**NOTICE OF PROPOSED STIPULATION AND  
 PROPOSAL FOR SETTLEMENT OF  
 ENFORCEMENT CASE**

The Attorney General has brought a case against  
 Beardstown Sanitary District for violating State pollu-  
 tion control rules. On June 25, 2021, the parties filed  
 a stipulation and proposal for settlement. The parties  
 agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and in accord-  
 dance with State law, have requested that the settle-  
 ment be adopted without holding a public hearing. Any  
 person who would like to comment on, or demand a  
 public hearing on, the stipulation and proposal for set-  
 tlement may do so by filing a written comment or hear-  
 ing demand with the Illinois Pollution Control Board  
 within 30 days after the publication of this notice. The  
 written comment or hearing demand must refer:
