RULEMAKING UPDATE

Board Adopts New Procedural Rules for its Digital Initiative, R16-17

On May 19, 2016, the Board further advanced its Digital Initiative, adopting final procedural rule amendments that will increase electronic filing, e-mail service, videoconference hearings, and on-line record access. Other rule changes include clarified appeal periods and reduced filing obligations. The amendments, which took effect on May 20, 2016, make overwhelming environmental and economic sense. They will be supported by this summer's launch of a new Board website, including a more robust COOL, the Board's electronic filing and docketing system. Board Amends Water Pollution Permitting Rules, Docket R15-24

On June 2, 2016, the Board issued an opinion and order declining to modify or withdraw its rulemaking proposal in response to an objection made by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). After responding to JCAR's concerns, the Board adopted the final amendments to its water pollution permitting rules at 35 III. Adm. Code 309, which address National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits and non-NPDES permits. The rule amendments streamline the non-NPDES permitting process and provide flexibility to administratively continue NPDES permits. The rulemaking, captioned Water Pollution: Proposed Amendments to 35 III. Adm. Code Part 309, was initiated by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Board Adopts "Identical-in-Substance" Hazardous Waste Rules, Including Amended Definition of "Solid Waste," R16-7

On June 16, 2016, the Board amended its hazardous waste regulations at 35 III. Adm. Code 703, 720 through 722, 724 through 728, and 733. The amendments are "identical in substance" to rules adopted during 2015 by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) under Subtitle C of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). Among the RCRA Subtitle C updates, three stand out. First, USEPA significantly amended the Definition of Solid Waste Rule or "DSWR." Second, USEPA removed the "comparable fuels rule" and the "gasification rule." Third, USEPA determined not to regulate coal combustion residuals (CCR) as hazardous waste and adopted new rules to govern the disposal of CCR as non-hazardous solid waste, expanding the "Bevill exemption." The Board's rulemaking is captioned RCRA Subtitle C Update, USEPA Amendments (January 1, 2015 through June 30, 2015 and July 2, 2015).

Board Adopts "Identical-in-Substance" Rules for UST Corrective Action, R16-16

On July 7, 2016, the Board amended its underground storage tank (UST) regulations at 35 III. Adm. Code 731. The amendments are "identical in substance" to corrective action rules adopted by the United States



Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the second half of 2015. USEPA amended many areas of its UST regulations (*e.g.*, secondary containment for tanks and piping; operator training; release prevention and detection technologies), but most of the changes are outside the scope of the Board's identical-in-substance UST mandate, which is limited to corrective action. APPELLATE UPDATE

Fifth District Affirms IPCB's Decision on Local Siting of Waste Transfer Station

Roxana Landfill, Inc. et al. v. Illinois Pollution Control Board et al. 2016 IL App (5th) 150096-U
Board dockets PCB 15-65 & PCB 15-69 (consolidated)

In a Rule 23 order issued on July 25, 2016, the Fifth District Appellate Court upheld the Board's decision to affirm the Village of Caseyville's grant of siting approval for a municipal solid waste transfer station. The Board's decision had been appealed to the Fifth District by Roxana Landfill, Inc. and the Village of Fairmont City. These third parties raised a host of challenges, but the appellate court, in a 53-page order, agreed with the Board that:

- The Village of Caseyville had jurisdiction to consider the siting application filed by Caseyville Transfer Station, LLC (CTS) because CTS—with the intent of having the application kept on file—hand-delivered the application to the Village Hall on the submittal date specified in CTS's pre-filing notices, even though Village Hall staff did not date-stamp the application upon receipt and placed it in a zoning office;
- The siting procedures used by the Village of Caseyville were fundamentally fair, including allowing the only witness for CTS to make his hearing statements while not under oath; and
- The Village of Caseyville correctly found that CTS satisfied each of the six contested siting criteria (necessary to accommodate needs; protection of the public; area character and surrounding property value; flooding; impact on existing traffic flows; and consistency with county solid waste management plan).

Restricted Status/Critical Review

The Environmental Protection Act prohibits the Agency from issuing a construction permit that will cause or extend a violation. A construction permit to expand the distribution system cannot be granted when a water supply has a maximum contaminant level or treatment technique violation, an inadequate source of raw water supply, inadequate treatment plant capacity, finished water storage or distribution system pressure. A Restricted Status List is published quarterly in the Illinois Pollution Control Board Environmental Register to notify those persons considering expansion of a water supply distribution system of that status before large sums of money have been spent on items such as land acquisition, financing and engineering fees. A companion Critical Review List is published concurrently with the Restricted Status List and has the water supplies that are approaching a point where the supply could be placed on Restricted Status. A permit application from a supply on Critical Review will be examined carefully to ensure that the proposed construction will not cause a violation. Restricted Status and Critical Review are presented as a combined list with the status of the water supply denoted as either RS (Restricted Status) or CR (Critical Review). The current list reflects the status as of April 1, 2015. An asterisk, *, beside the water supply indicates public water supplies that have been added to the Restricted Status/Critical Review list since the previous publication.

Restricted Status List

The Restricted Status List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which are in violation of 35 III. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

The Restricted Status List will include all Public Water Supplies for which the Agency has information indicating a violation of any of the following requirements: Finished water quality requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Part 604, Subparts B and C; maintenance of adequate pressure on all parts of the distribution system under all conditions of demand; meeting raw water quantity requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 604.502; or maintenance of treatment facilities capable of providing water "assuredly adequate in quantity" as required by Section 18 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

A public water supply on the Restricted Status List will not be issued permits for water main extensions, except for certain limited situations, or unless the supply has been granted a variance from the Illinois Pollution Control Board for the violation, or from permit issuance requirements of Section 39 of the Act. This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.

Critical Review List

The Critical Review List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which may be close to being in violation of 35 III. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

A supply will be placed on the Critical Review List when Agency records indicate that it is approaching any of the violations that would place it on the Restricted Status List.



This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.





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
