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Letter from the Chairman

During November, the Board acted in several rulemaking dockets, and I've summarized much of that activity below. As always, information about these rulemakings is available through the Clerk's Office Online (COOL) at our Web site at www.ipcb.state.il.us.

On November 1, 2012, the Board adopted regulations in Procedural Rules for Authorizations Under P. A. 97-220 for Certain Landscape Waste and Compost Applications and On-Farm Composting Facilities: New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.Subpart I (R12-11). JCAR issued its certificate of no objection to the Board's proposal at its October 16, 2012 meeting.

On November 1, 2012, the Board adopted its second-notice opinion and order in Gasoline Volatility Standards and Motor Vehicle Refinishing: Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 211, 215, 218, and 219 (R12-24). *See* 36 Ill. Reg. 6913, 6934, 6950, 6975 (May 19, 2012).

On November 14, 2012, in Elizabeth, Jo Daviess County, the Board held a fifth hearing in Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs): Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 501, 502, and 504 (R12-23). The Board had previously held hearings in this docket on August 21, 2012, in Springfield; October 16, 2012, in Belleville; October 23, 2012, in Urbana; and October 30, 2012, in DeKalb.

On November 15, 2012, the Board adopted amended water pollution regulations in Triennial Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron, Fluoride and Manganese: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 301.106, 302.Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312 (R11-18). JCAR issued its certificate of no objection to the Board's proposal at its November 13, 2012 meeting.

On November 15, 2012, the Board held its second hearing in Proposed Amendments to Special Waste Hauling Permit Regulations to Implement Public Act 97-1081: 35 Ill. Adm. Code 809.204 and 809.212 (R13-8). The Board proposes these amendments to implement a provision of Public Act 97-1081, effective August 24, 2012, which amends Section 22.2(i) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) by extending the duration of special waste hauling permits from one year to three years. *See* 36 Ill. Reg. 14600 (Oct. 5, 2012).

On November 1, 2012, the Board adopted a proposal for public comment in RCRA Subtitle C Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012) (R13-5), an identical-in-substance rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 22.4 of the Environmental Protection Act (Act). *See* 36 Ill Reg. 16475, 16507, 16542 (Nov. 26, 2012).

On November 1, 2012 the Board adopted a proposal for public comment in Wastewater Pretreatment Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012) (R13-7), an identical-in-substance rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 13.3 of the Act. *See* 36 Ill. Reg. 16436, 16459 (Nov. 26, 2012).

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Rulemaking Update

Board Adopts New Procedural Rules for Landscape Waste and Compost Authorizations Under 415 ILCS 21(q), R 12-11

On November 1, 2012, the Board adopted new procedural rules for adjusted standards addressing Board authorizations for certain landscape waste and compost applications and on-farm composting. The rulemaking is docketed as In the Matter Of: Procedural Rules for Authorizations Under P.A. 97-220 For Certain Landscape Waste and Compost Applications and On-Farm Composting Facilities: New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 106.Subpart I, R12-11. The procedural rules are in response to P.A. 97-220, signed and effective July 28, 2011. P.A. 97-220 amended the Environmental Protection Act to specify that the Board rather than the IEPA may authorize certain exceptions to the provisions of Section 21(q) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act), 415 ILCS 5/21. The adopted rules were filed with the Secretary of State and became effective November 5, 2012, and were published at 36 Ill. Reg. 16581 (Nov. 26, 2012).

One type of Board authorization would allow any person to apply landscape waste and composted landscape waste at a rate greater than “agronomic rates” of not more than 20 tons per acre per year. Under the second type, farmers who operate a composting facility may be authorized to use landscape waste compost to operate the compost facility on more than two percent of the property’s total acreage. Without such Board authorizations, these activities are prohibited, and subject to enforcement.

The Board adopted its second notice opinion and order on September 20, 2012. The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules reviewed the rules, and voted a certificate of no objection at its October 16, 2012 meeting.

Board Adopts Second-Notice Opinion and Order Streamlining Illinois’ Rules for Gasoline Volatility, R12-24

The Board, on November 1, 2012, proposed rule amendments for second-notice review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) based on a rulemaking proposal filed on April 2, 2012, by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA), and docketed as In the Matter of: Gasoline Volatility Standards and Motor Vehicle Refinishing, Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 211, 215, 218, and 219, (R12-24). No substantive changes have been made to the first notice proposed rules, published at 36 Ill. Reg. 6913 (May 19, 2012).

The proposed amendments would repeal the state’s gasoline volatility standards in ozone attainment areas, as well as in the Chicago and Metro-East non-attainment areas (respectively, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 215.585 and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 219.585). All of these standards have “essentially been superseded by Illinois’ participation in the Federal

reformulated gasoline (RFG) program.” Various clean-up amendments are also proposed, as necessitated by the proposed repeal.

The proposal would also impact motor vehicle refinishing operations by allowing alternative use, in spray coating applications, of a High Volume Low Pressure (HVLP) spray gun for which USEPA has given written approval. It would also repeal a state registration program that overlaps with the existing federal program.

The Board held two hearings in this rulemaking. No public comments were received during or after the first notice period.

The Board Adopts Identical in Substance Rule Proposal for Public Comment In the Matter of: RCRA Subtitle C Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012), R13-5

On November 1, 2012, the Board adopted an order proposing for public comment “identical in substance” amendments that would update the Illinois hazardous waste regulations to incorporate revisions to the federal hazardous waste regulations adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the first half of calendar year 2012.

The proposed amendments were published in the *Illinois Register* at 36 Ill. Reg. 16459 (Nov. 26, 2012). The Board will consider public comments received by January 10, 2013, *i.e.* 45 days after the date of publication. The Board presently intends to adopt final amendments based on this proposal on or before the statutory due date of April 13, 2012.

Sections 7.2 and 22.4(a) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/7.2 and 22.4(a) (2010)) require the Board to adopt regulations that are “identical in substance” to hazardous waste regulations adopted by the USEPA. These USEPA rules implement Subtitle C of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA Subtitle C) (42 U.S.C. §§ 6921 *et seq.* (2010)). The federal RCRA Subtitle C hazardous waste management (HWM) regulations are found at 40 C.F.R. 260 through 268, 270 through 273, and 279. USEPA adopted the underlying federal hazardous waste amendments during the time period of January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012.

During the update period, USEPA (1) denied a petition to review an existing exclusion of certain oil-bearing hazardous secondary materials from petroleum refining from the definition of solid waste on April 13, 2012, (2) adopted technical corrections and clarifications to two diverse provisions on April 13, 2012, and (3) amended the analytical methods requirements associated with numerous bodies of regulations, including hazardous wastes, on May 18, 2012.

The Board included limited corrective amendments that are not directly derived from current USEPA amendments. Notably, the Board proposed the following: (a) correcting punctuation in a hazardous waste listing; and (2) correcting the heading of an appendix to comply with current *Illinois Administrative Code* format requirements. The Board requested comments on issues that relate to amendments included in this docket.

The Board Adopts Identical in Substance Rule Proposal for Public Comment In the Matter of: Wastewater Pretreatment Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012), R13-7

The Board, on November 1, 2012, proposed amendments to the Illinois regulations that are "identical in substance" to wastewater pretreatment and drinking water regulations adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the update period of January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012. USEPA took only one action, on May 18, 2012, updating to the Clean Water Act (CWA) (42 U.S.C. § 1251 *et seq.* (2011)) analytical methods. In addition to updating the CWA analytical methods codified at 40 C.F.R. 136, USEPA revised segments of the wastewater categorical standards. Segments of the amendments affect the wastewater pretreatment standards.

The proposed amendments were published in the *Illinois Register* at 36 Ill. Reg. 16436 (Nov. 26, 2012). The Board will consider public comments received by January 10, 2013, *i.e.* 45 days after the date of publication. The Board presently intends to adopt and file final amendments based on this proposal on or before the statutory due date of May 18, 2013, pursuant to Section 7.2(b) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/7.2(b) (2010)).

The Board Updated Boron, Fluoride, and Manganese Water Quality Standard Rules In Triennial Review Docket, R11-18

The Illinois Pollution Control Board (Board), on November 15, 2012, adopted final rules updating the Board's water quality standard (WQS) rules for boron, fluoride and manganese. The rulemaking, docketed as In the Matter of: Triennial Review of Water Quality Standards for Boron, Fluoride and Manganese: Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subparts B, C, E, F and 303.312 (R11-18) also included various other clean-up amendments and updates. The rules will become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State.

The proposal was filed on December 2, 2010, by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). IEPA's proposal was the culmination of a recent "triennial review" of standards required by the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (FWPCA or Clean Water Act). The rulemaking updated the boron, fluoride, and manganese water quality standards under the General Use standards in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subpart B, the Public and Food Processing Water Supply standards in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subpart C, and the Lake Michigan Basin Water Quality Standards in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 302.Subpart E. The Board determined that site specific rules and adjusted standards granted from the existing standards will continue to be valid without reapplication if relief from the standards as proposed continues to be necessary for the affected source.

The adopted rules include substantive changes suggested by the Illinois Environmental Regulatory Group and agreed to by IEPA in Section 302.208 to avoid any unintended change in the current mixing zone practice.

The amendments also make other clean-up amendments and updates, including the correction of chronic zinc standard and the repeal of the site-specific fluoride standard at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 303.312. Additionally, the Board

adds cyanide test methods to the incorporations by reference in Parts 301 and 302. Finally, the Board also amended the requirements in Sections 302.595 and 302.669 that the IEPA publish the derived water quality criteria in the *Illinois Register*, but only when the criteria are derived. IEPA retains the option of publishing the criteria on its website in any manner it chooses.

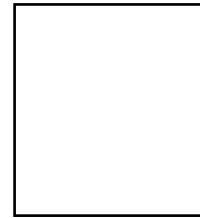
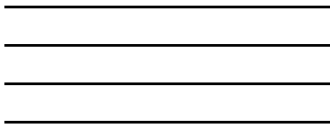
