#### **JURISDICTION**

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

#### **FACTS**

- 1. That Lloyd Schoenheit is the current owner and Mark E. Johnson d/b/a M J Tire Service is the current operator ("collectively Respondents") of a facility located at 1324 North Court Street, Grayville, Edwards County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as M J Tire Service.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0474465016.
  - 3. That Respondents have owned/operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on January 30, 2013, Garrison Gross of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of the inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on <u>2-28-13</u>, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. <u>7010 2780 0002 1167 6147 - Schoenhait</u>
7010 2780 0002 1167 6130 - Johnson VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Garrison Gross during the course of the January 30, 2013 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondents have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in standing or flowing liquid discharge from the dump site, a violation of Section 21(p)(6) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(6)(2010).
- (2) That Respondents caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).

#### **CIVIL PENALTY**

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>April 15, 2013</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing,

Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondents check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

### PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.



General Remarks: A tire storage site inspection was conducted on Wednesday, January 30, 2013 at M J Tire Service. The business is located at 1324 North Court Street in Grayville. The inspection was conducted by Garrison Gross representing the Illinois EPA Bureau of Land. This inspection was routine in nature and conducted due to previous offsite observations of used / waste tires. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were overcast skies, 53°F, with a moderate breeze. Surface conditions were damp to muddy.

Inspection Findings: The inspection began at approximately 8:45 A.M. I arrived at the site and observed two piles of used / waste tires stored near the service entrance (photo 001). A pickup truck load of tires was also observed. Approximately 100 passenger, truck and tractor tires were observed (photo 003 and 004). Most of the tires in this area were off the rim and some had accumulated water (photo 002, 005 and 006). I proceeded toward the office and spoke to Mark Johnson. I questioned Mr. Johnson about the tires being outside. He said he had fallen behind and was in the process of getting them put into storage. He told me that his tire transporter didn't show up for the last scheduled pickup.

I continued the inspection by walking and photographing the site. Mr. Johnson accompanied me during the inspection. I observed two storage bays where resalable used tires are stored. The storage bays are enclosed on three sides. One of the storage bays appeared to have a leaking roof (photo 007). Tires in the back of the storage area were wet. Several tires stored near the entrance had accumulated water and organic material (photo 008). Several large tractor tires were stored in front of the storage bays (photo 011). Water had accumulated in the tractor tires (photo 009). Mr. Johnson stated that the tractor tires had been used to construct a tire Christmas tree. I informed him that no tires should be stored outside. The second bay did not appear to be leaking (photo 010). A few tires stored near the entrance had accumulated water. Approximately 210 tires were stored in

We walked to the box trailer where waste tires are stored. Tires were observed around the outside of the trailer (photo 012). Vegetation was directly adjacent to the tires and some of them had accumulated water and organic material (photo 013). The box trailer was close to being full (photo 014). Approximately 800 used / waste tires were stored in the box trailer. Additional tires were stored underneath the box trailer (photo 015).

We walked to another building that is used to store resalable used tires. Rainwater had blown into this building and some of the tires near the entrance were wet (photo 016). The south side of the roof was damaged and it appeared that rainwater had blown in through the opening. Water and

organic material had accumulated in some of the tires stored under the damaged roof (photo 017). Approximately 120 tires were stored in the building.

I asked Mr. Johnson if he performed automotive services such as oil changes and what he did with his used oil. He showed me a mini-tote that was used to store the used oil (photo 018). Evidence of automotive fluid spillage was observed on the ground and pallets around the mini-tote. The container was not labeled. I asked Mr. Johnson about waste oil disposal. He told me that Lloyd Schoenheit, the property owner, took care of the oil disposal. Mr. Johnson told me that the mini-tote was used by both businesses. We returned to the office. A 55-gallon drum was located near the front of the office (photos 019 and 020). A bucket was sitting on top of the drum. The bucket contained automotive fluids. Evidence of automotive fluid spillage was observed on the ground around the drum. The drum was not labeled. I provided Mr. Johnson with two "used oil" labels.

A record review was conducted. I reviewed a sales receipt to verify the collection of the tire user fee for the Illinois Department of Revenue. The sales receipt showed the fee as a separate line item (photo 022). The recycle notice was posted in the office as required. Mr. Johnson informed me that he did not have any tire disposal receipts at the business. He said he was working on his taxes and had taken them home. I requested that he email or fax a copy of the last three disposal receipts. Approximately 1100 used / waste tires were observed at the facility. Based on the conditions that were observed, the facility is no longer storage-exempt and should be registered as a tire storage site. I informed him that the facility would be receiving a letter regarding the inspection in the near future. The inspection ended at approximately 9:10 A.M.

Additional Remarks: Three tire disposal receipts were received by facsimile on January 31, 2013.


