More questions!

1. In 721.104(a)(24)(E)(i), 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> sentences: Should we add "is" before "a solid waste" (e.g., "...is discarded and is a solid waste...")?
2. In 721.931, definition of "First attempt" → Should the closing quotation marks be moved to after "repair"? E.g., "First attempt at repair" means...
3. In 721.933(d)(6): "A flare used to comply with this **section** must..." → Should this be "this Section" or "this subsection (d)"?
4. In 721.934(b)(1)(D)(i), why include  $E_h$  in the list of "where" statements if it doesn't appear in the formula?
5. In 721.934(b)(1)(D)(i), should  $Q_{2sd}$  be  $E_{2sd}$ ?
6. In 721.934(b)(1)(D)(i) and (ii) (and elsewhere), should the degree symbol be deleted from measurements of temperature in Kelvin (see [http://www.bipm.org/utis/common/pdf/si\\_brochure\\_8\\_en.pdf](http://www.bipm.org/utis/common/pdf/si_brochure_8_en.pdf))?
7. In 721.934(b)(1)(D)(ii), should  $E_h$  be  $E_n$ ?
8. In 721.934(b)(1)(D)(ii), should it be "kg-mol/m<sup>3</sup>" or "kg mol/m<sup>3</sup>"?
9. In 721.934(b)(1)(E), should H be expressed in h/yr rather than h?
10. In 721.950, Board Note, penultimate line: "soruce performance standards" should be "source performance standards".
11. In 721.960(b)(3): "the effective date of this amendment" needs to be replaced by a date certain. Any suggestions?
12. In 721.964(m), board note, penultimate line: "soruce" should be "source".
13. In 721.983(a): Should headings like this be capitalized or not? Style varies from instance to instance.
14. In 721.983(c)(4), should "721.9085(b)(1)(A)" be "721.924(b)(1)(A)"?

15. In 721.984(e)(1)(C)(ii), should “stub drains” be “drain stubs”? If not, what *are* stub drains?

16. In 721.984(f)(3)(A)(iv), Board Note: I’m really confused by the references:

- a. The Board moved corresponding 261.1084(f)(3)(i)(D)(1) through 261.1084(f)(3)(i)(D)(4) to appear as subsections (f)(3)(D)(i) through (f)(3)(A)(iv)...
- b. Would it be preferable to change this to “261.1084(f)(3)(i)(A) through 261.1084(f)(3)(i)(D) to appear as subsections (f)(3)(A)(i) through (f)(3)(A)(iv)”?

17. In 721.984(f)(3)(D)(iv), Board note:

- a. The texts of corresponding 40 CFR 261.1084(f)(3)(i)(D)(1) through (f)(3)(i)(D)(4), which would normally appear in subsection (f)(3)(A)(iv), appear as subsections (f)(3)(D)(i) through (f)(3)(A)(iv) to comport with codification requirements.

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b. I’m stumped. What should this be?

18. In 721.986(h)(3):

- a. Why “4,500 Pascals” rather than “4.5 kPa”?
- b. Should it be “pascals” rather than “Pascals”?
