

Board Adopts for Second Notice a Proposal Adding Definitions to Used Oil Management Standards and to Special Waste Regulations

On September 2, 2010, the Pollution Control Board adopted for second notice review proposed definition relating to used oil management in the rulemaking docket designated In the Matter of: Proposed Amendments to the Board's Special Waste Regulations Concerning Used Oil, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 739, 808, 809 (R06-20(B)). In an order dated February 18, 2010, the Board adopted amendments to its used oil management and special waste regulations in the docket now designated as subdocket A.

In the second-notice opinion and order for Subdocket A, the Board noted that, during the first-notice comment period, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) and NORA, formerly known as the National Oil Recycling Association, had addressed adding definitions, which had not been included in the first-notice proposal. On December 17, 2009, the Board opened subdocket B in order to provide first notice publication of proposed definitions.

The Board directed the Clerk to file the proposed amendments with the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules for second-notice review.
