We continued the inspection by walking and photographing the site. Approximately 75 used / waste tires were stored inside the building. Some of the tires were labeled for resale. Approximately 120 used / waste tire were stored outside along the west side of the building (photo 001). All of the tires appeared to be off the rim. They were not protected from the elements and several had accumulated water (photos 002 and 003). One box trailer and two sea-land trailers were used to store new tires (photo 004). I inquired about measures to prevent the tires from accumulating water. Mr. Riley told me that a tarped awning system had been used but it had been damaged several times by storms over the last couple of years. He said the last storm had occurred about a month ago and the awning had blown away. I informed him that used / waste tires should not be allowed to accumulate water.

We returned to the office. I reviewed a sales receipt to verify the collection of the tire user fee for the Illinois Department of Revenue. The sales receipt included the tire user fee as a separate line item as required (receipt is attached). The recycle notice was not posted at the sales area as required. I provided a new recycle notice and Mr. Riley posted it behind the service counter. Mr. Riley made a telephone call to the corporate office in Missouri to obtain a copy of the ST-8 and the last three tire transporter records. The ST-8 was reviewed for 4th quarter 2011. Tire hauling receipts for Tire Recycling of Owensboro, Kentucky were reviewed (records are attached).

At the time of the inspection, less than 250 used / waste tires were located at the site. Based on the tire disposal receipts, 259 tires were removed from the facility on January 31, 2012 and 274 tires were removed on March 7, 2012. Based on this information, the facility should be regulated as a tire storage facility and should pay the

\$100 fee for FY2012. I informed Mr. Hill that the facility would be receiving a letter from the Agency in the near future. The inspection ended at approximately 10:20 a.m.

Additional Remarks: Information concerning property ownership / control was obtained through tax records available from the Supervisor of Assessment's Office in Jefferson County. Tax bills are mailed to Purcell Tire & Rubber Company, P.O. Box 100, Potosi, Missouri 63664. The property is referred to as parcel 07-30-487-003. The most current aerial map available from Bing Maps does not show the tarped awning at the site.






