### JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

### **FACTS**

1. That Frank Seibert is the current owner ("Respondent") of a facility located in a part of the Northeast Fourth of the Northeast Quarter in Section 25, Township 7 South, Range 2 East of the Third Principal Meridian of Franklin County, south of West Frankfort, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as West Frankfort/Seibert.

2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0558045007.

3. That Respondent has owned said facility at all times pertinent hereto.

4. That on November 5, 2012, Sheila Williams and Garrison Gross of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the abovedescribed facility. A copy of the inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on <u>12-17-12</u>, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. <u>7010 2780 0002 1167 5331</u>.

### VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Sheila Williams and Garrison Gross during the course of the November 5, 2012 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2010).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2010).
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in deposition of waste in standing or flowing waters, a violation of Section 21(p)(4) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(4) (2010).
- (4) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in proliferation of disease vectors, a violation of Section 21(p)(5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(5) (2010).

- (5) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in deposition of general construction or demolition debris: or clean construction or demolition debris, a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2010).
- (6) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).

#### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>January 15, 2012</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall

adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

### PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.



## **GENERAL REMARKS**

A follow up inspection was conducted at the West Frankfort/Seibert site on November 5, 2012. According to an Illinois State Geological Survey map, Old Ben No. 8 Mine operated at this location from 1910 – 1952. In April 2007 I spoke with Ron Kaiser of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR), who informed me IDNR got involved with the site several years back because of an emergency situation involving a fire at the site. He indicated they plan to remove unvegetated combustible coal and possibly do some work on the embankments along the railroad. I spoke with Mr. Kaiser again on November 27, 2012 at which time he said the site is on the inventory list of projects that still need to be done.

The site is approximately two tenths of a mile south of West Frankfort, just east of State Route 37. At the time of the inspection, Jones Construction was conducting work along Route 37 next to the Seibert property. I spoke with Tom Stilly of Jones Construction. He distinguished which vehicles and materials belonged to those with Jones Construction and those items that were at already at the site. Mr. Stilly telephoned and let me speak with Mike Helfrich, an Estimator with Jones Construction. Mr. Helfrich said the State had relocated Mr. Seibert to 503 S. Maple St. in West Frankfort and his phone number is 618-932-8707. On a later date, I spoke with Doug Patton in the Bureau of Land Acquisition of the Illinois Department of Transportation in Carbondale. Mr. Patton said both the bridge and culvert next to Mr. Seibert's property were replaced. They were able to relocate him before the project started. He thought it had been a year or more since Mr. Seibert had lived there.

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Other than scattered debris, approximately eleven areas of apparent violations were observed. Amongst the scattered wastes were demolition debris, furniture, tires and painted concrete. The pond just east of the most eastern mobile home was being filled by mostly clean debris from the road work. However, a few pieces of corrugated plastic from the road work were present. When discussed with Mr. Stilly, he said he would make sure the workers were informed to make sure only clean fill was used. Also, just southwest of the current fill area in shallow water were a tire, pop bottle crate, plastic bucket, and a chair. In all, approximately 35 tires were observed throughout the site. Mosquito larvae were observed in two tires at the site. It was apparent much of the waste observed during the previous inspection was no longer present. However, no receipts have been received since that time.

It was apparent open burning had occurred in Area A due to the typical indicators such as a pyramid shaped pile, a dense amount of ash & blackened refuse in the central portion of the pile & the amount of blackened refuse & charred ground decreasing as the outer perimeter of was approached. Refuse in the burn pile consisted of a metal chair frame, wires from a tire, charred demolition debris, and general refuse. Area A is estimated to be approximately one cubic yard  $(7.5'\times5'\times1')$  in size.

Part of Area B was positioned at the top of a creek embankment. Corrugated metal was present in the creek below. Just north of Area B standing up in the creek, was a plastic bottle with a plastic tube protruding from the lid. Other items in Area B were demolition debris, a storm shelter, tires, a portable commode and general refuse. A mosquito larva was observed moving in one of the tires. Area B is estimated to be approximately seven cubic yards  $(40'\times5'\times1')$  in size.

Area C was adjacent to the one mobile home that is not considered abandoned. Numerous plastic containers, a car seat, stroller, and textiles were in Area C. This area is estimated to be approximately one cubic yard (10'x5'x.5') in size.

A severely dilapidated mobile home made up Area D. This appears to be the same mobile home that was observed during the February 28, 2007 inspection. Three plastic coolers, multiple plastic bottles, nine plastic buckets, five tires, a gas container with a hose protruding from it, textiles, a plastic drum and general refuse were present in and

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near the mobile home. Area D is estimated to be approximately 94 cubic yards (42.5'x8'x7.5') in size.

Areas E and F both consisted of primarily demolition wood and insulation. These areas are estimated to be two cubic yards (10'x5'x1') and six cubic yards (25'x12.5'x.5'), respectively.

Among the refuse in Area G were an apparently abandoned mobile home with the door open which exposed the interior, a couch (outside), and a truck with pipes, a plastic bucket, tarp, and general refuse in bed. Area G was estimated to be approximately 89 cubic yards (40'x8'x7.5') in size.

Area H contained mostly shingles. Area H was estimated to be approximately two cubic yards (12.5'x5'x1') in size.


Waste in Area I included, but was not limited to, siding, metal and apparently fresh cut wood. Area I was estimated to be approximately two cubic yards  $(12.5'\times10'\times.5')$  in size.

Area J consisted of what appeared to be freshly cut wood. The wood seemed to either be smaller pieces such as twigs or larger pieces like stumps. Cut wood has been observed in this location during previous inspections. It was not possible to determine if it had been generated on site or was brought from off site. Area J was estimated to be approximately six cubic yards (6'x6'x4') in size.

Two crude oil storage tanks and what appeared to be crude oil spilled on the ground made up Area K. Area K was estimated to be approximately twelve cubic yards (13.5'x6'x4') in size.

According to the Franklin County Assessor's Office, Frank Eugene Seibert of West Frankfort receives the real estate tax bill for the piece of property on which this site is located.




