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Letter from the Board

During August, the Board acted in a number of its rulemaking dockets, and that activity is summarized below. As always, information about these dockets is available through the Clerk's Office Online (COOL) at the Board's Web site at www.ipcb.state.il.us.

On August 9, 2013, the Secretary of State published amended air rules adopted by the Board in National Ambient Air Quality Standards, USEPA Regulations (July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012), R13-11. 37 Ill. Reg. 12882 (Aug. 9, 2013). Under Section 10(H) of the Environmental Protection Act, enacted by Public Act 97-945 and effective August 10, 2012, the Board is now required to adopt ambient air quality standards identical-in-substance to those adopted by the Unites States Environmental Protection Agency under Section 109 of the Clean Air Act.

On August 15, 2013, the Board scheduled a hearing in R8-9(D), Water Quality Standards and Effluent Limitations for the Chicago Area Waterway System (CAWS) and the Lower Des Plaines River: Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 301, 302, 303 and 304, on water quality standards and criteria for meeting proposed aquatic life uses. The hearing will take place on September 23, 2013, in Chicago and is intended to conclude testimony by and questions of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) and the motion to amend the rulemaking proposal.

On August 22, 2013, the Board adopted a second-notice proposal in <u>Technical Corrections to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 620.420</u>, R8-18(B), and the matter appears on the agenda of the September 17, 2013 meeting of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules. In its proposal, the Board seeks to clarify amendments to the groundwater quality standards adopted in 2012. *See* 37 Ill. Reg. 6123 (May 10, 2013).

On August 27, 2013, the Board held the first hearing in Springfield in R13-20, <u>Procedural Rules for Alternative Thermal Effluent Limitations Under Section 316(a) of the Clean Water Act: Proposed New 35 Ill. Adm. Code Part 106, Subpart K and Amended Section 304.141(c). The second hearing will take place on October 16, 2013, in Chicago. On July 11, 2013, the Board submitted the IEPA's proposed rules to first-notice publication without commenting on its substantive merits. *See* 37 Ill. Reg. 11843 (July 26, 2013).</u>

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Rulemaking Update

Board Adopts Second-Notice Technical Corrections to Recently-Adopted Amendments of Groundwater Quality Standards

The Board, on August 22, 2013, proposed, for second-notice review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR), technical corrections to recently-adopted amendments of the Part 620 groundwater quality standards (GQS). On April 18, 2013, the Board opened a subdocket B in this proceeding and proposed first-notice amendments consisting of three technical corrections to the GQS amendments adopted by the Board on October 4, 2012 (<u>Proposed Amendments to Groundwater Quality Standards (35 Ill. Adm. Code 620)</u>, R08-18). The technical corrections are needed due to scriveners' errors that occurred during the R08-18 rulemaking.

R08-18(B) was opened solely to make several technical corrections to Section 620.420(b)(1) (35 III. Adm. Code 620.420(b)(1)), which lists organic chemicals and corresponding concentrations and provides that the concentrations must not be exceeded in Class II general resource groundwater. The amendments proposed in subdocket B remedy the inadvertent (1) deletion of trichloroethylene and its Class II GQS, (2) modification of the 1,1,2-trichloroethane Class II GQS, and (3) failure to place an asterisk next to the dibenzo(a,h)anthracene Class II GQS to reflect that the chemical is carcinogenic.

The Board has already held the public hearings required by the Environmental Protection Act during the R08-18 rulemaking. The Board received no request for an additional hearing in subdocket B. In addition, the Board received no public comment on subdocket B's first-notice amendments, which were unchanged at second notice.

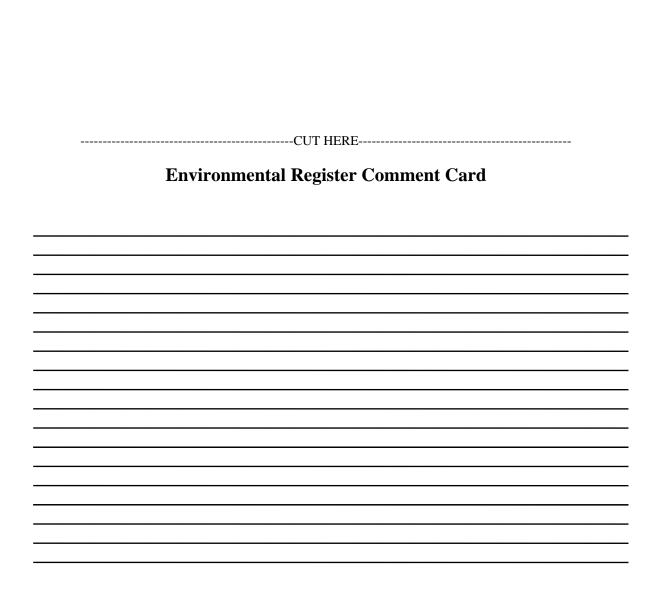
