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Letter from the Chairman

In December, the Board took action in certain contested cases that have generated public interest. Below, these recent activities are summarized.

On December 18, 2014, the Board ruled on cross-motions for summary judgment in a series of permit appeals concerning issuance of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit Program permits to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (District) by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). The District appealed permits issued for the Calumet Plant and the O'Brien Plant (case numbers PCB 14-103 and PCB 14-104) and Prairie Rivers Network, Natural Resources Defense Council, Sierra Club, Environmental Law & Policy Center, Friends of Chicago River, and Gulf Restoration Network (Environmental Groups) filed third party appeals for those two plants as well as the Stickney Plant (case numbers PCB 14-106, PCB 14-107, and PCB 14-108). In the cases brought by the District, it contended that daily grab sampling for fecal coliform bacteria and continuous monitoring for dissolved oxygen are not required to meet the provisions of the Act or Board regulations. The Board found that the District met its burden of proving that five-day per week sampling for fecal coliform would not violate the Act or Board regulations. However, the District has not met its burden of proving that daily grab sampling for dissolved oxygen would not violate the Act or Board regulations.



In the cases filed by the Environmental Groups, it was contended that IEPA's issuance of the three permits violated the Act or Board regulations for four reasons: (1) IEPA failed to include permit conditions ensuring that discharges of phosphorus and nitrogen do not violate water quality standards; (2) the permitted compliance schedules for phosphorus discharges are not justified; (3) the permits fail to prohibit overflows from sanitary sewers; and (4) IEPA failed to respond to public comments on drafts of the permits. After reviewing the arguments of the parties, the Board granted summary judgment in favor of IEPA and the District and affirmed IEPA's issuance of the permits to the District.

Also on December 18, 2014, the Board reviewed a decision by the Village Board of Caseyville granting siting approval for a transfer station. *See Roxana Landfill, Inc v. Village Board of the Village of Caseyville, Illinois; Village Of Caseyville, Illinois; and Caseyville Transfer Station, L.L.C. and Village of Fairmont City, Illinois v. Village of Caseyville, Illinois, Board of Trustees and Caseyville Transfer Station, L.L.C.*, PCB 15-65 and 15-69. The Board found that Roxana and Fairmont City failed to establish that Caseyville lacked jurisdiction, that Caseyville's siting procedures were fundamentally unfair, or that Caseyville's determination on any of the five challenged siting criteria was against the manifest weight of the evidence. The Board affirmed Caseyville's decision approving the siting application for a transfer station.

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Rulemaking Update

Board Adopts “Identical-In-Substance” Amendments for RCRA Hazardous Waste Update, R15-1

In this “identical-in-substance” rulemaking, the Board on December 18, 2014, adopted updates to Illinois’ Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Subtitle C hazardous waste regulations. [RCRA Subtitle C Update, USEPA Amendments \(January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014\)](#), R15-1. The updates concern two sets of United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) amendments to the federal hazardous waste requirements. First, on February 7, 2014, USEPA modified the hazardous waste manifest provisions to accommodate a national electronic manifest system called the “e-Manifest System.” Second, on June 26, 2014, USEPA revised the cathode ray tube (CRT) rules to enhance the tracking of used CRTs exported for reuse and recycling.

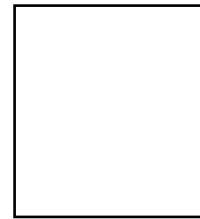
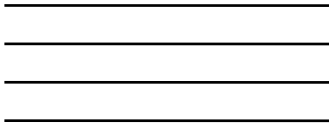

The Illinois Pollution Control Board is an independent five-member board that adopts environmental control standards, rules on enforcement actions, and other environmental disputes for the State of Illinois.

The *Environmental Register* is published monthly by the Board, and contains updates on rulemakings, descriptions of final decisions, the Board's hearing calendar, and other environmental law information.
