LOVELAND, Colo. (AP)
— Firefighters faced dangerous conditions across much of the Rocky Mountain region Monday, as they tolled in hot, dry weather to battle a wideline that has charrod nearly 22 square miles in northern Colorado.

Authorities said they determined eight more bomes have burned in the fire near Fort Collins. The blaze started June 9 and now has destroyed at least 189 homes — the most in the state's history. The fire is 50 percent contained.


