On behalf of IBEW Local 51, I am writing to share Local 51's support for Dynegy Midwest Generation (DMG) and its request for a variance concerning the trading of So2 emission credits.

DMG has complied with initiatives to lower power plant emissions. As a matter of fact their plants have met emission requirements in a timely manner.
