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Letter from the Chairman

During October, the Board acted in several rulemaking dockets, and I've summarized much of that activity below. As always, information about these rulemakings is available through the Clerk's Office Online (COOL) at our Web site at www.ipcb.state.il.us.

On October 4, 2012, the Board adopted rules in Proposed Amendments to Groundwater Quality Standards, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 620 (R8-18). The adopted rules include various updates, add groundwater quality standards (GQS) for various chemical constituents detected in Illinois groundwater, and revise the Class I GQS for arsenic. At its September 11, 2012 meeting, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules issued its certificate of no objection to the proposal.

On October 4, 2012, the Board adopted a second-notice proposal in Triennial Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron, Fluoride and Manganese: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 301.106, 302.Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312 (R11-18). JCAR is scheduled to consider the Board's proposal at its November 13, 2012 meeting.

The Board held hearings in Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs): Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 501, 502, and 504 (R12-23) on October 16, 2012, in Belleville; October 23, 2012, in Urbana; and October 30, 2012, in DeKalb. The Board also held a hearing August 21, 2012, in Springfield and will hold one more hearing on November 14, 2012, in Elizabeth, Jo Daviess County.

On October 16, 2012, JCAR issued its certificate of no objection to the Board's second-notice proposal in Procedural Rules for Authorizations Under P. A. 97-220 for Certain Landscape Waste and Compost Applications and On-Farm Composting Facilities: New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.Subpart I (R12-11).

On October 18, 2012, the Board held its first hearing in Proposed Amendments to Special Waste Hauling Permit Regulations to Implement Public Act 97-1081: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 809.204 and 809.212 (R13-8). The Board proposes these amendments to implement a provision of Public Act 97-1081, effective August 24, 2012, which amends Section 22.2(l) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) by extending the duration of special waste hauling permits from one year to three years. *See* 36 Ill. Reg. 14600 (Oct. 5, 2012).

On October 18, 2012, the Board adopted a proposal for public comment in Safe Drinking Water Act Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012) (R13-2), an identical-in-substance rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 17.5 of the Act.

On October 18, 2012 the Board adopted a proposal for public comment in Volatile Organic Material Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012) (R13-1), an identical-in-substance rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 9.1 of the Act.

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Rulemaking Update

Board Adopts Final Rules Amending to Groundwater Quality Standards, R 08-18

The Illinois Pollution Control Board, on October 4, 2012, adopted final amendments to the Board's groundwater quality rules. This rulemaking, docketed as Proposed Amendments to Groundwater Quality Standards (35 Ill. Adm. Code 620), (R08-18), was initiated by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) to amend Part 620 of Title 35 of the Illinois Administrative Code (35 Ill. Adm. Code 620). The rules became effective October 5, 2012, when filed with the Secretary of State.

The final rules update to Part 620 is based upon new scientific data, federal rules, and technical references. Among other things, groundwater quality standards are added for 39 chemical constituents detected in Illinois groundwater that have toxicity values established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) or that have groundwater remediation objectives under the Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (TACO). Additionally, the Class I groundwater quality standard for arsenic is revised to reflect the new federal Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL). The amendments adopted by the Board are substantively unchanged from those proposed at first and second notice.

The Board Adopts Second Notice Proposal to Update Boron, Fluoride, and Manganese Water Quality Standard Rules, R11-18

The Illinois Pollution Control Board (Board), on October 4, 2012, adopted proposed second notice amendments to update the Board's water quality standard (WQS) rules for boron, fluoride and manganese. The rules as proposed will be submitted to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) for their review, as required by the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), 5 ILCS 100/1-1 (2010.).

The rulemaking proposal, docketed as In the Matter of: Triennial Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron, Fluoride and Manganese: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312 (R11-18) also includes various other clean-up amendments and updates. The proposal was filed on December 2, 2010, by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). IEPA's proposal was the culmination of a recent "triennial review" of standards required by the Federal Water Pollution control Act (FWPCA or Clean Water Act).

The Board's second-notice proposal includes substantive changes suggested by the Illinois Environmental Regulatory Group and agreed to by IEPA in Section 302.208 to avoid any unintended change in the current mixing zone practice. Also, consistent with IEPA comments, the Board has made additional changes in publication requirements for IEPA publication of determinations concerning certain toxicity criteria and values as articulated in Sections 302.595 and 302.669.

The second notice proposal includes updates to the boron, fluoride, and manganese water quality standards under the General Use standards in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subpart B, the Public and Food Processing Water Supply standards in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subpart C, and the Lake Michigan Basin Water Quality Standards in 35 Ill.

Adm. Code 302.Subpart E. The Board determined that site specific rules and adjusted standards granted from the existing standards will continue to be valid without reapplication if relief from the standards as proposed continues to be necessary for the affected source.

The proposal also makes other clean-up amendments and updates, including the correction of chronic zinc standard and the repeal of the site-specific fluoride standard at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 303.312. Additionally, the Board adds cyanide test methods to the incorporations by reference in Parts 301 and 302. Finally, the Board is also amending the requirements in Sections 302.595 and 302.669 that the IEPA publish the derived water quality criteria in the *Illinois Register*, but only when the criteria are derived. IEPA retains the option of publishing the criteria on its website in any manner it chooses.

In the Matter of: Definition of VOM Update, USEPA Regulations (January 1, 2012 through January 30, 2012), R13-1

On October 18, 2012, the Board adopted a proposal for public comment that would update the definition of "volatile organic material" (VOM) in the Board's air pollution regulations (35 Ill. Adm. Code 211.7150). The update is needed to ensure that Illinois' regulations remain "identical in substance" to the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (USEPA) rules, and contain the most recent exemption of chemical compounds from regulation as ozone precursors.

The proposal would add one compound, *trans*-1,3,3,3-tetra-fluoro-prpene (HFO-1234ze) (CAS no. 29118-24-9), to the list of those exempted from the definition of VOM. USEPA added this compound to the list of chemicals exempted from the definition of VOM codified at 40 C.F.R. 51.100(s) on June 22, 2012.

The Board will cause the proposed amendments to be published in the *Illinois Register* and will hold the docket open to receive public comments for 45 days after the date of publication. The Board has scheduled a public hearing for December 20, 2012 at 10:00 am. The hearing will be held by videoconference at the two following Board Offices: Pollution Control Board Hearing Room, 1021 N. Grand Avenue East, Springfield, IL and at James R. Thompson Center, Room 11-512, 100 W. Randolph St., Chicago, IL. Additional procedural details are contained in an October 18, 2012 hearing officer order, available on the Board's website. The Board will then adopt and file the final rules, taking into account the hearing record and any public comments received.

In the Matter of SDWA Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June30, 2012, July 2, 2012, and July 25, 2012) R13-2

The Board, on October 18, 2012, proposed amendments to the Illinois regulations that are "identical in substance" to drinking water regulations adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USPEA). The amendments involved in this docket incorporate into the Illinois drinking water regulations amendments in response to five USEPA actions.

All of the federal actions involved in this docket relate to analytical methods approved for use in demonstrating compliance. This includes the following: (1) May 2, 2012 corrections to a prior approval of analytical methods; (2) May 18, 2012 revisions to analytical methods developed for purposes of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 *et seq.* (2010)), some of which are incorporated by reference for drinking water purposes; and (3) summary approvals of alternative equivalent methods for drinking water monitoring.

Three of the USEPA actions occurred in the identical-in-substance update period of January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012, on May 2, 2012, May 18, 2012, and June 28, 2012. The Board has added two additional USEPA actions that occurred after the end of the update period, on July 2, 2012 and July 25, 2012. Both of these later actions corrected an action that occurred within the update period: the action of May 2, 2012. Neither correction will affect the amendments that occurred during the period January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012. Nevertheless, the Board has added consideration of them to this docket to ensure complete consideration of the May 2, 2012 amendments.

The Board will cause the proposed amendments to be published in the *Illinois Register* and will hold the docket open to receive public comments for 45 days after the date of publication. The Board will then adopt and file the final rules, taking into account the public comments received. The Board specifically requests comment on one aspect of the rules. The Board requests comments on the way the Board has incorporated the USEPA-approved alternative equivalent analytical methods into the Illinois regulations.

To effectuate the parties’ intent that respondent pay a total civil penalty of \$1,500, the Board, on its own motion, dismissed the alleged violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2010)). Having previously found that Moser violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Act, the Board order Moser to pay a civil penalty of \$3,000.	4-0

Restricted Status/Critical Review

The Environmental Protection Act prohibits the Agency from issuing a construction permit that will cause or extend a violation. A construction permit to expand the distribution system cannot be granted when a water supply has a maximum contaminant level or treatment technique violation, an inadequate source of raw water supply, inadequate treatment plant capacity, finished water storage or distribution system pressure. A Restricted Status List is published quarterly in the Illinois Pollution Control Board Environmental Register to notify those persons considering expansion of a water supply distribution system of that status before large sums of money have been spent on items such as land acquisition, financing and engineering fees. A companion Critical Review List is published concurrently with the Restricted Status List and has the water supplies that are approaching a point where the supply could be placed on Restricted Status. A permit application from a supply on Critical Review will be examined carefully to ensure that the proposed construction will not cause a violation. Restricted Status and Critical Review are presented as a combined list with the status of the water supply denoted as either RS (Restricted Status) or CR (Critical Review). The current list reflects the status as of October 1, 2012. An asterisk, * , beside the water supply indicates public water supplies that have been added to the Restricted Status/Critical Review list since the previous publication.

Restricted Status List

The Restricted Status List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which are in violation of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act. The Restricted Status List will include all Public Water Supplies for which the Agency has information indicating a violation of any of the following requirements: Finished water quality requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Part 604, Subparts B and C; maintenance of adequate pressure on all parts of the distribution system under all conditions of demand; meeting raw water quantity requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 604.502; or maintenance of treatment facilities capable of providing water "assuredly adequate in quantity" as required by Section 18 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

A public water supply on the Restricted Status List will not be issued permits for water main extensions, except for certain limited situations, or unless the supply has been granted a variance from the Illinois Pollution Control Board for the violation, or from permit issuance requirements of Section 39 of the Act.

This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.

Critical Review List

The Critical Review List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which may be close to being in violation of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

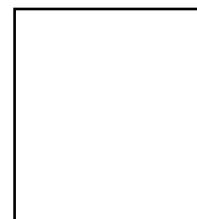
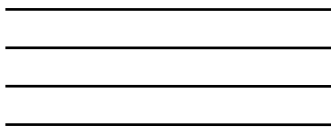
A supply will be placed on the Critical Review List when Agency records indicate that it is approaching any of the violations that would place it on the Restricted Status List.

This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.

The Illinois Pollution Control Board is an independent five-member board that adopts environmental control standards, rules on enforcement actions, and other environmental disputes for the State of Illinois.
